# RECOMMENDATION

Council by motion approve deferred receipt of residual Fiscal Year 2022/2023 Community Development Block Grant program funds in the amount of approximately \$16,000 for allocation in Fiscal Year 2023/2024.

# **DISCUSSION**

Each year, the County of Fresno estimates the amount of funds apportioned to Kerman by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. Fresno County is the clearinghouse and manager of this program and these funds.

For Fiscal Year (FY) 2022/2023 the amount apportioned to Kerman is approximately \$136,000. This represents a slight decrease from FY 2021/2022 due to a reduction by HUD to Fresno County and its cities. However, approximately \$130,000 of FY 2022/2023 funds has already been borrowed from the program to cover by the cost overruns of Trini's (Stanislaus Park) that was completed last year. The residual amount of \$6,000 combined with an estimated refund to cities of approximately \$10,000 each, resulting from lower than anticipated administrative expenses allowed under the CDBG program, will total approximately \$16,000 available to Kerman for use in FY 2022/2023.

Such a small amount is difficult to program for any project, so when Fresno County cities encounter this, they often loan it to the CDBG Fund Pool for use by others cites and Kerman will receive a subsequent credit or return of these funds in the next program year, FY 2023/2024.

This report requests approval by City Council to defer receipt of these funds as recommended above.

### FISCAL IMPACT

Receipt of an estimated \$16,000 in Program funds will be deferred to the 2023/2024 Program year.

Subject: Resolution Approving Surface Water Supply Agreement Between Fresno Irrigation District

### RECOMMENDATION

Council by motion adopt resolution approving the Surface Water Supply Agreement Between Fresno Irrigation District.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The City is subject to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act, which requires the City to reach groundwater sustainability (a balance of groundwater pumping and groundwater recharge) by the year 2040. In order to meet this requirement, the City needs to acquire a surface water supply to be used for groundwater recharge. The City is located within the boundaries of the Fresno Irrigation District, which has the necessary water rights, water supplies, and distribution system necessary to convey surface water to the City. City Staff have negotiated an Agreement with the Fresno Irrigation District that will provide the City with access to a surface water supply to be used for groundwater recharge in order achieve groundwater sustainability.

# DISCUSSION

In 2014, Governor Jerry Brown signed into law a three-bill legislative package, composed of AB 1739, SB 1168, and SB 1319, collectively known as the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA). SGMA requires governments and water agencies of high and medium priority basins to halt groundwater overdraft and bring groundwater basins into balanced levels of pumping and recharge. Under SGMA, these basins should reach sustainability within 20 years of implementing their sustainability plans. For critically over-drafted basins, like the Kings Basin within which the City of Kerman is located, that date is 2040.

SGMA empowers local agencies to form Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSAs) to manage basins sustainably and requires those GSAs to adopt Groundwater Sustainability Plans (GSPs) for crucial groundwater basins in California. In 2016, the North Kings GSA (NKGSA) was formed as a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) and Kerman elected to join as a member. In the years following the formation of the NKGSA, the NKGSA prepared its required GSP, which details the mitigation measures required to be implemented in order for the NKGSA as a whole, and each member agency, to achieve groundwater

sustainability by 2040. Per the GSP, the City must address an average groundwater deficit (groundwater pumping less groundwater recharge) of 2,150 acre-feet annually to achieve groundwater sustainability. The GSP was adopted in January 2020 ahead of the State deadline.

Since the sole source of water for the City is groundwater, there are limited options for achieving sustainability. These options are:

- 1. Pumping reduction (i.e. reduction in water use); or
- 2. Recharge of the groundwater aguifer with non-groundwater supply (i.e. surface water).

The first option can be achieved through a combination of conservation, growth moratoriums and/or alternate water supply (i.e. surface water treatment and use), but it's highly unlikely that any of those elements can provide sustainability on their own and/or may be undesirable (i.e. growth moratoriums). As such, the most logical and feasible solution for groundwater sustainability at this time is to secure surface water for the purposes of groundwater recharge to offset groundwater pumping.

