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# INTRODUCTION

## What is Access to Recovery III?

ATR III is a four-year grant program funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT). ATR III is a presidential initiative which provides vouchers to adults with substance use disorders to help pay for a range of community-based clinical treatment and recovery support services. The goals of the program are (1) Facilitate genuine individual choice and promote multiple pathways to recovery through the development and implementation of a substance use treatment and recovery support service voucher system; (2) Expand access to a comprehensive array of clinical substance use treatment and recovery support services, including those provided through faith-based organizations; and (3) Ensure each client receives an assessment for the appropriate level of services. All services are designed to assist recipients remain engaged in their recovery while promoting independence, employment, self-sufficiency, and stability.

## Program History

The program was launched in August 2004 when three-year *Access to Recovery I* grants were awarded to 14 states and one tribal organization. During that grant period, more than 170,000 people with substance use disorders received treatment and/or recovery support services—exceeding the nationwide target of 125,000 people. Over 17,000 were served in Connecticut. Given that success, the program was re-funded in September 2007 when three-year *Access to Recovery II* grants were awarded to 18 states, 5 tribal organizations, and the District of Columbia. During this grant period *Access to Recovery II* in Connecticut served over 9,000 service recipients.

## CT's ATR Program

The Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS) received an *ATR I* grant in 2004, an *ATR II* grant in September 2007 and an *ATR III* grant on September 30, 2010. The program serves adults with substance use disorders who are involved with specific state and community partner agency programs. Advanced Behavioral Health (ABH®) has been contracted by DMHAS to act as the Administrative Services Organization (ASO) for ATR III.

# SERVICES

## CLINICAL SERVICES

### **Buprenorphine Treatment**

A non-residential service provided in a facility licensed by the Department of Public Health to offer “Ambulatory Chemical Detoxification” or substance abuse “Outpatient Treatment” to opiate addicted individuals. This service involves administration or prescription of Suboxone or Subutex with gradual reductions in dosage to mitigate symptoms in addition to clinical support, including an assessment of needs, recovery planning, individual and group therapy, and relapse prevention strategies. This model is designed to enable the recipient to become opiate-free between 181 and 365 days for induction/maintenance/taper.

## RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES

**Care Coordination** Available to all individuals accessing ATR III. Care coordinators will follow ATR III recipients through their course of ATR III services. Through Care Coordination, recipients receive a recovery assessment, a completed recovery plan with goals, a guide to accessing ATR services, and referrals to ATR III and other funded services.

### **Recovery Management Services**

Recovery management services help recipients work on the goals created with the Care Coordinator. Through Recovery Management Services, recipients receive referrals; assistance with accessing other services; linkages to transportation, basic needs, and other support services; and assisting with completing paperwork for housing and other needs. Services are provided in the community, and a primary goal is to provide linkages to substance abuse and mental health treatment and recovery support services.

### **Supported Recovery Housing Services**

A clean, safe, drug and alcohol-free transitional living environment with on-site case management services available at least 8 hours per day 5 days per week. Case management services include assessment, recovery planning and discharge planning with the goal of linking residents to substance abuse and mental health treatment services, entitlements, employment, permanent housing and other needed community supports to promote autonomy.

**Independent Housing** Short-term assistance provided to secure affordable and safe housing via a lease agreement with a landlord. Recipients must have income to support the rental amount on an ongoing basis.

### **Faith Recovery Support Services**

Faith recovery support services are provided via individual meetings that are designed to help persons in recovery forge supportive connections with self-selected faith communities, discover positive personal interests, and take on valued social roles. Through Faith Support, recipients receive mentoring and positive role modeling, pastoral and spiritual counseling, social support and community engagement, and integration of faith and recovery values. Services are usually provided in a religious or spiritual setting by spiritual leaders or other staff who are knowledgeable about the spiritual values of the community and are equipped to assist individuals in finding spirituality.

**Basic Needs** Available to individuals engaged in treatment and/or recovery supports. Issued in the form of a gift card or a bus pass. Basic needs can only be approved and distributed by the ATR III Care Coordinator.

