

- Do I need Community Service hours?
 - Not for graduation, only for Florida Bright Futures
- How many years of Foreign Language do I need?
 - None for graduation, only for acceptance into a college or university and for Florida Bright Futures
- Are all courses calculated into my GPA?
 - Your GPA starts in 9th grade or in 8th grade if you took high school credit in middle school
 - All courses are included into GPA
 - Grades become part of your GPA when credit is issued.
- Do I only have one GPA?
 - Not really! You have an unweighted and a weighted GPA.
 Bright futures calculates your GPA differently from schools, and colleges often recalculate on their own system.

Promotion Requirements



Promotion each year of high school does not guarantee graduation on time.


How is my GPA calculated?

- Unweighted GPA -Graduation
 - 4.0 scale: 4 -A, 3 B, 2 -C, 1 D, 0 F.
- Weighted GPA Ranking
 - Add .5 weight for honors, 1.0 weight for AP & DE
- Bright Futures GPA
 - Add .5 weight for honors, AP & DE.
 Only uses certain classes.
- College Admissions GPA (Florida Schools only)
 - Add .5 weight for honors, 1.0 weight for AP & DE

An Effective Student.....


- Knows the teacher's expectations



- Merit based scholarship program funded by the Florida Lottery.
- The purpose is to reward academic achievement by providing funding to attend postsecondary education in Florida.
- There are three different awards within this program

 Florida

Scholarship Program

General Eligibility Requirements

- Be a Florida resident and U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen as determined by you postsecondary institution.
- Enroll in an eligible Florida public or private postsecondary institution
- Enroll in a minimum of 6 hours per term (or the equivalent)
- Begin using the scholarship funds within three years of graduation (unless you enlist in the military).
- Must not be found guilty of, or plead no contest to, a felony charge.
- Must apply during your last year in high school Application opens Dec. 1 of senior year.
- Students must also complete the FAFSA application after January 1st of their senior year

General Academic Requirements

- Application opens December 1st of senior year
- 16 Core Academic credits
- Core GPA includes (does not round):
 - 4 English credits
 - 4 Math credits (algebra 1 or higher, LAM and Informal Geometry do not count)
 - 3 Natural Science credits
 - 3 Social Studies credits
 - 2 Foreign Language credits
 - 2 additional academic courses to help raise GPA
- GPA can be tracked on FLVC.org starting the end of 1st semester in 9th grade year

Fl. Academic Scholars Class of 15/16

- 16 Core Academic credits
- 3.5 Weighted GPA in 16 Core academic credits
- 1290 SAT/29 ACT Will mix and match highest test scores
- 100 hours of Community Service
- Requirements as of 2012 but subject to change

Fl. Medallion Scholars

- 16 Core Academic credits
- 3.0 Weighted GPA in 16 Core academic credits
- 1170 SAT/26 ACT Will mix and match highest test scores
- 75 hours of Community Service
- \$76/S. Hr. State University or \$47/Hr C. College

Gold Seal Vocational Scholars


- SAT: 440 Reading and Math, ACT: English 17, Reading 18, Math 19, or CPT: Reading 83, Sentence 83, Math 72
- 30 hours of Community Service
- •3.0 Weighted GPA in "CORE" classes (instead of World Language that is counted for the other CORE GPA, use Fine Arts and HOPE)
- •3.5 Unwtd. GPA in 3 voc. credits in 1 voc. program
- \$76/S. Hr. State University or \$47/Hr C. College

College Credit in High School

- Yes.....Through Dual Enrollment
- Qualifications
 - Entering junior year of high school
 - 3.0 or higher unweighted GPA
 - Recommendation from a teacher
 - SAT, ACT, or PERT test score (must earn a passing score)
- Locations
 - St. John's River State College
 - · Creekside High School

- Yes....ThroughAdvanced Placement
- Must Pass exam at 3 or higher to gain college credit
- Qualifications
 - A in Standard Class, or C or higher in current honors class.
 - OR level 4 FCAT in related area, not less than 3 in any area
- Locations
 - Creekside High School





■ HOW DO I GET MY NAVIANCE ACOUNT?
