

MISSION

The mission of the AKC Canine Health Foundation is to develop significant resources for basic and applied health programs with emphasis on canine genetics to improve the quality of life for dogs and their owners.

GOALS

The AKC Canine Health Foundation will achieve the following goals:

- To help dogs live longer, healthier lives.
- To respect the dedication and interest of dog clubs, breeders and owners in health and continuously seek ways to involve them in the work of the Foundation.
- To identify health issues of concern to dog breeders and owners.
- To identify and sponsor research and education programs, with particular emphasis on canine genetics, that:
 - Meet the highest scientific and educational standards. Have the greatest potential for advancing the health of dogs.
 - Have expectations for producing materials and applications that are reasonable and affordable for breeders and owners.





- To seek ways to integrate the observations and knowledge of dog owners, breeders and veterinarians and other scientists for the purpose of advancing the health of dogs.
- To responsibly monitor grantees and make the results of their work available for public use through publication in scientific journals, and through sharing and dissemination of information and education with dog owners, breeders and veterinarians.
- To raise endowment funds for the Foundation's programmatic purposes, and to invest these funds for both growth of principal and income adequate to advance the Foundation's purpose.

DOG CLUBS: VITAL LINKS IN ADVANCING CANINE HEALTH



In laboratories across the world, scientists funded by the AKC Canine Health Foundation are unlocking the secrets of canine genetics and probing new treatments for innumerable canine diseases.

Partnering with the scientists and the Foundation in key scientific and fund-raising roles are the dog clubs, who play critical - and often unheralded - roles in working to conquer canine diseases.

High on the list are the National Parent Clubs who play an integral role in determining which canine research projects are needed - through the Parent Club survey in which dog clubs throughout the country identify their health interests and research priorities. The Foundation uses the results in requesting proposals for funding and, later, these surveys help in determining which breed specific proposals to fund. Help from clubs doesn't end there.

Every two years breed clubs come together with Foundation members and scientists to review the latest developments in scientific research at a National Parent Club Canine Health Conference. Information is passed on to their member clubs and in turn,

to individual members to use in breeding or treating their dogs.

Dog clubs of all types help scientists collect samples and pedigrees and use tests, such as those already developed for cystinuria, congenital stationary night blindness, von Willebrand's disease and X-linked progressive retinal atrophy. This is the first step in eventually eradicating these diseases. Increasingly, clubs are adding a health focus to their web sites as well.

Finally, dog clubs go all-out to support the work of the Foundation - becoming Founder Clubs, creating their own Donor Advised Funds to address key diseases affecting their breeds, sponsoring research, contributing generously and hosting fund-raising events.

With the all-out support these clubs provide, our dogs will be assured of a healthy future.



Mapping the Canine Genome Genetic Research

Clubs support the work of scientists and the AKC Canine Health Foundation in completing the canine genome map — a monumental step toward eventually eradicating inherited diseases — and in the genetic research that is already producing remarkable results with the discovery of the genetic defects causing cystinuria, congenital stationary night blindness and von Willebrand's disease in several breeds.

Cancer

The #1 disease killer of dogs was also the #1 priority of dog clubs for funding in 2000. In addition to AKC Canine Health Foundation funds, six different club sponsored AKC/CHF grants address distinct aspects of this disease in different breeds, some of them with implications for human cancers.

Epilepsy

Epilepsy, one of the most common canine nervous system disorders, can be physically devastating to dogs and emotionally wrenching for their owners. Dog clubs representing thirty-eight different breeds named canine epilepsy as one of their top health concerns. Currently, ten clubs sponsor six grants addressing this disease.

Heart, Kidney and Liver Diseases

Following on the heels of the discovery of the genetic defect that causes cystinuria, Newfoundland clubs are encouraging use of the new cystinuria test. Other clubs are funding grants they hope will have similar results for their breeds. Four club sponsored grants study heart disease — another high priority for dog club funding. Two grants are for kidney disease research and three are for liver disease.

