Minutes of General Membership Meeting March 10, 2014

Sew Get To Know Someone This Month!

I have been sewing for the better part of 50 years. I started out making clothes because I was 5 foot 9 and slender and could not find clothes to fit since we were in the mini skirt era. I made many mistakes, took a lot of classes. I continued on to sew for my family and made most of what my daughter wore even made shirts for my husband and son. I was introduced to quilting in 1995 when my sister invited me to go with her to a quilt class. Did not know what I was getting into. She sent me the list of yardage with light, dark and medium fabric requirements and I was lost, but charged ahead and went to the class. My choices were not the best and I had not worked with a quarter seam allowance much in the past except in making doll clothes for my daughters dolls and had not worked with rulers and rotary cutters that much. I made the guilt and hand guilted it and was hooked. Took another class from Quilters Gallery and was really hooked. I have not looked back since. My sister and I have gone to NC Seminars and retreats together since that first class.

I was born in Pittsburgh PA and learned to sew by watching my mom make clothes for my sister and me. And so my passion for fabric began, making clothes for my Troll and Barbie dolls from mom's fabric scraps. Years later, I became interested in making Amish dolls and other primitive crafts. The first quilt I made was hand quilted while my daughter recovered from chickenpox! IBM transferred our family to NC in 1992 and that year an elderly lady at my church taught me how to hand-quilt on a large frame. I soon realized that machine quilting was a much faster approach. Art quilts are my favorite to make and I thank our guild for showing me that quilts can be more than traditional. My husband and I will celebrate our 40th anniversary this year. Our 3 grandchildren are the source many inspirations and the recipients of many projects!

Crockpot Ranch Pork Chops:

1 package of boneless pork chops 1 can of Cream of Chicken soup 1 packet dry Ranch dressing mix

In crockpot layer pork chops, add the cream of chicken soup, then sprinkle dry Ranch dressing all over.

Cover and cook on high for 4 hours OR Low for 6 hours.

Sew Helpful Hints & Tricks

1. Here is a great tip for handling binding strips from Linda Brimanson:



- If you use a pizza box to transport/store your fabric squares and/or pieces of fabric, spray a little 505 basting spray in the bottom of the box and then insert a piece of thin batting into the bottom. This will keep the blocks and pieces from sliding around in the box.
- 3. For those of you who like to pre-wash your fabric: Before storing, all fabric cut edges are serged, then washed, hung to dry and folded (don't iron anything until you are ready to use it). The serged edge tells you that the fabric has been washed. If new yardage is placed in your stash, it is immediately identifiable because it has not been serged. The advantage of serging the cut edges is that there is no raveling in the washer and no waste. You can cut right up to the edge. Any serged edges easily are hidden in the seam.
