GENERAL ORDER NO. 12 PROHIBITION OF IN-PERSON CONCLAVES OF GRAND, SUBORDINATE, AND CONSTITUENT COMMANDERIES

May 4, 2020

To all Grand Commanderies and Subordinate Commanderies within the Jurisdiction of, and holding Allegiance to, the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar.

GREETINGS:

The number of persons infected with the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, continues to increase in the United States and throughout the world, and the danger to vulnerable populations is unabated, especially among the elderly and those with underlying medical conditions, many of whom are our Fratres. In the face of the crisis, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention urged persons to "avoid all nonessential travel" and take other appropriate measures to prevent community transmission of the virus, including avoiding large public gatherings, the wearing of facemasks in public, and working from home. While rates of infection appear to be leveling or declining in places and tentative steps have been taken by some governmental authorities to relax or rescind business and school closures and stay-at-home orders, the numbers of COVID-19 infections are expected to experience a resurgence in the fall and winter months.

Accordingly, I, the Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of the United States of America, by the authority in me vested by Section 23 of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment, do hereby waive the requirement of Section 36 (a) of the Constitution. It is ordered that all in-person Conclaves of Grand, Constituent, or Subordinate Commanderies be prohibited until further notice. Any such Conclave currently scheduled is hereby cancelled. This prohibition has no exceptions.

I authorize the Grand Commander or his designee to convene the Stated Conclave of his Grand Commandery by means of teleconference or webcast, provided that the necessary facilities are widely available to the members of the Grand Commandery and the Stated Conclave be conducted in full compliance with the requirements of Sections 37 through 39 of the Constitution.

In addition, I do hereby waive the requirement of Section 65 (a) of the Constitution, and authorize the Commander of a Constituent Commandery within each Grand Commandery to convene a Stated Conclave by means of teleconference or webcast, provided that the necessary facilities are widely available to the members of the Constituent Commandery and the Stated Conclave be conducted in full compliance with the requirements of Sections 65 and 66 of the Constitution. Commanders of Subordinate Commanderies enjoy the same discretion. No ritual shall be performed and no Orders be conferred during any such telephonic or webcast Conclave. The safety and well-being of our Sir Knights and their families being paramount, the provisions of Sections 48 (d), 59, 176, and 195 of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment shall be inoperative while this General Order is in force.

This supersedes General Order No 11 of the tenth day of March, last, in its entirety.

Given under my hand and seal of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America at Bismarck, North Dakota, this fourth day of May 2020, A.O. 902.

PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE

Don't wait until the end of June to update KYRIS. We had to make updates to the server software which runs our database, and this has caused a number of issues. I believe that most of them have been corrected, but we won't know for sure until all of YOU begin to do your updates.

Go ahead and make any changes that you need to do now. If you run into any issues, notify me as soon as possible so that I can track down and correct those problems before we begin doing Annual Returns.

Why did I do this to us? The software had reached its end-of-support date and was no longer being updated. This tends to create security issues, and ultimately leads to other issues as software which is maintained by the server owner will begin to conflict with the outdated software which we were using.

Why did this create a problem? This particular update made a major change to the way many of our queries interacted with the database; instead of getting data back for every row of data that met the criteria, the new software dropped every row that did not have data in every field. That meant that every record that didn't have a date – formerly showed 0000-00-00 – would no longer display on your reports and would no longer show up on you list of members.

What do I need to do if I find an issue? Send an email to me as soon as possible with as many details as possible about the problem. Give me a contact phone number so I can call for clarification if need be. Most of you have my phone number and email address. If not, reply to the newsletter email.


As we get closer to our grand sessions, we will get information out to everyone if there are any changes that we must make.

THE MORE YOU KNOW

This month we return to Dr. Mackey and his Encyclopedia of Freemasonry. I don't think there is much confusion today about the following topic, but found Mackey's discussion to be, as usual, enlightening. - Editor

Royal Arch Banners

Much difficulty has been experienced by ritualists in reference to the true colors and proper arrangements of the banners used in an American Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. It is admitted that they are four in number, and that their colors are blue, purple, scarlet and white; and it is known, too, that the devices on these banners are a lion, an ox, a man, and an eagle; but the doubt is constantly arising as to the relation between these devices and these colors, and as to which of the former is to be appropriated to each of the latter. The question, it is true, is one of mere ritualism, but it is important that the ritual should be always uniform, and hence the object of the present article is to attempt the solution of this question.

