Research Projects 2005/2006

- Managing weeds in brown, oriental and yellow mustard: Herbicides and herbicide combinations will be screened for potential as weed control. (Johnson, AAFC)
- Lubricant base oils from oilseed: The lubricity enhancing components will be analyzed with the goal to produce less toxic, more biodegradable functional biolubricants. (Reaney, U of S)
- Effect of seed quality and seeding date on performance of yellow, brown and oriental mustard: Standardized vigour tests will be developed and establishment, growth and yield assessed under conventional and minimum till systems. (Elliott, AAFC)
