Pacific Gas and Electric Company (the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

In order to accommodate a CalTrans highway bridge replacement project (Plumas 70 Spanish Creek Bridge Project) in Plumas County, Pacific Gas and Electric Company must relocate approximately 1450 feet of the existing Caribou #2 60kV Power Line (minor relocation of existing facilities); a distribution voltage line located on the same poles will also be relocated. The project is located approximately 5.25 miles northwest of Quincy along the west side of Highway 70, entirely within Plumas National Forest. Eight wood poles will be removed and replaced with five new poles, approximately 15 feet taller, relocated across the highway to allow for the new bridge construction. One of the five new poles will be light-duty steel to support a new automated switch, and the others will be wood. The height increases are required to provide necessary line spacing above the ground and vegetation, and to keep required separation to secondary circuit on the line. The wires on this segment of power line will also be replaced because the existing conductor (copper wire) is not up to current utility standards.

Construction is scheduled to begin in April 2009, or as soon as possible thereafter, with work expected to be completed by September 2009, or as soon as possible after project initiation.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1.c, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

c. the minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2000 feet in length, or the inter-setting of additional support structures between existing support structures.

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by filing a protest with the CPUC and the Company by **March 24, 2009**, which is 20 days after the date of this filing. Protests should be mailed to the following address:

Construction is scheduled to begin in April 2009, or as soon as possible thereafter, with work expected to be completed by September 2009, or as soon as possible after project initiation.

Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III.B.1 exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Pacific Gas and Electric Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption:

c. The minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2000 feet in length, or the inter-setting of additional support structures between existing support structures.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Pacific Gas and Electric Company has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III.B.2 of General Order 131-D exist;

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