The banners used in a Royal Arch Chapter are derived from those which are supposed, to have been borne by the twelve tribes of Israel during their encampment in the wilderness, to which reference is made in the second chapter of the Book of Numbers, and the second verse: "Every man of the children of Israel shall pitch by his own standard." But as to what were the devices on the banners, or what were their various colors, the Bible is absolutely silent. To the inventive genius of the Talmudists are we indebted for all that we know or profess to know on this subject. These mystical philosophers have given to us with wonderful precision the various devices which they have borrowed from the death-bed prophecy of Jacob, and have sought, probably in their own fertile imaginations, for the appropriate colors.

The English Royal Arch Masons, whose system diners very much from that of their American Companions, display in their Chapters the twelve banners of the tribes in accordance with the Talmudic devices and colors. These have been very elaborately described by Dr. Oliver, in his *Historical Landmarks*, and beautifully exemplified by Companion Harris, in his *Royal Arch Tracing Boards*.

But our American Royal Arch Masons, as we have seen, use only four banners, being those attributed by the Talmudists to the four principal tribes —Judah, Ephraim, Reuben, and Dan. The devices on these banners are respectively a lion, an ox, a man, and an

eagle. As to this there is no question; all authorities, such as they are, agreeing on this point. But, as has been before said, there is some diversity of opinion as to the colors of each, and necessarily as to the officers by whom they should be borne.

Some of the Targumists, or Jewish biblical commentators, say that the color of the banner of each tribe was analogous to that of the stone which represented that tribe in the breastplate of the high priest. If this were correct, then the colors of the banners of the four leading tribes would be red and green, namely, red for Judah, Ephraim, and Reuben, and green for Dan; these being the colors of the precious stones sardonyx, ligure, carbuncle, and chrysolite by which these tribes were represented in the high priest's breastplate. Such an arrangement would not, of course, at all suit the symbolism of the American Royal Arch banners.

Equally unsatisfactory is the disposition of the colors derived from the arms of speculative Masonry, as first displayed by Dermott in his *Ahiman Rezon*, which is familiar to all American Masons, from the copy published by Cross, in his *Hieroglyphic Chart*. In this piece of blazonry, the two fields occupied by Judah and Dan are azure, or blue, and those of Ephraim and Reuben are *or*, or golden yellow; an appropriation of colors altogether uncongenial with Royal Arch symbolism.

We must, then, depend on the Talmudic writers solely for the disposition and arrangement of the colors and devices of these banners. From their works we learn that the color of the banner of Judah was white; that of Ephraim scarlet; that of Reuben purple; and that of Dan blue; and that the devices of the same tribes were respectively the lion, the ox, the man, and the eagle.

Hence, under this arrangement — and it is the only one upon which we can depend —the four banners in a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, working in the American Rite, must be distributed as follows among the banner-bearing officers:

1st. An eagle, on a blue banner. This represents the tribe of Dan, and is borne by the Grand Master of the first veil.

2d. A man, on a purple banner. This represents the tribe of Reuben, and is borne by the Grand Master of the second veil.

3d. An ox, on a scarlet banner. This represents the tribe of Ephraim, and is borne by the Grand Master of the third veil.

4th. A lion, on a white banner. This represents the tribe of Judah, and is borne by the Royal Arch Captain.



Excerpt from **The Richmond Daily Record, January 15, 1921**, discussing a statement issued by President- Elect Warren G. Harding after being made a Royal Arch Mason

When Mr. Harding takes the oath of office next Mach 4 as the president, his creed will be that expressed in Micah, sixth chapter and eighth verse. The verse follows: "He hath shewed thee, O man, that is good, and what doth the Lord require of thee to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God."

The president-elect made the announcement relative to his proposed creed **Friday night after he had been made a Royal Arch Mason**, it became known today.

"During the last ten days, I have been taken far back into the story of creation and I have found it to be adding to my sense of religious devotion." President elect Harding said, according to the statement given out. "Prayer grips the heart and adds to one's confidence. I believe in prayer. I believe in prayer in one's closet, for there one faces God alone. Many times, prayer is only for people's ears. But I can understand how those of old, in their anxieties, problems, and perplexities, found courage and strength when they gave their hearts to the great, omnipotent God in prayer.

How many things are in Scriptures that we, in our worldliness, never discover? After all, men are very much alike. God made us all in the same image and there is no difference in us except as we have developed, or the weight of responsibility is shouldered on us then God makes men equal to that responsibility. It is the touch of responsibility that makes human beings awake.

"The government of this republic has been adrift and the inevitable result has followed. 
