Age of Exploration

By the end of the 15th century many thing were changing in Europe. The <u>population</u> started to grow more quickly and a new class of <u>merchants emerged</u>. They wanted to buy and sell expensive and <u>valuable</u> products from Asia—like gold, <u>jewels</u> and <u>silk</u>.

In those days, people had no <u>refrigerators</u> to <u>preserve</u> their food. They dried meat and often used salt to make it last longer. To make food taste better they used <u>spices</u>, like pepper or <u>cinnamon</u>.



For centuries Europeans brought these goods on a land route from Asia over thousands of dangerous kilometres . In the 15th century the <u>overland</u> routes were being controlled by the Turkish <u>Empire</u>, which made it even more difficult for European <u>merchants</u> to pass through.

As a result, some European countries, like Spain and Portugal, decided to find out if there was a sea route to India. With the help of new kinds of ships that could sail faster and instruments, like the <u>quadrant</u>, they started the Age of Exploration.

Portuguese exploration


At the end of the 15th century the Portuguese started to <u>explore</u> the west coast of Africa. They set up <u>trading posts</u> and collected gold and silver. They were <u>convinced</u> that by sailing around the coast of Africa they would find a route to India.

In 1487, the Portuguese explorer Bartholomeu Dias sailed around the southern part of the continent and got as far as the east coast of Africa, but a

storm made him turn back. On his return <u>voyage</u>, he saw a piece of land that <u>stretched</u> out into the sea. The Portuguese named it the Cape of Good Hope because they were hopeful of finding a <u>passageway</u> to India.

In 1497 Vasco Da Gama set out from Lisbon, sailed around the Cape of Good Hope and into the Indian Ocean. He <u>reached</u> the west coast of India in May 1498. He took some <u>spices</u> and gold back with him to

Age of Exploration

Christopher Columbus

Christopher Columbus was probably the most famous <u>explorer</u> of the era. He <u>achieved fame</u> by sailing west in search of a sea route to India. Instead of reaching India he discovered that there was an unknown <u>mass</u> of land in between, land that the Europeans knew nothing of.

Columbus was born in Genoa, Italy in 1451 and during his early years his father took him on <u>various</u> sailing trips and wanted to make a <u>merchant</u> out of him.


Like many <u>navigators</u> of that time, Columbus also wanted to sail to India and the Far East. He thought that if he sailed west he would also **reach** the **Spice**

Islands of Asia and India. When he went to the king of Portugal to present his plan, but it was rejected. Queen Isabella of Spain admired young and brave men like Columbus and so she gave him three ships—the Nina, the Pinta and the Santa Maria—and a crew of 90 men.

Columbus left Spain on August 3, 1492. After two months of sailing westward, he landed on an island of the Bahamas, San Salvador, on October 12, 1492. Because he thought he had <u>reached</u> the islands near India he called the <u>natives</u> Indians.



All together, Columbus made four <u>voyages</u> to the New World between 1492 and 1504. He <u>explored</u> the coasts of Cuba, Jamaica, Hispaniola, and Puerto Rico. On his last two <u>voyages</u>, Columbus reached the <u>mainland</u> of Central and South America and travelled as far south as the <u>mouth</u> of the Orinoco River.



After he came home from his fourth voyage, Christopher Columbus fell ill and died in 1506.

After sailing westward for two months Columbus reached the West Indies on October 12, 1492.

Age of Exploration

Other Spanish Explorers

During the early 1500s Spanish <u>explorers</u> travelled across most of Central and South America. They <u>founded</u> colonies and brought <u>settlers</u> to the New World. They also made the native Indians work for them. The **Spaniards** brought new prod-



ucts to the Americas ,like <u>wheat</u>, horses, <u>cattle</u> and sheep. <u>In exchange</u>, they grew plants that were not known in Europe, like corn and potatoes and brought them back to the Old Continent.

In 1513 the Spanish <u>explorer</u> Vasco de Balboa landed in Panama, the part of Central America that is very <u>narrow</u>. With his men, he fought his way through 50 miles of <u>jungle</u> and was surprised to see a new sea, the Pacific Ocean.



One of the most important Spanish <u>conquistadors</u> was Hernando Cortes. He <u>conquered</u> the Aztec <u>empire</u> in 1521. In 1532 and 1533 Francisco Pizarro <u>conquered</u> the Incas. These <u>natives</u> ruled an empire that <u>expanded</u> from Columbia to the northern parts of Argentina. The Incas had great <u>riches</u>, <u>vast amounts of gold and silver</u>. When the Spanish got there they took all of it away from the Incas

French and English explorers


The French and the English concentrated their <u>journeys</u> on the northern part of the continent, because they thought that there also had to be a northwestern route to India.

In 1497 John Cabot, an Italian who sailed for England, landed on the east coast of Canada. In 1534 Jacques Cartier sailed down the St. Lawrence River and <u>reached</u> the Great Lakes. He <u>claimed</u> this <u>territory</u> for the king of France.

During the 1600s the French and English began to <u>set</u> up colonies. The French concentrated on the St .Lawrence valley and the Great Lakes and <u>founded</u> towns like Montreal, or Detroit.

At the end of the <u>century</u> Louis Joliet and Jacques Marquette sailed down the Mississippi River. The land near the Gulf of Mexico was called Louisiana, <u>in honour</u> of the French king. <u>Settlements</u> like St. Louis or New Orleans show French <u>origin</u>.

The first <u>permanent settlement</u> in North America was <u>founded</u> at Jamestown, Virginia in 1607. In 1610 Henry Hudson sailed around north-eastern Canada and <u>discovered</u> a <u>huge</u> body of water which he thought was the Pacific Ocean. Today it is known as Hudson Bay.

Magellan's journey around the world

Age of Exploration

Amerigo Vespucci

Amerigo Vespucci was an Italian-born <u>explorer</u> who explored the <u>mainland</u> of America at the end of the 15th <u>century</u>. A German <u>mapmaker</u> believed that Vespucci was the first to reach the New World ,so he <u>suggested</u> naming the new land America.

Although Vespucci was probably not one of the greatest explorers of the time, he was the first <u>navigator</u> who explored South America.


Magellan sails around the world


In 1519 the Portuguese sailor Ferdinand Magellan set out to find India by sailing around South America. He sailed for Spain because the Portuguese didn't give him any money for this <u>expedition</u>.

Magellan had 5 ships and a <u>crew</u> of 240. When he reached the southern <u>tip</u> of South America, he got into bad, stormy weather. Two of his ships were badly <u>damaged</u> and couldn't continue the journey. With three ships he sailed through a <u>strait</u>, that later was named after him, the Strait of Magellan.

When he reached the Pacific Ocean, he sailed for there months without any <u>sight</u> of land. Finally, in April of 1521 he landed on the Philippine Islands. Magellan got into a fight with native islanders and was killed there.

Only one ship could continue the <u>voyage</u>. It crossed the Indian Ocean and sailed around the Cape of Good Hope. With only twenty people on board it reached Spain three years after it had set out.