The City is located within the boundaries of Fresno Irrigation District (FID). FID holds certain water rights and has developed water supplies and a water distribution system that conveys surface water from the Kings and San Joaquin rivers and other water sources to its customers within FID boundaries for surface water irrigation, municipal uses, and groundwater banking (recharge). Even prior to the passage of SGMA, City Staff had been working with FID to develop an agreement for the purchase of surface water to be used for groundwater recharge and possibly landscape irrigation. However, negotiations with FID had never gained enough traction to result in an approved agreement. The passage of SGMA and subsequent adoption of the NKGSP resulted in a renewed, required effort between the City and FID to reach an agreement, as both parties are members of the NKGSA and the GSA as a whole cannot reach sustainability without coordinated efforts between member agencies. The City and FID began negotiations on the terms of an agreement in May 2021 and FID provided an initial draft of the agreement in Novemeber 2021. Over the past several months, both parties have been working to develop a final version of the agreement for approval. Below are the key points of the agreement:

- 1. From surface water supply available to FID, FID will provide the City a surface water supply equivalent to up to 0.5% of FID's net Kings River supply available for surface water customer deliveries in every Kings River Water year during the term of the Agreement. FID's Kings River supply averages approximately 430,000 acre-feet per year, so 0.5% equates to the City's needed 2,150 acre-feet per year to meet their mitigation requirements under the NKGSP. FID's Kings River supply fluctuates with hydrologic conditions, so the actual amount of surface water available to the City each year will also fluctuate with Kings River and other hydrologic conditions and FID's actual surface water supply availability in each given year.
- 2. The surface water supply shall be diverted into the City's existing and planned groundwater recharge basins for purposes of groundwater recharge. The City shall not sell, transfer, deliver, or exchange any of the surface water supply without written consent of FID.
- 3. At no time will the surface water supply delivered to the City by FID be directly treated and used by the City for municipal, industrial, or residential uses. As an exception, if requested by the City, FID would permit the City's pumping of some water directly out of recharge basin(s) for

landscaping/irrigation uses by the City, including the blending of such pumped basin water with treated (purple pipe) water.

- 4. The surface water supply to the City will not be adjusted based on lands annexed into the City over time nor will it be adjusted to reflect any changes in the City or NKGSA's recommended, targeted, or required contribution to groundwater recharge.
- 5. FID will require the City to pay FID's current water service rate annually for 1,075 acres. The 1,075 acres is based on the fact that FID delivers on average 2 acre-feet per acre per year, so the equivalent acreage for 2,150 acre-feet is 1,075 acres. For example, FID's 2022 water service rate is \$52.20 per acre, so the total amount due from the City would be 1,075 x \$52.20=\$56,115.00. As FID's annual water service rate(s) increase, the City's annual surface water payment obligation for the fixed acreage of 1,075 acres will be determined by multiplying this number of acres by the applicable FID water service rate each year to determine the annual payment due to FID. Consistent with other municipal agreements and ratepayers, the total amount will be paid in full each year by the City regardless of the amount of available supply or the amount actually delivered to or used by the City.
- 6. In the event FID makes available for diversion/delivery or offers to deliver all or any portion of the surface water supply volume to the City at times or in amounts that do not suit the convenience of the City, or if the City is otherwise unable or refuses to take all or any portion of the surface water supply offered by FID at the times that FID offers it, FID shall have no obligation to deliver such water on behalf of the City at any future date or time, and the City's obligation to make its annual payment called for hereunder shall not be adjusted based on water actually delivered to or accepted by the City.
- 7. The Agreement will remain in effect until December 31, 2040, and will continue thereafter for additional terms of five (5) years each upon approval by both parties.

A final version of the agreement has been reached by the two parties and is included as Exhibit '1' to the attached resolution for City Council review. Staff recommends approval of the agreement.

# FISCAL IMPACT

As discussed above, the City will purchase the surface water supply from FID on an annual basis. For 2022, this cost is estimated to be \$56,115. The City will need to use Water Operations Reserves to cover the cost for the time being. It is anticipated that this cost will be factored into the City's water utility service rates when the City conducts it's next utility rate study.

Currently, a substantial portion of existing property owners within the City pay an annual assessment to FID on their property tax bill. This has been in place for many years. The justification for this is that due to the fact that the properties are within FID's boundaries, the properties receive a general benefit from FID's water supply deliveries to the general area that constribute to groundwater rechage. It is estimated that these assessments in total are between \$57,000 to \$67,000 annually. Once this Agreement is approved and takes effect, FID will move to no longer collect these assessments. As a result, the net cost incurred by City residents is a more or less a wash (i.e. instead of residents paying an assessment on their tax bill to FID, ultimately they will pay for the City's water supply purchase cost via their water utility bill).

It must be noted that the annual cost to be paid by the City to FID is for purchase of the surface water supply only. This cost does not factor in the cost of purchasing land, excavating recharge basins or constructing connecting pipelines and structures to turn FID canal water into recharge facilities. It is anticipated that these costs will be funded with a combination of Water Operations Reserves, grant funding, and a groundwater management development impact fee to be established for future development to bear the costs associated with their projects. Specific funding for each groundwater recharge project will be identified during planning for that project and budgeted accordingly.

