



In January of 2012, the Diocese of Brooklyn will implement a vocation promotion initiative. "CALLED BY NAME" is a program that invites men and women, 18 years of age or older, to consider a vocation as a priest, sister, brother or deacon. This program has been recommended by the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Vocations in their document A Future Full of Hope: a National Strategy for Vocations to Priesthood and Religious Life for the Archdioceses and Dioceses of the United States.

At the heart of this program is the belief that all of us share a common calling through Baptism, to which we are invited to respond in a variety of ways – marriage, single life, consecrated life and ordained ministry. The CALLED BY NAME process focuses on priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life, and stresses the role of the Christian community in calling forth men and women to consider these vocations.

Parishioners throughout the diocese are encouraged to consider who in our midst might serve well as a priest, deacon, or religious and submit their names at the weekend liturgies **January 14-15** and **January 21-22, 2012**. There are many good prospective priests, brothers, and sisters who are simply waiting to be asked.

The following qualities are desirable in persons identified as potential candidates:

- A person of prayer who loves the Lord
- A person who is actively involved in the life of the Church
- A person who is successful in life, including school, work, and relationships
- A "people person"
- A person with personal integrity, honesty, generosity

How does the CALLED BY NAME initiative work? Parishioners will be invited to submit names of potential candidates in their respective parishes in mid-January. Upon approval of the parish staff, persons nominated will be invited to a discernment event in the Spring of 2012. Participants will learn about each of the possible vocations which the Church is inviting them to discern and will have the opportunity to seek answers to their questions and be invited to explore the discernment process further.

The CALLED BY NAME program is an ambitious undertaking which holds great promise for the Diocese of Brooklyn. Many dioceses have had success with this program in response to the invitation from their parish and diocesan Vocation Office. It remains so very important that we actively support and promote a future generation of priests, religious sisters and brothers, and deacons to serve a growing Church, hungering for Christ in the Eucharist.

God continues to call people to serve Him in our world today. The faithful have a responsibility to help identify and invite those called. Please pray for the success of this initiative and consider whom in our midst God might be calling to serve.

### **Implementing "CALLED BY NAME"** in Your Parish

The pastor, parochial vicars and appropriate parish staff, Parish Vocation Committee (PVC) members, as well as the entire parish all need to be involved for CALLED BY NAME to be successful. Implementation of the program in the parish is not difficult, and requires one person to serve as coordinator. Collaboration with the liturgy director, D.R.E., and school principal is very important as well.

#### The Preparation:

- Discuss the program with the parish staff
- Appoint a program coordinator (PVC Coordinator or staff person)
- Make sufficient copies of the CALLED BY NAME brochure and response cards (please use card stock for the response cards, if possible).
- Coordinate the program with all parish groups who minister to young people 18 years of age or older.
- Vocation poster should be displayed (available in December).
- Provide bulletin editor with materials for parish bulletins for January 7/8, January 14/15, January 21/22, and January 28/29, 2012.

### November/December 2011

• Place the CALLED BY NAME <u>brochures</u> in church (preferably in the pews; check with the pastor).

### Week I: January 14-15, 2012 (The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time)

- Celebration of the Sunday liturgy inaugurating CALLED BY NAME
- The homily should introduce the program and stress the importance of priestly and religious vocations in the church (see suggested "talking points")
- The Prayers of the Faithful and music are coordinated to specifically address vocations
- Bulletin announcements or inserts are included.
- CALLED BY NAME <u>response cards</u> are placed in the pews and/or pamphlet rack of the church
- Parishioners are asked to prayerfully consider the names of good, potential candidates to the priesthood, diaconate, and religious life. They then write the names on the response cards provided in the pews, and return them to church the following Sunday, or mail them to the parish office.

#### Week II: January 21-22, 2012 (The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time)

- Every priest will speak about their vocation story and how happy they are in the vocation (the pastor may wish to invite a religious to give a reflection).
- Explain why they are happy and what a priest (deacon/religious) does in his (their) ministry.
- Prayers of the Faithful, music, etc. are again specifically coordinated to address vocations
- Bulletin announcements or inserts are included
- CALLED BY NAME response cards are placed in the collection basket or returned to the parish office sometime during the coming week. (Replenish supply in pews/pamphlet rack, as needed)

#### The Follow-up:

- Remaining bulletin announcement in included (in January 28/29 bulletin)
- The submitted names are examined by the parish priests and designated staff members. Those individuals considered to possess the qualities needed for future religious and clergy are set aside for follow-up.
- A letter, (sample provided by the Vocation Office), is sent by the pastor informing the persons recommended that his/her name has surfaced as a result of the CALLED BY NAME program.
- The parish coordinator follows up the pastor's letter with a phone call expressing their encouragement and hope that the person might remain open to the vocation to priesthood, diaconate or religious life. NOTE: The Parish Coordinator should <u>not</u> be given the actual response card and does not need to know who submitted the card.
- The "Parish Nomination/Recommendation Form" (included in this packet) is sent to the Diocesan Vocation Office no later than Sunday, February 12, 2012. Father Kevin Abels will contact those who are recommended by the parish staff.
- A thank you from the parish priests and staff can be published in the bulletin.

Thanks for all you do to pray for and encourage vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, and religious life! Your efforts will make a difference!

# **CALLED BY NAME**Homily "Talking Points"

(for priests and deacons)

### Second Sunday in Ordinary Time – January 14/15, 2012

- At His Baptism, Christ's identity was made known ... "This is my beloved Son, on whom my favor rests."
- Our vocations are rooted in our Baptism, when we are given our identity in faith by God.
- In Baptism we are graced and blessed by God, and throughout life each of us has a responsibility to reflect upon those graces and blessings so that we can make a generous return to the Lord.
- Through our vocations we say "Yes" to God. Our vocation does not answer the question, "What do I want to do with my life?" but rather answers the question, "Who does God want me to be?"
- There are a multitude of ways we can respond to the Lord, and some respond through consecrated and priestly lives. There is no one path to priesthood, diaconate or religious life; people enter that process at different stages in their lives.
- Highlight the great need in our Church for religious vocations.
- An announcement should made to indicate where the CALLED BY NAME response cards have been placed and to invite people to prayerfully consider names of potential candidates. Remind the assembly that the cards will be collected the following week.

<u>Please note</u>: These are offered as suggested talking points and not an actual outline that must be followed.

### Third Sunday in Ordinary Time – January 21/22, 2012

The homily this week simply asks the priest to tell his vocation story and show how happy he is in his ministry as a priest. Here are some suggested talking points:

- How long have you been a priest?
- Describe the call/when did you know you wanted to be a priest?
- When did you first think about it? How old were you?
- What did you want to do before you became a priest?
- Who helped you to choose this vocation?
- Were you afraid?
- What did your family say?
- What makes you happy as a priest?
- What do you do as a priest?

### PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS



We ask this in the Name of Jesus Christ, the Great High Priest, Amen.