## **SERVICES (continued)**

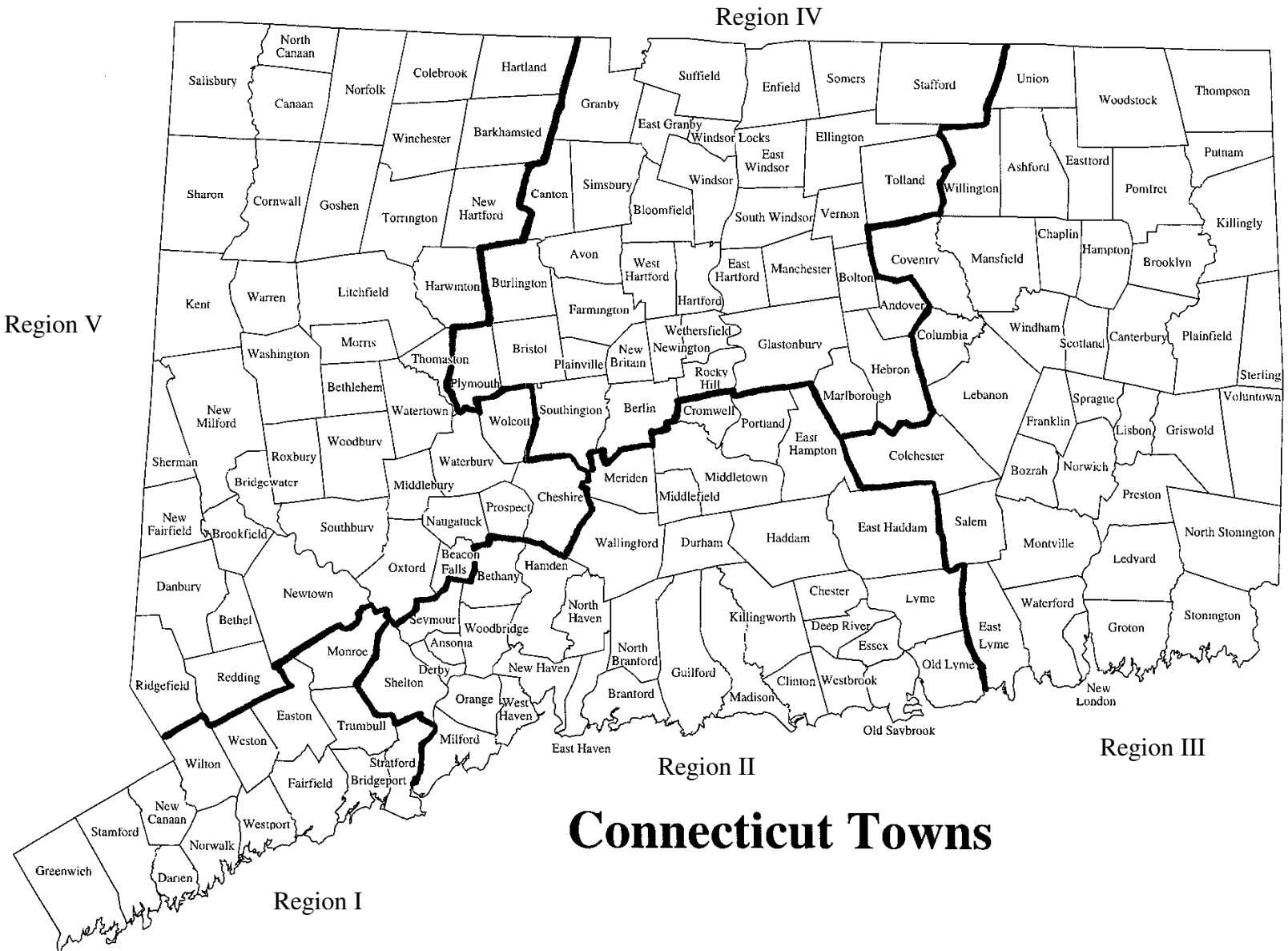
### **Recovery Oriented Vocational Services**

Services directed toward improving and maintaining employment and include: skills assessment and development, job coaching, job placement, resume writing, interviewing skills, and tips for retaining a job. Other services include training in a specific skill or trade to assist individuals to prepare for, find, and obtain competitive employment.