WHEREAS, the North Kings Groundwater Sustainability Agency (NKGSA) is a Joint Powers Authority formed to comply with the requirements of SGMA and the City of Kerman is a member; and

WHEREAS, the NKGSA is responsible for ensuring that the groundwater use within its boundaries is balanced and sustainable. In order to offset the groundwater pumping within the NKGSA, it is necessary for the City to secure access to surface water for groundwater recharge; and

WHEREAS, the City is located within the boundaries of Fresno Irrigation District (FID). FID holds certain water rights and has developed water supplies and a water distribution system that conveys surface water from the Kings and San Joaquin rivers and other water sources to its customers within FID boundaries for surface water irrigation, municipal uses, and groundwater banking (recharge); and

WHEREAS, the City and FID have negotiated a Surface Water Supply Agreement that will provide the City with access to surface water supplies to be used for groundwater recharge in order for the City to achieve groundwater sustainability; and

WHEREAS, City Staff have reviewed the Surface Water Supply Agreement and recommend approval; and

WHEREAS, the City, as the lead agency pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), has reviewed the potential environmental impacts of the execution and implementation of this Agreement in accordance with the requirements of CEQA and, having concluded that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the execution and implementation of this Agreement may have a significant effect on the environment, has determined that this Agreement is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guideline Section 15061(b)(3).

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KERMAN RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are deemed true and correct.
- 2. The Surface Water Supply Agreement Between Fresno Irrigation District and the City of Kerman, attached hereto as Exhibit '1', is approved.
- 3. The City Manager is authorized to execute the Agreement.

4. The Community Development Director is hereby directed to file the Notice of Exemption, in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act, with the Fresno County Clerk.

This AGREEMENT (Agreement) is made by and between Fresno I	rrigation District	, a California
irrigation district ("District" or "FID") as water supplier; and City of K	erman, an incor	porated city in
Fresno County (City), as water user, made and entered into this	day of	, 2022
(Effective Date).		

## **RECITALS**

- A. WHEREAS, the District holds certain water rights and has developed water supplies and a water distribution system that conveys surface water from the Kings and San Joaquin rivers and other water sources to its customers within District boundaries, as depicted and described in **Exhibit A**, attached hereto, and elsewhere for surface water irrigation, municipal uses, and groundwater banking for the benefit of its customers, and other beneficial uses.
- B. WHEREAS, the City is located within the boundaries of the District and the North Kings Groundwater Sustainability Agency (NKGSA) and is the owner of a groundwater pumping and distribution system for the delivery of extracted groundwater to its customers within the City's boundaries and sphere of influence (SOI), as depicted and described in **Exhibit B** attached hereto.
- C. WHEREAS, the District and the City agree that the City shall acquire a contractual right to receive certain surface water(s) (Surface Water Supply) from the District as specifically authorized by, and entered into pursuant to, Chapter 9 [commencing with Section 26670(1.b.)], Part 10, Division 11 of the California Water Code and Section 56133 of the California Government Code, providing for contractual water delivery in lieu of District water deliveries to lands within the City's existing boundaries and existing SOI, as depicted in **Exhibit B**.
- D. WHEREAS, the City and the NKGSA have determined that the City of Kerman must address an average groundwater deficit of 2,150 acre-feet annually to achieve groundwater sustainability.
- . E. WHEREAS, by the terms of this Agreement the City intends to address its groundwater sustainability obligations by banking and recovering the Surface Water Supply for subsequent delivery and use on lands within the City's *existing* boundaries and *existing* SOI, as depicted in **Exhibit B**.
- F. WHEREAS, the City, as the lead agency pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), has reviewed the potential environmental impacts of the execution and implementation of this Agreement in accordance with the requirements of CEQA and, having concluded that it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the execution and implementation of this Agreement may have a significant effect on the environment, has determined that this Agreement is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guideline Section 15061(b)(3).

G.	WHEREAS, the District accepted the Agency's CEQA exemption determination	or

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions herein contained and for good and adequate consideration, the District and the City (each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties") agree as follows:

# **AGREEMENT**

- Recitals. The Recitals stated above are true and a substantive part of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Term; Termination; Early Termination</u>. This Agreement is effective as of the Effective Date listed above and will remain in effect until December 31, 2040, and will continue thereafter for additional terms of five (5) years each upon approval by the Parties of an amendment extending the Agreement . When this Agreement becomes effective, it will replace and/or supersede any and all other water supply, water recharge, water conveyance, surface water conveyance, or similar agreement(s), if any, between the Parties. This Agreement may be terminated by either Party by giving written notice at least ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of the original term or any five (5)-year additional term.

