Veek 3 in Term 4 reaching/Learning Focus

Each week in the newsletter, we will give families a summary of the **Teaching/Learning Focus** for the week. That can help families by: being aware of what classrooms are covering; with discussion topics at the dinner table when discussing school (eg. 'How are you going with addition in Numeracy this week?'); helping their children study at home, etc. Parents have indicated that this information would be very useful. We also ask families to be aware that schools are very busy places and events can be unpredictable at times. We therefore must remain flexible. That means, we can plan to cover certain topics at particular times and have to change them according to arising needs.

Junior School – Preps/Foundation Rooms 3 & 6

<u>Literacy</u>: We are continuing to develop our writing skills with a focus on sounding out and using the golden and red words in our writing and learning about the vowel sounds o and u. We are practising Kung Fu punctuation and talking about WOW words.

Numeracy: We are continuing to learn about subtraction as well as measurement and location words. We are using Mathletics as a tool to support our learning.

Junior School - Year 1s Rooms 3, 8 & 9

Literacy: We are focusing on verbs and continuing punctuation skills (Kung Fu punctuation). We are looking at the difference between facts and opinions.

Numeracy: We are looking at doubles and near doubles as well as counting patterns. We are using Mathletics as a tool to support our learning.

Junior School - Year 2s Rooms 8 & 9

Literacy: We are looking at the difference between facts and opinions and learning about contractions and

Numeracy: We are learning about addition and subtraction with one and two digit numbers and ordering and sequencing numbers. We are looking at doubles and near doubles and using Mathletics as a tool to support our learning.

Middle School – Years 3/4 **Rooms 10 & 11**

<u>Literacy:</u> During writing sessions over the next few weeks, we will work on Poetry. We will continue to focus on commas with compound sentences.

Numeracy: We will continue to focus on calendars. Another continued focus will be the four processes. Tables facts will be practised throughout the week.

Senior School – Years 5/6 Rooms 1A & 1B

Literacy: During writing sessions over the next few weeks, we will continue to focus on Poetry. We will continue to focus on commas used in direct speech. In reading we will be focusing on strategies, fluency and expression.

Numeracy: We will continue with work on the four processes, the order of operations, place value, number patterns, decimal fractions, common fractions and percentages. We will continue to complete work relating to Symmetry (line and rotational). Tables facts will be practised throughout the week.





Foundation-Year 2

The children are making a class book about **bagian kepala** (head parts) this week. Focus will be on the following vocab:

Mathletics/Spellodrome

This term we are trialling Mathletics and Spellodrome. Mathletics is a game where you start off with an avatar and complete maths activities set up by your teacher on different topics like place value. There are also quizzes in which you earn points for your character. Every point you earn can be saved up to buy more clothes or accessories for your character.

When you start off, the first quiz you do is called 'Are you ready?' It tries to help you revise all of your tables and different skills. When you have finished one activity you can go onto the second one.

You need to get above 85% to move on. If you don't get it at first, you keep on trying until you do.

Spellodrome is a program similar to Mathletics, except instead of quizzes where you challenge different people around the

world, school or classroom, or you can just play against the computer. It covers many Literacy areas.



Yard Marking

This term the 5/6s have been inspecting the yard for rubbish. As we all know, the class with the least amount of rubbish in the week wins. There are 2 teams of two people checking each class's areas for rubbish throughout the week. At assembly on Monday they announce the winning class and give out the trophy.

Prizes will be given to the 3 best scarecrows as voted by the students.


Scarecrows should be at school by Friday October 23rd for voting to take place that day. Winners will be announced at the following assembly.




