#### SPRING 2017 ACADEMIC ADVISING

Students met with Ms.
Corwin for advising to discuss their schedules for the spring 2017 semester. Please review your child's schedule and call us if you have any questions or concerns. We always welcome parental input. Remember that each student's graduation plan is an individual plan that is determined by the individual student's previous courses, grades, test scores, and teacher recommendations. Our first

priority is to determine the courses that remain for each student to complete our program. Electives are selected from courses required for the university core. These core courses are generally easily transferable to other universities.

All registration holds (unpaid account balances, parking tickets, etc.) must be removed before students may register for spring classes TALH Tuition Scholar-ships in the amount of \$4,940.70 will be applied to student accounts for 15 credit hours on or before January 16, 2017. Parents are responsible for all room, board, and tuition and fees in excess of 15 credit hours. Parents are also responsible for tuition and fees for any courses that are repeated.

#### WEEKEND TRAVEL

Thank you parents for submitting your weekend travel passes! We appreciate your help in keeping your children safe. Please remember that passes are due by Wednesday at 4:00 PM. We count on you to submit travel

requests by the deadline so that we have enough time to keep our security staff informed. If your plans change during the weekend, please remember that the TALH Security Office number is 409-880-8482. Our next closed holiday and week-

end will be Thanksgiving, November 23 (after classes) through November 27. Because our security staff is off on closed holidays and closed weekends, students are not permitted to stay at the dorms on these dates.
