MESSAGE FROM PROGRAM DIRECTOR: JOEL IVANY

Welcome to Open Space: Opera in the 21st Century. This summer we have 13 participants in 2 operas (12 singers and 1 pianist), 1 chamber music concert and outreach performances. As program director, it's important for me to create unique opportunities for artists to perform creative repertoire. We want to help build up the most inspiring artists working in Canada and around the world.

I've told many that performing on the large stage is important and singing in an intimate space is an equally necessary skill. It's no longer one style of presentation that matters and that's exciting for opera and singers.

Tonight we're thrilled to be sharing a brand new opera with you. Tonight's workshop performance completes the Mozart/DaPonte/Ivany trilogy that began with Figaro's Wedding (which won the Dora Mayor Moore award for Outstanding New Opera at the Toronto Performing Arts Awards). Last summer we workshopped #UncleJohn (our re-imagined Don Giovanni) at The Banff Centre which premiered in Toronto this past December. The Globe and Mail called it "A modern, triumphant twist to Don Giovanni" and garnered three Dora Mavor Moore nominations. Our interpretation of Mozart's Così fan tutte is newly titled A Little Too Cozy. We've decided to set our story in the world of reality television marriages. You're here as our live studio audience for the final taping of the show. Despite music that is 225 years old, this workshop would not have been possible without collaboration from many departments at The Banff Centre including; film, animation, projections and live video.

There is a shift happening across the country and we believe that Against the Grain Theatre is on the front lines of this movement. It's exciting and challenging.

Thank you for supporting opera at The Banff Centre where we test the limits and go beyond. We're meant to be ahead of the industry and also outside of it. Opera at The Banff Centre must continue to be a leader in Canada and in our international community for this shift to continue. I believe that we will continue to do exciting, boundary breaking projects and collaborations together.

Opera is a beautiful art form. We're just scratching the surface of how it fits into our Canadian landscape and how to share and interpret it. Exciting times for opera, singers, new music and the arts are all happening here at The Banff Centre.

SYNOPSIS

ACT I

The premise is simple. Find true love and win \$100,000 towards your dream wedding! The catch is... you can't see your match until after you've agreed to tie the knot.

Donald L. Fonzo, founder and host of the newest reality television marriage show, *A Little Too Cozy*, meets up with two of the program's male contestants, Fernando and Elmo. They're in the final stages of the game show and will soon meet their brides-to-be for the first time before their weddings. Donald presents them with their last challenge stating that their fiancées will prove to be unfaithful (under the right circumstances). The men accept this final challenge knowing that the \$100,000 is as good as theirs.

We meet the two female contestants, Dora and Felicity, who have been separated from their men since they met, eight weeks ago. They chat about finally getting married and how scary and exciting it is to marry someone they've never seen. Donald L. Fonzo walks on set to let them know that unfortunately their two men will be delayed even longer as they will be kept away. With the wall of love separating the two couples, the men say goodbye as the cameras capture every moment.

The ladies' handler Despina walks in as the two girls share the loss of their men. Donald L. Fonzo enters and prepares to introduce the ladies to "two new men" (who just happen to be their actual two fiancées). The men, determined to win the prize money, keep up the charade. Insulted by these brash and conceited men, the ladies hold their stance determined to stay true to their men despite the two boys' advancements and storm off.

The two men laugh it off, proud of the faithfulness of their women. Donald L. Fonzo vows that the tides will turn, as it always does on *A Little Too Cozy*.

Act 1 ends with the men suffering from an alleged sushi allergy. The women are pressed into action to help care for them. With the situation looking dire, they call on the paramedics and with none in sight; Despina quickly obtains her medical degree online and miraculously revives them using the healing powers of Magnet Therapy. The gentlemen, with new life, swear their thanks to the women and want nothing more than a kiss. The women are even further stunned and caught up in the excitement knowing that the ratings and their popularity will go up as well.

SYNOPSIS

ACT II

The second act opens with Despina trying to convince the two that if they took advantage of the current situation, it would make for great television and it wouldn't affect their feelings towards their fiancé. Entertaining the opportunity, the girls imagine which of the two they would choose (if they had to) and unfortunately they choose the man who isn't their fiancé.

The two couples meet once again, but the men are thrown off, as the ladies suddenly seem more receptive to the idea of these dream dates (and their opposite fiancés). However, knowing that this is still an important last challenge to win, they go along.