### **Wellness Services**

Directed toward improving overall health and well-being and include services that may not be covered by traditional health insurance such as: nutritional counseling, gym memberships, smoking cessation, weight loss counseling, relaxation, meditation, yoga, tai chi, homeopathy, etc.

## **Approach / Philosophy**

There are four tenets of the STRIVE philosophy:

- That there are large numbers of individuals who have been labeled as unemployable who can work and want to work.
- That employment is the fastest way for an individual to lift themselves to economic self sufficiency
- That it is the lack of soft skills, not hard skills, that is keeping many people from working
- Long term follow up and support are crucial for individuals who are transitioning back into the workplace.

## **Program Description:**

STRIVE is not a traditional occupational skills training or academic enrichment classroom program. It is an in-your-face, attitudinal adjustment, experiential learning program that confronts and addresses individual behaviors that prohibit workplace success.

STRIVE recognizes that many people have never gained the foundational soft skills to succeed at the first jobs that lead to greater growth. Inability to work cooperatively, handle criticism, or successfully navigate the myriad of spoken and unspoken expectations in any work place have often meant people lose job after job without understanding why—or how—to change.

STRIVE therefore delivers a personalized and practical introduction to the world of work itself.

Serving any Connecticut resident who chooses to participate, regardless of skill level, incarceration history, STRIVE shows outstanding results compared to other employment and training programs, while operating at a fraction of the cost. Job placement is typically between 70-80%, and post-placement support brings retention to 70% or higher.

- Each STRIVE consists of three core elements:
  - Training. Three or four weeks of intensely personalized training engage each participant individually, calling on each person to examine his or her own behaviors and attitudes. Role-Playing, team work, and class work



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help participants learn to accept criticism, work as part of a team, write resumes, positively frame their work experience or history, and anticipate and meet workplace and employer needs. Professional attire is required at all times. Training includes job interview coaching and resume preparation. During training, participants receive personalized case management to assist with other needs such as housing, child care, or transportation.

- Job Placement. STRIVE helps graduates in finding and successfully interviewing for a job that meets their skills and abilities. Emphasis is on continuous learning and improvement, as initial jobs are entry-level, each participant is urged to advance in existing jobs or increase earnings by furthering their education and moving to different positions or employers. All STRIVE graduates receive lifetime job placement and retention assistance.
- Retention Support  
The first weeks and months on the job are often high-risk, as people use newly-learned skills in real-life, high-pressure situations. STRIVE remains a resource for our graduates and employers, to anticipate and head off any potential or emerging problems before they result in the loss of employment for a graduate. Follow up, tracking, and social service advocacy for all STRIVE graduates lasts a minimum of two years and often longer.

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The STRIVE training is the most unique element of the program. The dropout rate during training is high, with approximately 50% of people who apply and attend orientation making it to graduation. STRIVE is not for everyone and participants must be ready to honestly confront themselves and to change. However, a student who leaves is always welcome to come back when he or she is willing to participate in the program.

During the course, STRIVE trainers (NOT teachers or instructors TRAINERS) push every limit a student has how they look, how they act, how they interact, how they play and most importantly, how much do they want to change.

With deep trust and mutual respect students learn to be independent, responsible and also accountable to each other as teammates. The relationships within each cycle of graduates is unique, not unlike a group of new Marine recruits who make it through basic training, and the connection to the STRIVE staff becomes life-long.

STRIVE succeeds because it is different and innovative because of its long term post-placement support that is prohibited by many traditional employment and training providers. STRIVE is offered at no cost to participants, with each STRIVE affiliate raising the \$3,500 per person needed to provide the training. The return on investment is remarkable: Hard-to-employ people, with low educational attainment and little successful work history become gainfully employed, contributing to their communities and their families, as opposed to being incarcerated or supported by public benefits. All of the work performed by STRIVE leads their graduates to the ultimate goal of economic self sufficiency for themselves and their families.