Orthopedic and Bone Diseases: Hip Dysplasia, Elbow Dysplasia, Craniomandibular Osteopathy, Forelimb Anomaly

Canine hip dysplasia is one of the top genetic health problems in dogs and a priority focus for funding, since it occurs in over 100 breeds. Many of the larger dog breeds often suffer from elbow dysplasia. Club sponsored grants are helping study both these diseases as well as craniomandibular osteopathy and forelimb anomaly in specific breeds.

Thyroid Disease

Thyroid Disease was number four on the dog club 2000 priority list for funding, underlining its prevalence among purebred dogs of all breeds. In 2000, one grant assessed ultrasonic and cytologic evaluation of the thyroid gland in Golden Retrievers, which have an increased risk for the disease.

Other Diseases and Health Issues: Autoimmune, Muscular, Neurological, Skin Diseases; Addison's Disease, Behavior Disorders, Pancreatic Insufficiency, Urinary Stones, Vaccine Immunity



A number of other diseases are funded by the AKC Canine Health Foundation with the support of dog clubs who sponsor grants and contribute to the overall work of the Foundation. 

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends: Six years ago the American Kennel Club had a vision of creating an organization that would provide a focus for canine health development, research and education.

The AKC had been supporting various canine health research programs for many years. However, they saw a need for an organization that would create

more resources and bring a new level of organization to canine health issues. AKC donated \$1 million to establish an endowment for the new organization and has made an annual contribution of that sum every year since.

One of their significant charges to the new AKC Canine Health Foundation was to advance the knowledge of canine genetics and genetic diseases. With the now fourth generation of the canine genetic map and the development of ten new tests for genetic diseases, we have entered a new era in canine health. Other benefits have been the increased activity regarding canine health among dog clubs and individuals, as well as much more widespread understanding of the issues in canine health.

It has been a great privilege to oversee the growth and development of a Foundation that has made such an impact on the community of dogs. All AKC Parent Clubs have health representatives that serve as liaisons to the Foundation. There are 90 donor advised funds established by individuals and clubs, and a very significant increase in the number of clubs participating in health surveys. The

Foundation currently supports health research studies in the leading health concerns in dogs such as cancer, epilepsy, heart disease, thyroid disease, hip dysplasia, progressive retinal atrophy and cataracts. Foundation donations have risen from \$150,000 the first year to over \$1 million in 2000, and we have a sense that we are entering a new era of promise in terms of the health of our dogs.

Growth in canine health research studies, education programs and support has been a hallmark of the Foundation from its earliest days. I challenge you to help us continue our vision by sharing the mission of the Foundation with your club and your friends in dogs. I thank you sincerely for your support of our mission over the past five years. I know that, if we all do our part, we can continue to make a difference in the lives of our dogs and in their future.

We want to express our thanks to the AKC Canine Health Foundation for the leadership it takes in helping all of us enjoy healthier dogs.



organization as



a "club of clubs."

From 1995 through 2000, The American Kennel Club has contributed \$5.3 million to the canine health research and education programs of the AKC Canine Health Foundation. This figure also includes their generous support of the Foundation's administrative costs.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR 2000 SEARCHING FOR ANSWERS

Grants. This year the AKC Canine Health Foundation (CHF) awarded 21 grants totaling over \$1 million to eleven veterinary schools. This brings the total number of grants awarded in the five year history of CHF to 100. Over \$5 million has been raised for research since 1995.

For the coming year, the Foundation received the largest number of proposals ever — 113 requests for \$8.4 million in grants.

Bloat Study Completed.

A landmark AKC/CHF funded study on bloat, conducted by Dr.

Larry Glickman of Purdue University, was completed this past year. Over 1900 dogs were enrolled in the study, including these breeds — Great Dane, Irish Setter, Saint Bernard, Standard Poodle, Akita, Collie, Irish Wolfhound, Newfoundland, Rottweiler and Weimaraner. The volume of data will take several years to fully analyze and is expected to prove valuable to veterinarians and pet owners.

Gene Discovered. While working on a Foundation funded grant, scientists at the University of Michigan discovered the gene that causes canine von Willebrand's Disease in Bernese Mountain Dogs — a breakthrough in this disease.