As the couples pair off, Dora feels a connection and physical spark between her and Elmo. Fernando and Felicity meanwhile are connecting on a different level. Felicity is finding herself drawn to Fernando's character and personhood (and it doesn't help that she is attracted to him as well). She talks to him about her confliction before needing some air to breathe.

Felicity exits and Elmo re-enters. Fernando, feeling good about how Felicity is still holding out asks how things have been going with Dora. Knowing the worst, Elmo shares the bad news about how it went with Dora. Feeling disgusted for his friend, who is left with a broken heart, Elmo curses women vowing revenge.

Fernando, hurt, works overtime to convince Felicity that she is meant for him. With Elmo and Donald L. Fonzo watching on a closed-circuit television, Felicity succumbs to Fernando's advances and he wins her heart. Elmo is left crushed. Both men, feeling defeated, despise their current situation. The truth of getting caught up in the game hits like a ton of bricks.

Wanting revenge, the men encourage Donald L. Fonzo and Despina to arrange an on-air wedding for them to propose to their new lady friends. Just at the important decision time, the theme music comes back, signaling that their fiancées are back! The girls, torn over their new attractions are horrified when it's revealed that the men they've fallen for are not only their actual fiancés, but are actually their opposite fiancés. Big decisions are left hanging amidst the two couples. Who will get married? Who will they marry? What does this say about our society? Everything is left just A Little Too Cozy.

Other credits include work for companies such as the Stratford Festival, Shaw Festival, Theatre Aguarius, Drayton Entertainment, Tapestry New Opera, Theatre Smash, Quickening Theatre, and The Lighthouse Theatre Festival. In opera, he has lit new productions of *The* Tales of Hoffman for Edmonton Opera and Macbeth at the Minnesota Opera Company, as well as The Silent Serenade and The Cunning Little Vixen (Royal Conservatory), Giulio Cesare (Orchestra London), Dido and Aeneas (Opera on the Avalon), Carmen (Vancouver Opera). As resident lighting designer for Against the Grain Theatre, Hand has lit #UncleJohn. La Bohème, Turn of the Screw, Figaro's Wedding [Dora Nomination]. Death and Desire, and Pelléas et Mélisande. Hand has been nominated three times for Dora Awards for Outstanding Lighting Design. In 2011, he collaborated with director Joel Ivany and designer Camellia Koo to conceive a production of *I Capuletti e i Montecchi* that placed third in the biennial European Opera- Directing Prize. In 2012.

Stage director Joel Ivany is the founder and artistic director of Against the Grain Theatre. He recently won the 2013 Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding New Opera/Musical for Against the Grain Theatre's Figaro's Wedding and is in his second year as program director of the Open Space: Opera in the 21st Century program at The Banff Centre, loel was a finalist and prizewinner at the European Opera-Directing Prize for his concept of Bellini's I Capuleti e i Montecchi. Recent directing credits include new productions of Verdi's Macbeth at Minnesota Opera, Carmen at Vancouver Opera. Les Contes d'Hoffmann for Edmonton Opera, Knotty Together, a new work composed by Nio Kong Kie performed in Dublin. Ireland and the world premiere of Gavin Bryars' Marilyn Forever, based on the life of Marilyn Monroe, in Victoria, BC and also at the Adelaide Festival in Australia. He was the revival director of Le nozze di Figaro at the Norwegian National Opera and also served as associate director for Thaddeus Strassberger's acclaimed production of Nabucco at both Washington National Opera and Minnesota Opera. Upcoming projects include directing the revival of #UncleJohn at the Ottawa International Chamber Festival, a staged presentation of Mozart's Requiem for the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, and Carmen for the Canadian Opera Company.

Daniel MacIvor is originally from Cape Breton. Nova Scotia and has written numerous awardwinning theatre productions including See Bob Run, Communion, Marion Bridge, and His Greatness and the solo shows House, Here Lies Henry, Monster, Cul-de-sac, and This Is What Happens Next. MacIvor received the Governor General's Literary Award for Drama in 2006 for his collection of plays I Still Love You and in 2008 he was awarded the Siminovitch Prize for Theatre. He is also the recipient of the New York Obie Award and a GLAAD Award. He is currently working on the libretto for Rufus Wainwright's Hadrian commissioned by the Canadian Opera Company and next year he will be teaching theatre at the University of Calgary where he will direct the graduating students in his play *Inside*.