# Purchases of Water from the District by the City for Groundwater Banking, Management, and Extraction

a. <u>Surface Water Supply to be delivered by the District to the City</u>. The District will make available to the City the Surface Water Supply, to consist of a multi-year average of 2,150 acre-feet annually. The Surface Water Supply to the City will not be adjusted based on lands annexed into the City over time nor will it be adjusted to reflect any changes in the City or NKGSA's recommended, targeted, or required contribution to groundwater recharge. The Surface Water Supply shall be used on lands within the City's boundaries and SOI as existing at the time this Agreement is executed by the Parties, as depicted in **Exhibit B**.

## Surface Water Supply cost and payment timing.

i. The annual City Surface Water purchase amount payable to the District is computed by multiplying the District's then-established water service assessment rate for that year times 1,075. For example, if the District's water service assessment rate is \$52.20 in 2022, the City's cost for water that year would be \$52.20 x 1,075 = \$56,115.00. Amounts payable to the District pursuant to this Agreement shall be paid by the City at 60% of the total amount due on or before the 20th day of December preceding the Water Year for which such amounts are due, and the remaining 40% shall be paid on or before the 20th day of June during the current Water Year. Consistent with other municipal agreements with neighboring cities, the total annual

payment is due and payable to the District each year by the City regardless of the amount of surface water delivered to or used by the City that year. The 1,075 multiplier used herein is not subject to variation or adjustment based on the annual volume(s) of water made available by the District to the City, but is a fixed constant.

- ii. If any payment by the City to the District under this Agreement is not made in full within thirty (30) days of its due date, or if the City is otherwise in breach of any term, agreement, act, or condition to be performed by the City hereunder, then the District may suspend all or any of the rights, deliveries, and permissions given to the City hereunder until such payment is made or breach is corrected by the City, including the withholding of Surface Water Supplies. Should the District be in breach in the performance of any term, agreement, act, or condition to be done or performed by the District, the City may suspend all or any of its rights, duties, or obligations hereunder until such breach by the District is corrected.
- c. Alternative pricing if change in District fee/assessment structure. If in the future the District changes the fees/assessments it charges for irrigation water deliveries to its customers, the payments for the Surface Water Supply will accord with the District's new fee/assessment rate structure. If the District adopts a volumetric fee structure, the annual payments due will correspond to the District's volumetric rate multiplied by the amount of acre-feet offered for delivery by the District, plus any other additional fees/assessments.

### d. Use of Surface Water Supply delivered to the City by the District

- i. The Surface Water Supply shall be diverted into the City's groundwater basins for purposes of groundwater banking and recovery. The City shall not sell, transfer, deliver, or exchange any of the Surface Water Supply without written consent of the District first had and obtained. Should the City fail to use the Surface Water Supply for groundwater banking and subsequent use on lands within the City's *existing* boundaries and *existing* SOI, as depicted in **Exhibit B**, or fail to comply with directives from the NKGSA regarding pumping rates and volumes, or maintenance of certain groundwater levels, the District in its sole and absolute discretion reserves the right to terminate the Agreement, by the written notice procedure described in Section 2 of this Agreement.
- ii. At no time will the Surface Water Supply delivered to the City by the District be directly treated and used by the City for municipal, industrial, or residential uses (i.e. the Surface Water Supply must be banked and recovered prior to use). As an exception, if requested of the District by the City, the District would permit the City's pumping of some water directly out of recharge basin(s) for landscaping/irrigation uses by the City, including the blending of such pumped basin water with treated (purple pipe) water, if any, for exclusive use within **Exhibit B** lands.

