Ex-Eaton Rapids pilot, 2 sightseers die in helicopter

EATON RAPIDS — A former Eaton Rapids High School wrestling star died Friday while living out his dream. Thomas C. Brooks, 31, died when the sightseeing helicopter he was piloting plunged to the ground and was engulfed in flames at a Cedar Rapids, Iowa, fairgrounds.

The helicopter Brooks

crashed just seconds after takeoff at about 10:30 p.m. Two passengers from Cedar Rapids, Carrie Carnahan, 18, and Shane Burlingame, 20, also died.

Witnesses said the helicopter, which had been giving short sightseeing flights all night long, turned on its side and plummeted to the ground less than 20 feet from the south entrance of Hawkeye Downs, site of the All-Iowa Fair.

Kevin Jordan of Cedar Rapids, the first to arrive at the scene where the chopper lay upside down with its fuel tanks ablaze, said he was walking back toward his truck when the helicopter flew overhead.

"It was about 200 to 250 feet past us

when it veered and went down. It was really engulfed in flames," Jordan said. He said the engine sounded fine before

the helicopter crashed.

"It was flying along and all of a sudden it turned 90 degrees and just powered straight down into the ground," Jordan said.

Rescuers at the crash site pulled Brooks from the wreckage and tried to revive him. He died at Mercy Hospital in Cedar Rapids.

Federal Aviation Administration investigators were at the crash site Saturday. Brooks had been flying about a year,

fulfilling a long-time dream, said his

mother, Alma Weber of Lansing.

"That was his ambition," she said. "He liked the adventure."

He had been working for the touring company, Badger Helicopters Inc. of Janesville, Wis., about a month.

Brooks graduated from Eaton Rapids High School in 1977, leaving his mark as a wrestler and football player, said his former coach, Jack Provencal.

As a wrestler, Brooks placed sixth in the state his junior year and third in the state his senior year.

"As captain of the team, he was instrumental in establishing the Eaton Rapids wrestling tradition," said Provencal, who now lives in Grand Haven. "He was a very good athlete and a nice young man." Brooks worked for the Eaton Rapids

Public schools as a bus mechanic for about 10 years before quitting to attend helicopter flight school.

Besides his mother, he is survived by his wife, Geri; daughter Skye, 12; and son Alex, 9, from a previous marriage; his father, Thomas Brooks of Lansing, and a sister, Tammy Olney, of Eaton Rapids. Arrangements are by Shelly Funeral Home.


Harder's son, Robert Jr., 15, was killed instantly. Another passenger, Jonathan Benzing, 33, has been released from a hospital.
