## **Meditation & Yoga Classes**





#### **Capital Works Update**

#### The Multi-Purpose Shed at Walkerville Oval

The existing shed and compound demolition has been delayed due to SAPN electrical connection delays, until Friday 22 and Saturday 23 November 2019. A fence will be erected on the Pre-Kindy boundary on the Saturday, to keep this area secure. The Cricket Club and St Andrews School have containers in the carpark to store their equipment during the construction.

The contractor, MYKRA Pty Ltd has indicated the new multi-purpose shed will be complete by the end of January 2020, weather permitting.

#### Concrete Kerb Works associated with Road Reseal Program

Concrete repair work to kerbing in preparation for the road reseal program will continue next week in Cluny Avenue, Victoria Street and Hay Court, Walkerville. The works will take approximately 2 weeks to complete. Notices will be delivered to residents of the affected streets about 3 days ahead of the concrete contractor, TFS Civil, starting on site.

Reseal works are scheduled to occur in January and February 2020.

# Warwick Street One Way study Community Drop in session

Wednesday 27 November 3pm – 6pm Corner Warwick Street and Church Terrace.

Council and its consultants have conducted a study of the traffic and pedestrian movements along Warwick Street and developed a series of options to better manage the pedestrian safety and improve the footpath connectivity. They have also investigated traffic calming devices and a school pedestrian crossing in Warwick Street. Traffic and pedestrian movement surveys were conducted in late October 2019 focusing on peak school activity periods.
