Crosses

The Cross is likely the oldest religious symbol of all time, from the prehistoric solar cross (an equal armed cross), to the Cross adapted from Pagan cults for Christian use after the council of Nicaea. Cross symbols are among the oldest on earth, and are found in every culture. Crosses are almost invariably symbols of the sun, the sky, and the passage of time, and are linked with most solar deities.







			It was adapted into the emblem of the SS in 1933 by Walter Heck, an SS <u>Sturmhauptführer</u> who worked as a graphic designer for Ferdinand Hoffstatter, a producer of emblems and insignia in <u>Bonn</u> . ^[2] Heck's simple but striking device consisted of two <i>sig</i> runes drawn side by side like lightning bolts, and was soon adopted by all branches of the SS – though Heck himself received only a token payment of 2.5 <u>Reichsmarks</u> for his work. ^[3] The device had a double meaning; as well as standing for the initials of the SS, it could be read as a rallying cry of "Victory, Victory!". ^[2] The symbol became so ubiquitous that it was frequently typeset using runes rather than letters; during the Nazi period, an extra key was added to German typewriters to enable them to type the double- <i>sig</i> logo with a single keystroke. ^[4]
	Eif	Zeal / enthusiasm	The <i>Eif</i> rune is a rotated and reflected version of the J or <u>Eihwaz</u> rune. During the early years of the SS it was used by Hitler's personal adjutants, such as <u>Rudolf Hess</u> . ^[3]
ч	Ger	Communal spirit	The <i>Ger</i> rune was used to symbolise the communitarian ideal of the SS. The <u>11th SS Volunteer Panzergrenadier</u> <u>Division Nordland</u> , a <u>Waffen-SS</u> unit, adopted the rune as a variant of its divisional insignia. ^[3]

*	Hagal	Faith in Nazism	The <u>Hagal</u> Armanen rune was widely used in the SS for its symbolic representation of "unshakeable faith" in Nazi philosophy, as Himmler put it. ^[5] It was used in SS weddings as well as on the <u>SS-Ehrenring</u> (death's head ring) worn by members of the SS. The rune was also used as division insignia of the <u>6th SS Mountain Division Nord</u> . It is roughly similar to the * or <u>Haglaz</u> rune of the Younger Futhark, which stood for "hail", but it was modified by von List for his Armanen runes. List considered it to be the "mother rune" of his runic alphabet and envisaged it as a representation of a hexagonal crystal. ^[6]
۲	<u>Leben</u>	Life	The <i>Lebensrune</i> or "life rune" was based on the <u>Algiz</u> rune and was used by the Lebensborn e. V., the SS body responsible for the <u>Lebensborn</u> programme which supported the "racially, biologically, and hereditarily valuable families" of SS members and other "Aryans". ^{[3][2]} This interpretation of the "man" rune is not based on List, but it occurs as early as the 1920s in the literature of <u>Germanic mysticism</u> , ^[8] and it came to be widely used within the <u>NSDAP</u> and <u>Nazi Germany</u> , e.g. in official prescriptions for the various uniforms of the <u>Sturmabteilung</u> . ^[9] The Yr rune came to be seen as the "life rune" inverted and interpreted as "death rune" (<i>Todesrune</i>) During the <u>World</u> <u>War II</u> era, these two runes (Y for "born", \ddagger for "died") came to be used in obituaries and on tomb stones as marking birth and death dates, replacing asterisk and cross symbols (* for "born", † for "died") conventionally used in this context in Germany.
\$	Odal	Kinship, family and blood unity	The <u>Odal</u> rune symbolised several values of which were of central importance to Nazi ideology. It was adopted from the <u>Elder Futhark</u> &-rune. During the Second World War it was

			used by the <u>7th SS Volunteer Mountain</u> <u>Division Prinz Eugen</u> and the <u>23rd SS</u> <u>Volunteer Panzer Grenadier Division</u> <u>Nederland</u> , as well as the <u>SS-Rasse-</u> <u>und Siedlungshauptamt</u> , which was responsible for maintaining the racial purity of the SS. ^[10]
с,	Opfer	Self-sacrifice	The use of the <i>Opfer</i> rune – which, like the <i>Eif</i> rune, is a rotated version of the J or Eihwaz rune – preceded the Nazis, as it was first adopted after 1918 by <i>Der Stahlhelm</i> war veterans' movement that eventually merged with the Nazi <i>Sturmabteilung</i> (SA). The symbol was adopted by the Nazis after 1923 to commemorate the party members who died in Hitler's failed <u>Beer Hall Putsch.^[3]</u>
+	Tod	Death	The <u>Todesrune</u> is the inverted version of the <u>Lebensrune</u> or "life rune". It was based on the \downarrow or Yr rune, which originally meant "yew". ^[7] It was used by the SS to represent death on documents and grave markers in place of the more conventional \dagger symbol used for such purposes. ^[3]
1	Tyr	Leadership in battle	The <i>Tyr</i> rune followed the design of the \uparrow or <u>Tiwaz rune</u> , named after <u>Týr</u> , the god of single combat, victory and heroic glory in Norse mythology. Its association with war meant that the SS thought of it as the "Kampf" or battle rune, symbolising military leadership. The SS commonly used it in place of the Christian cross on the grave markers of its members. It was also used by graduates of the SA <i>Reichsführerschule</i> , which trained SS officers until 1934; they wore it on their upper left arms. It was adopted as an emblem by the <u>32nd SS</u> <u>Volunteer Grenadier Division 30</u> <u>Januar</u> , which was assembled from the members of SS schools in January 1945, as well as by the SS Recruitment and Training Department ^[10]

As well as List's Armanen runes, the SS used a number of other esoteric symbols. These included:

£++}	Wolfsangel	Liberty and independence	The <u>Wolfsangel</u> ('wolf hook') was used as a <u>heraldic</u> symbol alluding to a wolf trap, and is still found on the municipal arms of a number of German towns and cities. It was adopted by a fifteenth-century peasants' uprising, thus acquiring an association with liberty and independence. The Nazi Party adopted the symbol during its early years and it was subsequently widely used by the SS, including by units such as the <u>2nd SS Division Das Reich</u> . A variant of the <u>Wolfsangel</u> was used by the Weer Afdeelingen, the paramilitary wing of the <u>National Socialist Movement in the</u> <u>Netherlands</u> and the <u>34th SS Volunteer</u> <u>Grenadier Division Landstorm Nederland</u> , which was raised from Dutch Nazis ^[10] and the <u>4th SS</u> <u>Polizei Panzergrenadier Division</u> .


