




Student Demographics A.S. Accounting Technology

Of the 42 graduates, the following reflects the ethnic diversity:


- African American 9

Employed Graduates A.S. Accounting Technology

The Florida Education and Training Placement Information Program (FETPIP) data is the source for this information. Each of the 28 Florida College System Institutions are required to report student outcomes to the Florida State Department of Education annually. This data includes information on student graduation, employment, earnings, and continued education rates. The data reported lags at least two years behind but is collected in a consistent manner. The graph below represents the percent of employed FSCJ graduates compared to the percent of employed graduates of comparative schools (averaged). 


Assessment

In the A.S. Accounting Technology program, students are tested on the various sections of the Peregrine Common Professional Component (CPC) Comprehensive Exam. Results are compared to other ACBSP schools. The outbound results over the past 3 evaluation periods are

graphed below.












Assessment A.S. Accounting Technology

In the A.S. in Accounting Technology program, students will demonstrate relevant competencies on the Business Ethics in Accounting section of the Peregrine CPC exam.





Student Satisfaction Results A.S. Accounting Technology

To measure student satisfaction, a survey is administered in the Capstone course. The students rate the Overall Program and Facilities on a scale (Very Dissatisfied, Dissatisfied, Neither Satisfied nor Dissatisfied, Satisfied, Very Satisfied). The percentage of students who rate as Satisfied or Very Satisfied with the Overall Program and Facilities for 4 terms are plotted on the graph below.
