This year's fair was hosted at Warrensville Heights High School. This event helped to inform over 1,500 students and parents about HBCUs from all over the country. Students and parents were able to take part in an HBCU Pep Rally, engage in workshops on preparing for and persisting through college, interact with HBCU Admissions Representatives and Alumni, and complete the Common Black College Application for free. Sorors helped in many capacities to support and encourage the participants. Soror Nia Allen (#CAP Committee Chairman) and Soror Deann Wheeler assisted high school seniors with completing the Common Black College Application. Soror Jean Johnson (Lincoln University of Missouri, Alumni Association President) conducted the National Pan-Hellenic Council's Greek Life Workshop. Sorors Michella Hill, Malia Hughes, Nicole Lewis, and Courtney Penland managed the Lambda Phi Omega table where they educated participants on the chapter's #CAP- College Application Process Program and upcoming scholarship opportunity. Committees allow individual members to use their specific talents and collective skills to benefit the organization.
