COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

During this time, we are not permitted to consume the consecrated wine, according to the bishop's mandate. We remember that Christ is sacramentally and equally present under each species (the bread and wine) so if a person receives only one species (i.e. the bread), Christ remains fully present and nothing is lacking. However, we still believe that the symbol of the chalice is important which is why we continue to hold it up and say the words of administration ("The Blood of Christ, the Cup of Salvation"). After receiving these words of administration, you are invited to respond by crossing yourself and saying, "Amen."
