


Certification CCCEP Certified Compliance & Ethics Professional

- SCCE is starting the CCEP® Fellowship—an advanced certification for experienced compliance and ethics professionals




- How do I qualify to sit the exam?
 - You must acquire 20 CEUs in the year prior to taking the test
 - You must have appropriate work experience: see the Candidate Handbook





- How can I study for the exam?

- How can I obtain the 20 CEUs necessary to sit for the exam?
 - You may attend a full Basic Compliance & Ethics Academy and obtain the 20 CEUs necessary
 - You may attend SCCE Conferences: CEUs granted depend on the length of the conference
 - You may participate in SCCE Web Conferences: 1.2 CEUs each
 - You may click on the CCEP® Renewal page to find CCEP®-accredited programs
 - You may use the Individual Application to apply for credits for nonaccredited programs



- When and where can I take the exam?
 - Following the SCCE Basic Compliance & Ethics Academy: exam dates are listed on our website, www.corporatecompliance.org, along with the Academy information
 - You may take the exam after a few of our larger conferences, details of which are listed on our website
 - You can go to the testing center's website at www.goAMP.com and locate a testing center near you



- What form does the test take?
 - Questions are multiple choice. A test taken at one of our conferences is in a pencil-and-paper format. If taken at an AMP testing site, the exam is administered by computer

- What is an Allied Professional?
 - Anyone who has worked in the compliance field more than 1,500 hours, over a period not to exceed two years. See the Candidate Handbook





- How do I know if I passed the examination?
 - You may call Applied Measurement Professionals at +1 915 895 4600 or 888 519 9901 (U.S. & Canada)
 - You will receive a certificate and letter acknowledging your credentials
- How do I take the exam again if I did not pass?
