Fiber artist, designer and quilter, Grace J. Errea, began quilting in 2000. Her art focuses on the depiction of inspiring scenes in a "value based" contemporary-realistic manner. She feels very fortunate to have many of her first quilts exhibited in juried shows and be recognized for their innovation in technique and depiction of nature and people.

In 2005 she chose to retire from a very successful career as an executive in a Fortune 500 computer and telecommunications company to devote herself to her art on a full-time basis. Grace is a self-taught artist and her work illustrates and has been recognized for exceptional primary use of values and secondary use of color. Her focus on



value makes it easy for her and her students to create inspiring botanicals, landscape scenes and portraits, in any color.



Grace's innovative techniques and her focus on value have attracted widespread interest from quilters, as well as national and international galleries, museums and publications. She has been invited to show her art and to teach overseas and in various locations in the United States. Her classes are well attended, in demand, and are presented in a fun, informal, and educational manner.

Grace currently resides, quilts, and teaches in Southern California. She and her husband have two daughters, Julia and Lauren, and two cats, Thelma and Louise.




NON-PROFIT DESIGNATION

INTRODUCING Nancy Bloyer



You may not recognize Nancy, our Secretary for SQG, since these days she is without Flair, a darling yellow Labrador Retriever guide dog, who has now begun his working career. She and her husband started raising guide dogs three years ago as a type of service work that fit their lives and which they could do together. She's discovered that raising pups gives her a sense of purpose, something she lost when she was diagnosed with rheumatoid arthritis in 1999.

Years ago, Nancy's budding interest in quilting was helped along by a friend in the accounting department where she worked. Nancy liked the idea of learning to do something creative and functional. Although she doesn't think of herself as a quilting purist, she did learn to hand quilt before the abundance of machine quilting options there are today, so she feels good about helping to keep alive a tradition of folk art that includes hand appliqué and hand quilting. Her favorite quilting projects are heirloom baby quilts, usually hand-appliquéd and hand-quilted, as well as making items to donate for fundraisers.

A pivotal moment in Nancy's quilting career was when she once sold a lady a baby quilt as a gift for a friend. The lady opened it up, said it's nice, and then stuffed it back in the bag. In that disappointing moment, Nancy realized how much of herself she puts into each and every quilt she makes. That was the end of her sales career as a home quilter!

In the new year, you will be seeing Nancy with another young guide dog in training. Make a point of introducing yourself to both of them.




Surfside Quilters Guild D A Block A Month DR (reverse) **January 2010** Weathervape

9 1/2" unfinished pieced block with Y-seams and snowballed units

Surfside Quilters Guild is up! Each month make blocks for your own Surfs Op sampler quilt. This month make <u>one</u> Weathervape block. Following the picture tutorial will simplify the construction of this block.

Cut the following fabrics: Wash reds and blues to prevent bleeding.

- A. From sky blue fabric, cut a strip 2" x 24" then cut the strip into twelve 2" squares to be used for pieces A and C.
- B. From sky blue fabric, cut a strip 2 ¹/₂" x 20". Cut the strip into four 2 ¹/₂" x 2 ¹/₂" squares. Cut each square in half diagonally for B pieces.
- C. From red fabric (or color of your choice) cut a strip 1 ½" x 14". Using template D, cut 4 pieces.
- D. From yellow fabric (or color of your choice), cut a strip 1 ¹/₂" x 14". Using template D-R, cut 4 pieces.
- E. From dark blue (or color of your choice), cut a strip 3 1/2" x 14". Cut into four 3 ¹/₂" x 3 ¹/₂" squares for F pieces.
- F. Cut one 3 ¹/₂" x 3 ¹/₂" square of yellow (or color of your choice) for the center square (G).

Sew block using Y-seam and snowball techniques: Layout all pieces to form Weathervane as shown in top illustration. Use scant ¹/₄" seam.

- A. For Y-seams, place a dot ¹/4" from one corner of wrong side of four A squares, four D and DR pieces using a pencil or washable pen as shown in diagrams 1 and 2.
- B. Place D and DR right sides together. Begin stitching at dot taking two back-stitches only. Sew to bottom of pieces. (See diagram 1).
- C. Pin A to D and sew from outer edge to dot and take a small backstitch. See diagram 2.
- D. Pivot the other edge of A to DR and stitch from dot to edge, backstitching 2 stitches at dot. Press seam towards DR.
- E. Sew diagonal edge of B to edge of D and another one to edge of DR. Press towards D and DR. Make 4 of these 3 ¹/₂" A-B-D-DR units.
- F. To "snowball" C to F, draw a pencil line diagonally from corner to corner on C squares. Place C on corner of F. Sew on the line. Trim excess from sewn corner leaving ¼" seam. Press towards F. Repeat process on the other corner. Make 4 of these 3 ½" C-F units. See diagram 3.
- G. Lay out the nine units to form Weathervane block. Sew in rows, then sew rows together. Press well.
