What you'll be doing

We're really excited to give somebody the opportunity to develop a lot of new skills. We will put together a full training plan and start you off on some practice projects, so you can rapidly develop new skills over the first few weeks. For your part, you'll need to be highly motivated and be prepared to pickup lots of information over a short space of time!

Over time your job will involve being hands-on in most or all of the following responsibilities:

- Design brand-new websites from scratch, including exploring ideas with clients and project managing the process from start to finish (i.e. website design). This will involve creating the visual/creative elements of a website, and structing a website in a logical way. Also, you'll give careful consideration to how webpages adapt for desktops and mobile devices.
- Building new features on existing websites. This could involve website design and/or web development. You may possess or be interested in learning various web programming languages, such as HTML, CSS, JavaScript, jQuery, PHP and more. (But, don't worry if you're not a coder, as they'll be plenty of non-programming tasks to keep you busy instead!).
- Managing the technical running of the websites, such as installing software upgrades, testing websites, monitoring the web servers, and other maintenance tasks.
- Supporting existing clients and new customers, such as editing and adding new content, providing customer care, and offering advice.

And it's expected you'll be involved in several of these other tasks below on a less frequent basis. We'll tailor your day-to-day work to the areas you're most interested in.

- Image editing, for example using Adobe Photoshop software.
- Search Engine Optimisation (SEO).
- Social media management.
- Website security hardening and audits.
- Website accessibility testing.
- Photography for clients.

- Creating video productions for use on the web and in social media.
- Email marketing (e.g. using MailChimp).
- Running tests and checks on new websites or new features, to ensure they work as expected (i.e. quality assurance).



- Running training sessions or screensharing tutorials.
- Writing documentation for clients, or for internal use.
- Domain name registration and management.

In addition, we'll expect you to help with the ongoing running of the business, such as:

- Responding to enquiries and requests via email and phone.
- Preparing quotes for new work.
- Invoicing and preparing reports.
- Maintaining client notes.

- Marketing and attracting new customers to help grow the business.
- Publishing blogs, writing advice articles for our customers (e.g. "how-to" guides) and updating the Primary Image website, and very much improving how we keep in touch with customers.

We've also got some big ideas on expanding the business. Primary Image is increasingly focussing on web design and WordPress support services, so we're planning a rebrand, redesigning our own website, improving a lot of our internal processes and tools, launching new products, and making the business work even more efficiently.

- Have an appetite to keep learning, developing and improving.

- Using cPanel software (we use this to manage the hosting accounts, which is used on millions of other websites).