#### e. Water Delivery

- i. The District shall use reasonable efforts to find and make available for delivery to the City the total volume of the Surface Water Supply. The District shall deliver water to the City at the points shown on **Exhibit B**, and any additional points upon mutual agreement. Water shall be delivered at such times and in amounts that are convenient for the District in its sole discretion. This may include, but is not limited to, during the District's scheduled irrigation water run or during flooding events.
- ii. In the event the District determines, in its sole discretion, that delivery of all or any portion of the Surface Water Supply in any given year will interfere with District operations, obligations, or for reasons beyond District control would result in harm to the District or its facilities, the District shall have no obligation to deliver such water to the City during that particular year or portion(s) thereof. Regardless, the City shall pay the annual cost for such water in accordance with the provisions hereof.
- iii. In the event the District makes available for diversion/delivery or offers to deliver all or any portion of the Surface Water Supply volume to the City at times or in amounts that do not suit the convenience of the City, or if the City is otherwise unable or refuses to take all or any portion of the Surface Water Supply offered by the District at the times that the District offers it, the District shall have no obligation to deliver such water on behalf of the City at any future date or time, and the City's obligation to make its annual payment called for hereunder shall not be adjusted based on water actually delivered to or accepted by the City. Surface Water Supply that is rejected by the City and not diverted into City basins will neither be included in the reports of Annual target volumes diverted into City basins for recharge nor inure to the credit of the City for its volumetric recharge mandate mutually agreed to by the NKGSA/City as the target recharge volume to achieve groundwater balance and sustainability for the City, even though it will be fully paid for by the City.
- iv. The City shall bear all conveyance losses, if any, incurred in the District water system downstream of the applicable point of delivery; provided, that no such losses shall be assessed against the City when the District is simultaneously delivering water to its landowners or water users via the portions of the District water system used to convey the Surface Water Supply, if any, to the points on the District water system where the City will assume physical control of the delivered water.
- f. Water Source and Quality. The District may use any source of surface water, including surface water that was banked and recovered from the ground, for delivery of the Surface Water Supply. The City acknowledges that the Surface Water Supply will be "raw," non-potable and untreated. The District is under no obligation to deliver a Surface Water Supply of a particular water quality, and the City may not refuse to pay for the Surface Water Supply or otherwise avoid the terms of this Agreement based on water quality issues associated with the Surface Water Supply.

## 4. Water Measurement & Basin Capacities.

- a. <u>Annual Groundwater Extraction Measured</u>. The City will maintain well-calibrated meters to measure its groundwater extraction from wells located within the Kings Basin, and report the instantaneous flow and volume of water extracted by those wells to the NKGSA and the District.
- b. Measurement of Deliveries and Basin Capacity. City's initial recharge basin(s) are set forth in **Exhibit C**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. At its expense, the City shall provide, install, and grant the District access to and maintain a flow meter or meters in accordance with District requirements for measurement and reporting of all surface water deliveries by the District to the City and/or its basins. Additionally, the City shall be responsible for maintaining adequately sized recharge facilities that are connected to District facilities/canals and capable of receiving surface water deliveries from the District at times when and in volumes made available by the District. The City's unwillingness to increase basin capacities, location(s) or percolation rates to enable seasonal deliveries of surface waters for recharge when available in order to achieve a multi-year cumulative average of recharged water approximating 2,150 acre-feet annually would constitute a breach under this Agreement.

# 5. Indemnities; Hold Harmless

- General Indemnities by the City. The City shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, be solely responsible for any and all claims by or damage or injury to persons or property that, without sole negligence or willful misconduct on the part of the District, result directly or indirectly from the discharge of any water by the City or its member agencies into District Facilities; the groundwater recharge and recovery of water by the City; or, the acts or omissions of the City, or its member agencies, or any of their officials, officers, employees, contractors, consultants, agents, invitees, or authorized volunteers in performing or carrying out the obligations or rights of the City hereunder. The City shall indemnify, defend and hold the District, and its elected officials, officers, employees, contractors, consultants, agents, invitees, or authorized volunteers (collectively the "Indemnified Parties"), free of and harmless from any fine, civil penalty, loss, cost, damage, or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, that may be caused to or incurred by them because of any injury or damage to persons or property arising from the negligence or fault of the City, or its member agencies, or any of their elected officials, officers, employees, contractors, consultants, agents, invitees, or authorized volunteers in connection with: the discharge of any water by the City, or its member agencies, into the District Facilities; the recharge or recovery of water into recharge project facilities/basins; any failure or refusal to observe or perform any term, covenant or condition in this Agreement to be observed or performed on the City's part or those acts or omissions. This indemnification agreement shall not be restricted to any insurance proceeds available to the City and shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- b. <u>The City's Defense of the District</u>. If any action or proceeding is brought against any Indemnified Party in connection with any claim, then the District will use good-faith

efforts to send prompt written notice to the City. At the time the City receives such written notice, the City shall, at the City's sole cost and expense, resist and defend such action or proceeding with legal counsel reasonably acceptable to the District. The City may not admit any liability or enter into any compromise or settlement agreement on any Indemnified Party's behalf without the District's prior written consent, which the District shall not unreasonably withhold, condition, or delay. The District's legal counsel will be permitted to cooperate with the City and its legal counsel and to participate in any action or proceeding brought against any Indemnified Party in connection with any claim.