Gene Tool Developed. During a CHF funded study on craniomandibular osteopathy at Michigan State University College of Veterinary Medicine, a new way of quickly making SNP markers was developed, opening the door to automating a great deal of the marker work needed to find disease genes.

DR. C. RICHARD DORN SCIENCE OFFICER, AKC CANINE HEALTH FOUNDATION PROFESSOR EMERITUS, THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE

Since April, 1996, Dr. Dorn has provided invaluable service to the AKC Canine Health Foundation — coordinating the peer review of grants, evaluating grant progress and representing the Foundation at veterinary conferences and scientific meetings. Dr. Dorn has been awarded a Fulbright Scholarship, the Fogarty Senior International Fellowship in London, England, and has been a consultant to the U. S. Food and Drug Administration and the National Institutes of Health. New PRA Test. A new test is available for X-linked progressive retinal atrophy in Siberian Huskies and Samoyeds, adding to the PRA test for Irish Setters, a breed that is now free of the disease.

International Mappers Meeting. Leading genetic

researchers at universities throughout the United States, Great Britain, France and Norway convened for an International Canine Mappers Meeting, held March 8-9 in Seattle and sponsored by the AKC Canine Health Foundation and the Ralston Purina Company.

Veterinary School Seminars. A program was presented by the AKC and the AKC Canine Health Foundation to veterinary students at The Ohio State University and the University of California, Davis. The program, with presentations by Dr. Anita Oberbauer and Dr. Kathryn Meurs, AKC/CHF sponsored researchers, is a pilot for a more extensive program on canine health research, genetics and purebred dogs that will be presented jointly by AKC and AKC/CHF.

Lifetime Giving Wall. In recognition of its support for cancer research, the AKC Canine Health Foundation has been recognized with a plaque on the Lifetime Giving Wall in the state-of-the-art Thomas Building of the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle.

SUPPORTING CANINE HEALTH AND RESEARCH \$1 Million Plus. Contributions from individuals, clubs and corporations increased 41%, topping the \$1 million mark for the first time. A great achievement for canine health.

More Donor Advised Funds.


Contributions to Donor Advised Funds more than doubled, reaching \$396,465 in 2000. There are now 90 of these funds, an increase of 35 percent over 1999.

IKC Show & Ralston Purina Charity Ball. This year over \$87,000 was raised for the Foundation, thanks to the International Kennel Club Cluster of Dog Shows and the Ralston Purina Charity Ball. Two checks were awarded at the Ball on Saturday evening, from matching funds for entries, Ball ticket sales, and donations for Purina pet food samples and treats, part of a year long Ralston Purina initiative to raise funds for canine health.

Ten new genetic tests have been developed: Cystinuria in Newfoundlands (Dr. Paula Henthorn, University of Pennsylvania); Progressive Retinal Atrophy in Miniature Schnauzers (Dr. Gustavo Aguirre, Cornell University); Congenital Stationary Nightblindness in Briards (Dr. Gustavo Aguirre, Cornell University); von Willebrand's Disease in Poodles, Welsh Corgis, Manchester Terriers, and Bernese Mountain Dogs (Dr. George Brewer, University of Michigan); Narcolepsy in Doberman Pinschers (Dr. Emmanuel Mignot, Stanford University); and X-Linked Progressive Retinal Atrophy in Siberian Huskies and Samoyeds (researchers at the James A. Baker Institute and Cornell University).

SUPPORTED RESEARCH

The Foundation has funded over 100 research studies at 26 veterinary schools and research institutions on canine diseases such as cancer, heart disease, epilepsy, autoimmune disease, bloat, eye disease, hypothyroidism, skin disease and hip dysplasia. 2000 FUNCTIONAL EXPENSES








NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2000 and 1999

NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The American Kennel Club Canine Health Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation"), established February 21, 1995, is a not-for-profit organization (exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code) formed for the purpose of furthering the advancement of knowledge of canine diseases and health care by clinical study, laboratory research and publication.

