Pro Tips:

- Reach out to schools directly and check school websites.
 Many tuition-based high schools have school-specific scholarships or grants that students can apply for based on merit, talent, or need.
- Apply to more than one scholarship at a time!
- Ask as many questions as you need to understand the process so your student can be the best possible candidate for any scholarship.
- Think ahead! Applications can open a year ahead of when you'd like to get the scholarship. Planning ahead is the best way to take advantage of all your options.

Eligibility Requirements:	Must intend to enroll in an EITC Eligible private pre-K program in the State of Pennsylvania, reference website for further information

Children's Scholarship Fund Philadelphia	
Grades:	Pre-K-8th
Target Audience:	Low-income Philadelphia families that meet income eligibility guidelines
Eligibility Requirements:	See website for income eligibility guidelines. Family must live in city of Philadelphia and children must be entering Pre-K—8th
Application Process:	Online application for random lottery selection process. Lottery application available September –March 1st for the following school year.

Eligibility Requirements:	Students must be enrolled in Public School at the time of application, wishing to transfer into Private School located in Pennsylvania. Families must live in Pennsylvania and may not have a collective family income greater than \$60,000/year as indicated by submission of documentation of any and all income sources.



Eligibility Requirements:	Must be a student currently in 8th grade attending public or charter school, with sufficient standardized test scores and other eligibility requirements.		
Application Process:	Competitive application process and requirements; see website

Application Process:	Must take the Neumann Scholars exam in October of 8th grade year to qualify, and submit an essay. See website for timelines.

Pro Tips:

- **Do your research!** Work with your student to identify scholarships based on interest, intended major, talent, etc. at local, regional, and national levels.