- c. <u>District's Indemnification Obligations</u>. The District shall indemnify, and hold the City, and its elected officials, officers, employees, contractors, consultants, agents, invitees, or authorized volunteers free of and harmless from any fine, civil penalty, loss, cost, damage, or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, that may be caused to or incurred by them because of any injury or damage to persons or property arising from the negligence or fault of the District, or any of its elected officials, officers, employees, contractors, consultants, agents, invitees, or authorized volunteers in connection with any failure or refusal to observe or perform any term, covenant or condition in this Agreement to be observed or performed on the District's part or those acts or omissions.
- 6. <u>Notices</u>. All notices required or permitted by this Agreement or applicable law shall be in writing and may be delivered in person (by hand or by overnight courier) or may be sent by regular mail or certified or registered mail or U.S. Postal Service Express Mail, with postage prepaid, or by facsimile transmission, and shall be deemed sufficiently given if served in a manner specified in this Section 6. The addresses noted below shall be that Party's address for delivery or mailing of notices.

Either Party may by written notice to the other specify a different address for notice.

7. Amendment to Agreement. No modification of, deletion from, or addition to this Agreement shall be effective unless made in writing and executed by both the City and the District.

- 8. **Further Actions**. Both Parties shall cooperate and take such further action as may be necessary or convenient to the performance of this Agreement.
- 9. Relationship of Agreement to Other Obligations. This Agreement shall be at all times subject to all of the terms and conditions of the following contractual agreements, and regulatory/operational oversight of Pine Flat Dam. Collectively, these are referred to as the "Senior Commitments," and in no event shall the District be required to deliver water or take any other action in contravention of the Senior Commitments. To the extent that any provision contained in this Agreement is inconsistent with any term or condition of the Senior Commitments, that contrary provision of this Agreement shall be subordinate to the Senior Commitments or, if subordination does not resolve such inconsistency, such contrary provision shall be unenforceable.

The Senior Commitments include:

- (a) Kings River Water Association Agreements aka "Blue Book," and any court or administrative rulings affecting the water rights of the member agencies in the Kings River Water Association (KRWA);
- (b) Contract dated December 22, 2010 between District and the United States of America identified as Contract No. 14-06-200-1122D ("District's Bureau Contract") pursuant to which District is entitled to purchase certain water from the United States; and
- (c) The operation of Pine Flat Dam by the U.S. Corps of Army Engineers, the operation and oversight of the State of California and the U.S. Government affecting State and Central Valley Project waters, dams, licenses, canals, and other societal interests, including but not limited to the Bureau of Reclamation, federal and state fish and game agencies, the State Water Resources Control Board, etc.

# 10. No Water Rights Created.

The City acknowledges herein that it has no historic or current rights to any Central Valley Project or Kings River Supply under this Agreement other than those contractual rights provided for herein, which are neither water rights nor water entitlements. Nothing in this Agreement authorizes or shall be construed or deemed to constitute the sale or transfer of a water right from either Party to the other, and nothing in this Agreement shall constitute the dedication by either Party of water or water storage to a public use. No right in or to any water, storage, or other water right owned by the District or the City shall be acquired or lost by virtue of this Agreement or the actions contemplated hereby. At no time shall the City make any claim, assert any right, or otherwise seek, confirm, or perfect in any forum any legal or beneficial interest, right, or title to any of District's water supply or storage rights. The City will not acquire any permanent right to the delivery or diversion of any water made available by the District pursuant to this Agreement.

Nothing in this Agreement is intended to or will be construed to act as a forfeiture, diminution, or impairment of any water right of the District.

11. Protection and Acknowledgement of District Facilities. The City shall not permit the development of any parcel of land or the use of any easements (including a public utility easements) affecting land within its boundaries, if any, on which any portion of the District Water System is located until and unless the landowner and/or the developer enters into written agreements acceptable to the District for the acknowledgment, restatement, granting, or clarification of use and access to, operation of, repair, rehabilitation, relocation, replacement, reconfiguration, or pipelining of the District Water System facilities on the parcel, and on any adjacent parcels, all as the District determines is necessary or appropriate in order to: (i) avoid disruption of District operations or maintenance activities as a result of the development; (ii) make District facilities suitable for operation within a developed area, establish and acknowledge the District's historic and future rights to operate, access, upgrade, and maintain such facilities; or (iii) address public safety concerns as determined by the District.

