

Meet the producers

The stunning landscape of Arnside & Silverdale Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty attracts and inspires many talented people to create quality produce. You can meet some of them as they host events during the Food and Local Produce Festival!

Johnny and Emmie Bland will be hosting an open day at Arnside Tower Farm on the 1st of June, when you can see their working dogs and help bring the cows in for milking. The Blands have a strong focus on animal welfare: a new path has reduced lameness in their herd to almost zero; their milk is truly free range, with cattle outdoors and feeding on grass rather than silage for eleven months of the year due to their free draining limestone soil.







The Coppice Co-op will be opening their gates for a woodyard open day on the 4th of June, where you can watch demonstrations and try your hand at greenwood crafts. The Co-op team manage the woodland around the depot to increase biodiversity; and use the wood they harvest to make garden products like bean poles, hazel hurdles and besom brooms.
