
Seth Van Tifflin is a young man from Michigan who I (Carol Stickney) met when he came to Thailand when I was ministering there in 2007-2009. He also traveled to Myanmar to work with Pastor Pa Kep. His heart was really for the

children who were being trafficked.



Seth started a ministry, "In Better Hands", to care for children at high risk of being trafficked and those that have been rescued from physical/sexual abuse and/or trafficking in Asia. His first home was in the Chin capitol of Myanmar, Hakha. Since then he has started nine more homes

- in Myanmar, Cambodia, and Thailand. These are truly "homes" and not orphanages. He has tried to keep the number of children in each home to 10 or under.



<u>DAVID'S STORY</u> David was a young boy in Myanmar when his father sold his 13-year-old sister to a trafficker for drug money. Weeks later, David's mother, not having anything to do with the sale of their daughter, died (we believe from a broken heart). Some time passed and David's father then made it known that he was willing to sell David for \$50. Hearing the situation and knowing that we needed to keep David safe, we paid the \$50 to the father. David is still very angry with his father for breaking apart his family but he is doing exceptionally well in one of our In Better Hands homes.

In Better Hands started their 10th safe home on June 1st in Pyin Oo Lwin, Myanmar. The house-father is also a newly appointed Myanmar FMC church planter. These children were displaced because of the civil war in Shan State*, no one caring for them when they fled. They were rescued from the Myanmar/China border. Many of these young children do not know their parents' names or even their own legal names.

*This state was in the news where we heard about the atrocities happening to the Rohingya people. However, there are many other tribes facing the same brutalities and hardships.

That's why, early in His ministry, Jesus quoted Isaiah's Old Testament prophecy that He had been sent to "set free those who are oppressed" (Luke 4:18 NASB).