Pianist Michael McMahon is the preferred partner to many of Canada's finest singers. During this time, he studied with such legendary artists as Erik Werba. Hans Hotter, Elly Ameling, Jörg Demus, and Kim Borg, In addition to his active performing schedule, Michael McMahon is a professor at the Schulich School of Music of McGill University in Montreal. He has had long associations with l'Atelier lyrique de L'Opéra de Montréal. Opera Nuova, the Orford Arts Centre and The Banff Centre where he has worked regularly as a vocal coach. He is also often asked to give masterclasses for singers and pianists and is a resident artist at the Franz Schubert Institute in Austria and the Centre for Opera Studies in Italy Summer Opera program. He has made numerous broadcast recordings for the English and French networks of the CBC, BBC, RBTF, Radio Suisse Romande and Radio France. His recordings on the Marguis, CBC, Atma, and Analekta labels have met with critical acclaim including Juno nominations and the Prix Opus. He was also a judge and vocal coach for the award winning television series Bathroom Divas. In 2012, Michael McMahon was honoured with a Ruby Award by Opera Canada for his contribution to music in Canada.

Conductor, pianist and vocal coach Christopher "Topher" Mokrzewski is a steadily rising figure in the worlds of Canadian opera, symphony, and chamber music. He is resident conductor of Calgary Opera, founding music director of Toronto's acclaimed indie opera company. Against the Grain Theatre and music director of the Open Space: Opera in the 21st Century program at The Banff Centre. He has served on the music staff of the Canadian Opera Company, Opera Atelier, Saskatoon Opera, the Chautaugua Institute and Highlands Opera Studio. Additional engagements of note include a ten concert recital tour with soprano Measha Brueggergosman and an appearance with the Calgary Philharmonic as the piano soloist in Messiaen's Turangalîla Symphonie. A graduate of the Canadian Opera Company Ensemble Studio, Music Academy of the West, and the Eastman School of Music. Mokrzewski has been described by music critic John Terauds as "one of those bright, eager, whip-smart young artists who could give even the most hardened cynic a jolt of optimism about the future of classical music and opera" and was named one of CBC Music's "Hot 30. Classical Musicians under 30" in 2013.

He was born in Lier, Belgium and immigrated to Calgary, Alberta and recently completed his two-vear tenure at the Atelier Lyrique de L'Opéra de Montréal. In the 2014-15 Season he sang Papageno in The Magic Flute at Opera Lyra Ottawa, appeared in Jeunes Ambassadeurs Lyriques Gala. was baritone soloist for the Choeur Polyphonique de Montreal and CAMMAC's Messiah, soloist for University of Ottawa's Ein Deutsches Requiem and soloist in The Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul's Church's B Minor Mass under the baton of Jordan de Souza. In July 2015 he appeared as soloist at the Festival de Lanaudière, in Bruckner's Mass No. 3 in f minor with the Orchestre Metropolitain de Montreal with Yannick Nézét-Seguin at the podium. He makes his Against the Grain Ensemble debut this summer at The Banff Centre singing Don Alfonso in A Little Too Cozy and will make his debut with the Netherlands Radio Philharmonic Orchestra at Het Concertgebouw as Der Notar in Richard Strauss' Intermezzo, Op. 72 in 2017. II in Bernstein's Candide under the baton of Bramwell Toyey, Roles in previous seasons include Scotty McDonald in Lillian Alling (The Banff Centre), Don Alfonso in Così fan tutte (Green Mountain Opera Festival). Schaunard in La bohème and Der Vater in Hänsel und Gretel (Opera McGill) and Tarquinius in *The Rape of Lucretia* (Opera on the Avalon.), The Ferryman in Britten's Curlew River, Dandini in La Cenerentola and Guglielmo in Così fan tutte. Ryan is a winner of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions at the District Level (Kansas City District), an inaugural Koerner Foundation Scholarship recipient, was supported by the Schulich Scholarship and the Noel E. Spinelli prize in Music at McGill University. He holds degrees from The University of Victoria School of Music, The Guildhall School of Music and Drama, and the McGill University Schulich School of Music.