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Foundation have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

ESTIMATES

In preparing financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles, management makes estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, as well as the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Foundation places its cash and cash equivalents with high-credit quality institutions. At times these balances may be in excess of the FDIC insurance limit. Cash and investments in money market funds and shares of registered investment companies are uninsured.

CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

The Foundation considers demand deposits and all highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less when purchased as cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the Statements of Cash Flows.

INVESTMENTS

Investments in mutual funds, commercial paper, and marketable equity securities, and U.S. government obligations are stated at fair market value with both realized and unrealized gains and losses recognized in the Statements of Activities and Changes in Net Assets.

CONTRIBUTIONS

The Foundation recognizes contributions received, including all unconditional promises to give, as revenues in the period received at their fair values. Contributions receivable reflected on the Statements of Financial Position are expected to be received within one year. The Foundation considers contributions receivable to be fully collectible; accordingly, no allowance for doubtful accounts is required.

FURNITURE, FIXTURES AND EQUIPMENT

Furniture, fixtures and equipment are carried at cost, less accumulated depreciation computed on the straight-line method. Depreciation is based upon the estimated useful lives of the assets. Depreciation charged to expense was \$16,148 and \$15,102 in 2000 and 1999, respectively.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER ANNUITY TRUST

The Foundation is a beneficiary under a charitable remainder annuity trust agreement under which the donor is entitled to annuity payments for the remainder of his life. Upon the donor's death, the assets in the trust will revert to the Foundation. The Foundation has reflected a receivable in the amount of \$69,549 and \$66,799 at December 31, 2000 and 1999, respectively, in its Statements of Financial Position, representing the present value of the future benefits to be received by the Foundation.

CONTRIBUTED PROPERTY HELD FOR RESALE

Contributed property held for resale is recorded at its fair value at the date of contribution.

MAILING LISTS

Mailing lists, representing in-kind contributions to the Foundation, are recorded at their fair value at the date of contribution. Amortization is being calculated on the straight-line method over three years. Amortization charged to expense was \$13,977 and \$3,996 in 2000 and 1999, respectively.

GRANTS

Unconditional single or multi-year grants are considered incurred and charged to expense at the time of approval by the Board of Directors. Any grant cancellations approved by the Board of Directors are recognized at the time of approval.

NET ASSETS

Unrestricted net assets include contributions and investment income that will be used to fund canine research and educational programs designated by the Board of Directors. Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose. Permanently restricted net assets have been restricted by donors to be maintained by the Foundation in perpetuity. Investment income from permanently restricted net assets is unrestricted.

ADVERTISING COSTS

The cost of advertising is expensed as incurred.

MEMBERSHIP EXPENSES

All costs related to acquiring new members are expensed as incurred.

FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES

The costs of providing the various programs and activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the Statements of Activities and the Statements of Functional Expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefitted.

RECLASSIFICATIONS

Certain prior year amounts have been reclassified to conform to the current year classifications.

NOTE 2 INVESTMENTS

Investments in mutual funds, commercial paper, marketable equity securities and U.S. government obligations with readily determinable fair values are reported at their fair values in the Statements of Financial Position.

The Foundation leases office space under an operating lease agreement which expires in May 2004. The Foundation also leases certain office equipment under an operating lease agreement which expires in September 2004. Rent expense under these operating leases totaled \$38,645 in 2000 and \$29,689 in 1999.

NOTE 7 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The American Kennel Club, Inc. ("the Club") contributed funds to be used for canine research, educational programs and administrative support totaling \$1,008,000 and \$1,064,900 for 2000 and 1999, respectively. Contributions totaled \$500,000 for both 2000 and 1999, while administrative support provided was \$508,000 in 2000 and \$564,900 in 1999. The Club also contributed \$50,000 for the National Parent Club Conference in 1999. The Foundation's employees are covered under the Club's medical and pension plans as a related organization. The defined benefit pension plan, administered by the Club, is currently overfunded and therefore no pension expense is recorded in the accompanying Statements of Activities.