## Dispute Resolution.

- a. District and City staff shall exercise every effort to resolve disputes through the development of a consensus.
- b. To the extent District and City staff cannot promptly resolve an issue in dispute; the parties shall promptly convene a meeting of senior Party representatives to attempt to resolve the dispute. Either Party may request a dispute resolution meeting pursuant to this section by providing written notice to the other Party, including a summary of the issue in dispute. District representatives shall be its Board chair or president and another Board member. City representatives shall be the Mayor and City Council President. These senior Party representatives shall make every reasonable effort to meet as frequently and as promptly as possible to negotiate the terms and conditions of a resolution. If these Party representatives are unable to resolve the dispute through this informal process within a reasonable period, either Party may pursue any remedy it may have under law or equity. Nothing in this paragraph will be construed to create any right to arbitration.
- c. The dispute resolution process described above shall be limited to material disputes hereunder as determined by the Parties.
- d. In cases where a dispute arises between the Parties that, if unresolved, may result in imminent danger to the public health, safety, or welfare, the Parties shall not be subject to the provisions of this section.
- 14. <u>Defense of Agreement</u>. In the event of litigation challenging compliance with CEQA or any other aspect of this Agreement, the Parties shall cooperate to provide a joint defense of the litigation. Each Party shall bear its own costs of such litigation, including attorneys' fees and expert witness fees incurred in defending against any litigation challenging this Agreement on any

grounds. However, if any CEQA challenge arises out of the determinations and conclusions by the City that there is no possibility that the execution and implementation of this Agreement may have a significant effect on the environment, where the City has determined that this Agreement is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guideline Section 15061(b)(3); or, that the City has reviewed the potential environmental impacts of the execution and implementation of this Agreement and determines that the requirements of CEQA have been met, then the City, as the lead agency for CEQA purposes, shall coordinate and oversee the joint defense and shall pay the attorneys' fees and expert witness fees singularly without contribution from the District.

- 15. Approvals. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, compliance with all legal/regulatory requirements and governmental or other third-party restrictions on the use or delivery of the City's surface water to the City's water users shall be the responsibility of the City. The District shall be excused from delivering any water supply under this Agreement if, by so doing, the District would become subject to additional legal requirements or third-party restrictions imposed on deliveries of water to the City's water users.
- 16. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, and each of the exhibits referred to herein, constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties pertaining to the settlement of disputes and obligations between them. This Agreement supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations, and/or obligations concerning those obligations which are merged into this Agreement. Each Party has made its own independent investigation of the matters settled and is not relying upon any representation not specified herein.
- 17. Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be construed under and shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Any action to interpret or enforce any aspect of this Agreement shall be brought in the California Superior Court of Fresno County, California. The City and the District hereby expressly waive any right to remove any action to a county other than Fresno County as permitted pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Section 394.
- 18. Construction of Agreement. This Agreement is the product of a deliberative process involving the Parties and their legal counsel, including engaging in the give-and-take process of negotiation and preparation by and among each Party hereto and its attorneys, and the Parties agree that this Agreement shall not be deemed to have been prepared or drafted by any one Party. Accordingly, the normal rule of construction to the effect that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall not be employed in the interpretation of this Agreement.
- 19. **Counterparts**. This Agreement may be signed in any number of counterparts by the Parties, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, and all of which together shall be deemed one and the same instrument. Facsimile or other electronic signatures shall be binding.
- 20. **Binding Effect**. This Agreement shall be of binding legal effect only when it has been executed by all the Parties. No rights or duties under this Agreement may be assigned or delegated by a Party without the express written consent of the other Party, which may be withheld

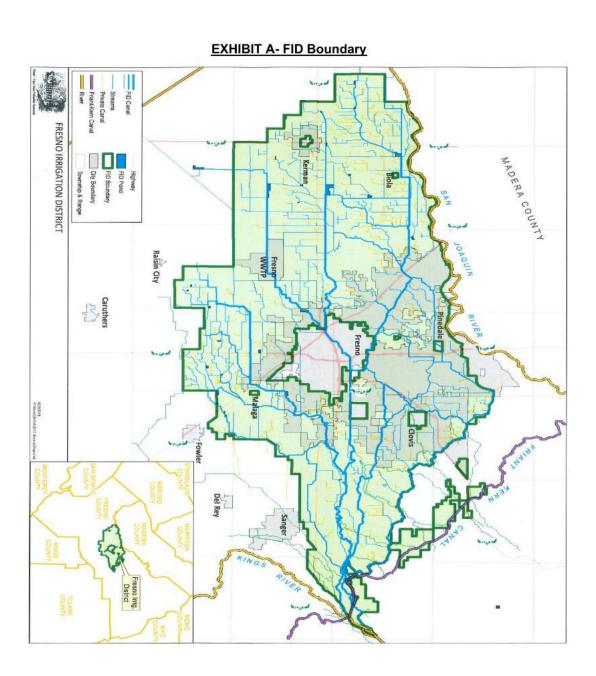
in the sole and absolute discretion of such other Party. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of the Parties.

