# 2016-2017 Enrollment How to re-enroll or join as a new member

The new 4-H year begins on October 16th, 2016. Enrollment will be done electronically at 4honline.com, but is not complete and youth, leaders, and volunteers are not active until all forms are signed, received, reviewed, and accepted by the Extension Office. Enrollment for youth is also not complete and they are not active until the \$35.00 enrollment fee (\$20.00 if the child is a cloverbud - ages 5-7) has been received in the Extension Office.

#### Re-Enrollment:

You will need to go to 4honline.com and select "I have a profile" or "I forgot my password" (if you have forgotten it), and enter the email address you initially gave us. If you have forgotten the email address given to us, please call the Extension Office at 970.625.3969 ext. 3. Please make sure all Required Electronic Signature fields are satisfied.

**Literature:** Since you are **not** new to the 4-H program, if you are signing up for the same project(s) as in prior year(s), you have already received the required literature for your project(s). For newly added projects, you will be prompted to input the literature you need. As always, please be mindful as literature cost has increased and is a large expense to the program.

**Additional forms:** If a youth is enrolling in **\$hooting \$ports**, the Shooting Sports Projects Participation form is required and must be completed and sent/brought in to the Extension Office.

If a youth is enrolling in any **Livestock project for the 1st time,** a W-9 is required and must be completed and sent/brought in to the Extension Office.

#### **New Enrollments:**

If this is your first year in 4-H and you have never enrolled before, you will need to go to 4honline.com and select "I need a profile", and follow the instructions. Please make sure all Required Electronic Signature fields are satisfied. If you are housing animals somewhere other than your home, the system will ask you to print out, complete, and send/bring the housing form in to the Extension Office.

**TIP:** There is a required health form, and it would be helpful to have all medical information available for enrollment (i.e. immunization records, conditions, current medications, physical exam information, allergy information, health insurance information, etc.)

**Literatures** If you are new to the 4-H program, you will need to request the required literature for your project(s), unless you have another sibling or family member that has been involved in the same project(s) prior to you and already has the literature.

**Additional forms:** If a youth is enrolling in **Sheeting Sports**, the Shooting Sports Projects Participation form is required and must be completed and sent/brought in to the Extension Office.

If a youth is new to enrolling in any **Livestock project,** a W-9 is required and must be completed and sent or brought in to the Extension Office.

# National Western Roundup

Catch-a-Calf Program

They come from Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska and Wyoming to compete in National Western Stock Show's longest running program of practical beef cattle management. In just over 70 years, the Catch-A-Calf Contest has awarded nearly 3,000 steers to 4-H members hailing from the western United States.

The program began in 1935 when 10 boys caught 10 sponsored calves.
The contest quickly caught on, and the program grew to include 52 calves by 1942. Soon after World War II, the program settled at 40 calves per year, which is where the number continues to stand today.

The program is designed so successful participants catch a calf, feed it, and return with the animal one year later as a market steer. The market animals are judged on rate of gain, quality of fitting, and carcass quality. The exhibitor is judged on showmanship, their record book, and a personal interview.

Catch-A-Calf contests in the Coliseum are held during the rodeo on Friday, January 13, 2017 (matinee performance), Saturday, January 14, 2017 (matinee performance) and Sunday, January 15, 2017 (matinee & evening performances).

I understand that if successfully catch that calves must be picked up by the 4-H Catch-A-Calf winners at the National Western Livestock Center in May, 2017, and started immediately as a 4-H project for exhibit at the January, 2018 National Western Stock Show.

If I should catch a calf, I will be responsible for feeding, handling, and caring for the calf next year. It is agreed and understood that the responsibility for the calf and its actions shall rest with the 4-H Catch-A-Calf winners.

The calf must be exhibited in the specific Catch-a-Calf classes provided and sold at the 2018 National Western Stock Show, where special prizes will be offered. Catch-A-Calves are not eligible to show in the Junior Market Beef Show.

All prize money won will belong to the member. When the calf is sold, the check for payment will be sent <u>after</u> a final thank-you letter is sent to the sponsor *and* a copy is received by the National Western Stock Show. Catch-a-Calves will automatically be entered in the Fed Beef Contest at the National Western Stock Show. Sale price may be determined for all competing calves by official market grade and yield index or a price arranged by the National Western Stock Show.

Once each month (May through December) each member who catches a calf will be required to write a letter to the sponsor of their calf and send a copy of this letter to Molly Keil. Letters must be postmarked or emailed by the last day of the month. Failure to write the required monthly letters may result in forfeiture of the calf.

Each member must complete a National Western Catch-A-Calf Record Book, including a story, pictures and activities list for the entire project. A complete record must be kept and will be turned in at the NWSS in January, 2018.

The Western Stock Show Association reserves the right to take the calf away from any member who does not abide by these rules or does not properly feed the calf. If any calf is taken away, no allowances will be made for any expenses incurred.



## WOODWORKING


