
Causes leading up to the Industrial Revolution

Results of Agricultural Revolution


Small farmers make agricultural changes


*Food production increased

*Population increased → urbanization (or moving to cities)


Enclosure Movement

- New ways of farming lead to land consolidation
 - Inclosing land with bushes, fences, etc. to make land use more efficient
 - * Land that had been "open" to everyone for cultivating now belonged to landlords. Peasants lost access to wood and water; many moved in to the cities looking for a better life.
 - * Negative: Rich landowners enclose land and force peasants to move to cities
 - * Positive: This increases crop growth and food production









Cottage Industry and Early Capitalism




The First Industry: Textiles

- Textiles
 - Cloth from cotton or wool to make clothing







Cottage Industries (also called the Putting-Out System)

Merchants supply the raw goods

Cottages spin the wool and cotton into yarn

Merchants pick up the yarn and take to another cottage

Next cottage weaves it


Next cottage dyes it

Merchants pick it up and sell. They pay a commission to the cottages.



Factories


- Raw materials go in finished goods come out
- What do you need to industrialize?
 - * Labor
 - Capital (\$\$\$)
 - * Natural Resources

- An economic system based on private ownership, free competition & profit
 - Cottage industry is an example of early capitalism

- 1. Natural Resources

- * They were not threated by war due to their isolation