- 21. <u>Attorneys' Fees.</u> In the event of any action between the Parties seeking enforcement or interpretation of any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the prevailing Party in such action shall be awarded, in addition to damages, injunctive or other relief, its reasonable costs and expenses, including, but not limited to, taxable costs and reasonable attorneys' and experts' fees.
- 22. <u>Severability</u>. Subject to the Parties' rights under of this Agreement, if any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such provision shall be automatically reformed to be valid, legal, and enforceable to the maximum extent permitted and the balance of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect notwithstanding such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability.
- 23. No Third-Party Beneficiaries. This Agreement does not create and shall not be construed to create any rights enforceable by any person, partnership, corporation, joint venture, limited liability company, district, or other form of organization or association of any kind that is not a party. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, landowners, residents, water users and ratepayers of the Parties are not intended to be third-party beneficiaries of this Agreement. The District has no fiduciary duty to the City because of this or any other Agreement between the Parties.
- 24. **Force Majeure**. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, neither Party shall be liable for any failure to perform resulting from any cause outside the reasonable control of that Party. For purposes of this Agreement, routine and emergency repairs and maintenance of the District Water System shall be deemed causes outside of the reasonable control of the District (including without limitation the annual shut down of certain canals for maintenance), provided that the District shall use reasonable efforts to schedule routine maintenance to avoid interference with deliveries of the City's surface water.
- 25. <u>Authority</u>. Each of the signatories hereto warrant and represent that he or she is competent and authorized to enter into this agreement on behalf of the Party for whom he or she purports to represent.

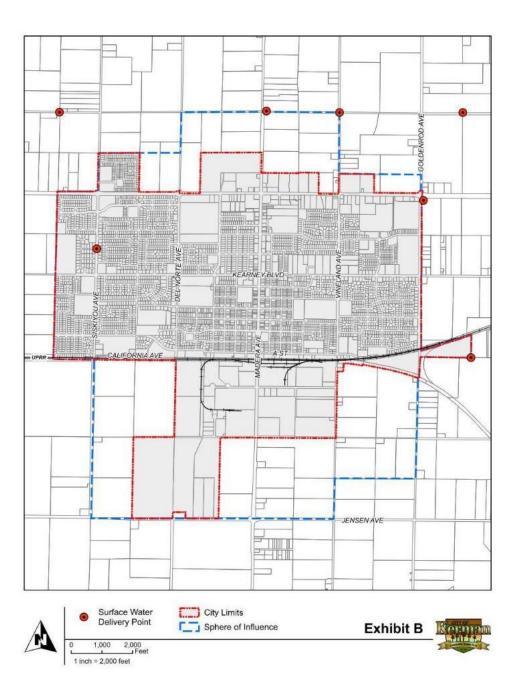

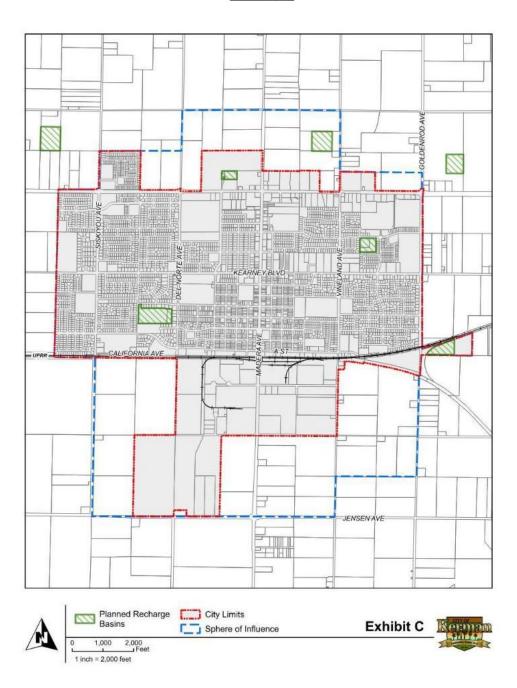
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# **EXHIBIT B - City Boundaries and Sphere of Influence**
