Implementation of opioid sparing prescribing guidelines based on surgery type, and evidence-based perioperative education for surgical patients receiving opioid prescriptions on discharge is an urgent priority requiring increased adoption in clinical practice. This session will enable the perianesthesia nurse to increase his/her knowledge on current multi-modal opioid sparing prescribing guidelines, current patient education requirements for patients who are discharged with opioid prescriptions, and current state policy requirements.

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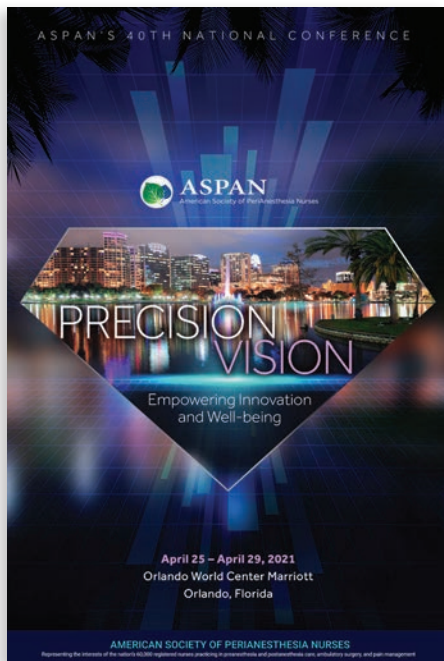


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
