

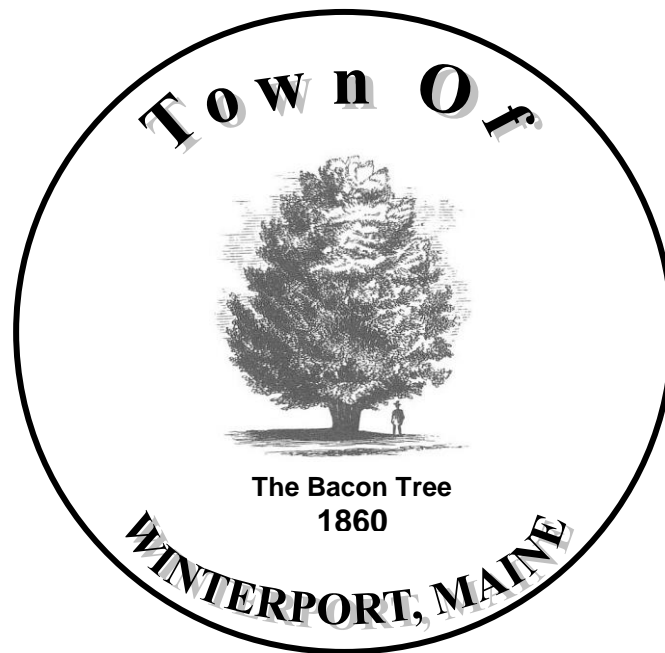

## TOWN MANAGERS AND COUNCIL REPORT

This past winter will definitely be one to remember. In researching how this season compared to others we found a lot of information, much of which placed our winter as; tied for the 22<sup>nd</sup> coldest, the 12<sup>th</sup> snowiest since 1881, and nationwide our snow cover was the 9<sup>th</sup> largest in February since they have been keeping records. Spring has been slow in coming and we all are looking forward to warmer weather with that rich green color replacing the dull brown, the last of winter's remnants.

With the rebirth that spring brings the Town of Winterport is hoping to realize a long held, and saved for, project of building a new municipal building that will house our town office, fire department, public works department, and ambulance/rescue service. We will be going to town meeting with a warrant article to borrow no more than \$1.5 million dollars to fund this endeavor, one that will provide the town a facility that will take us through the next 40-50 years. With this new facility we will also realize another long term dream of the town's, waterfront access. We have entered into an agreement, contingent on a positive vote at town meeting, with Olver Associates to purchase the property next to their office building on Main Street. Included in this purchase the Olver's will deed over the water front property behind their building to the town. This will enable us to proceed with our planned boardwalk/hiking trail starting on the Penobscot River and connecting to Abbott Park and RSU 22 trails. The Town Council, Fire Chief, and I, along with the Budget Committee, have worked very hard on bringing to the residents of Winterport a budget that includes the first loan repayment for this project (20 year note) while keeping our **mil rate the same**. The goal of the Council is to pay down this loan as quickly as possible to minimize interest costs to the town. Once this proposed new building is functional the Town will place for sale the current town office, town office parking lot, and fire station with all proceeds dedicated to retiring the outstanding debt. In addition Darryl Ginn is in the process of surveying and splitting out lots on the town owned property across the street from the airport on Rte. 139. We hope to have approximately 11 lots to sell with all monies being dedicated to our water front access/new building purchase and resulting in the addition of these properties to the tax roles thereby expanding our tax base. Lastly the Winterport Ambulance and Rescue Service has committed to an initial donation towards this project along with a yearly commitment of funds to accomplish our goal of "early debt retirement." We are all very excited about this opportunity and hope our residents will support this effort with a positive vote at Town Meeting.

In closing, the Town Council and I look forward to seeing all of you at Town Meeting on Thursday evening June 12<sup>th</sup> at the Wagner School cafeteria. We promise you that we will do our best, working with you, and for you, as Town Manager and Town Council, to keep Winterport the place we love to call home. Please remember that when you are at the town office make sure you take the time to say hello.

# WINTERPORT FIRE & RESCUE ASSOCIATION

To the Citizens of Winterport

The Winterport Fire and Rescue Association is a group of volunteers who are dedicated to lending a helping hand to the citizens of Winterport and surrounding towns. The association operates the Ambulance Service and performs a number of volunteer tasks which prepare us to assist you. The members donate many hours receiving training to be prepared to render aid on the ambulance when you are sick or injured and to be prepared with equipment, such as the Jaws of Life, to assist the ambulance service at accident scenes. The ambulance attendants and drivers donate untold unpaid hours training. With the high cost of transportation we have begun paying the responders when they go on a call and transport a patient to the hospital. On the fire side of the slate the volunteers attend training three times a month. This training is everything from how to operate the different pieces of equipment we have, safety, traffic control and fire suppression. This year the fireside has purchased about \$1200 worth of equipment for the 1989 Mack purchased this past fall.

Many thanks to those who donate your returnable bottles at the transfer station, also to J & M Redemption for their assistance in getting the bottles to their facility. Through donations from such activities as: Burning Grass, Burning Brush Piles and returnable bottle money we are able to purchase items for the Fire Department which reduces the amount of money which is needed to be raised through taxation to support the Fire Department.

The association also takes on a number of volunteer activities, including: Placing the Christmas decorations and the banners which take there place during the rest of the year; providing traffic control for various functions such as the annual Christmas Pageant and Parades.

We are making progress on raising the height of our antenna on Blueberry Hill to eliminate some of the dead spots. We are hopeful that this will be a reality in 2014

Greeting Residents of Winterport!

In 2013 the Ambulance Service continued to have exciting challenges. Our current ambulance is nearing retirement age so we applied to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for a grant to purchase a new ambulance. It is our hope that by the time this report goes to print a decision will have been made concerning this grant.

In an effort to gain a quicker response to your home in the event of a medical emergency we ask that you mark the end of your driveway with a clear house number that is visible from both directions of travel. Visible numbers will help cut down response time.

During 2013 the service responded to 427 calls with an average call duration of two hours. Normal staffing per call is a Driver and two Emergency Medical Technician (EMT's) for a total of approximately 2,562 man hours of donated time. Time is also given for training to maintain proficiency and licensing level. Additional time is donated for administrative functions, cleaning and maintenance of the ambulance for an approximate total time of 3,000 hours of donated time to the citizens of Winterport.

*INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT*

April 8, 2014

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of and for the year ended June 30, 2013, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents, and related notes to the financial statements.

*Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements*

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

*Auditor's Responsibility*

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for audit opinions.

*Opinions*

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Winterport, Maine as of June 30, 2013, and the respective changes in financial position for

the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

***Other Matters***

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information on pages 3-7 and 28, be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Winterport, Maine's financial statements as a whole. The introductory section, combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements. The combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are the responsibility of management and were derived from and relate directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole. The introductory section has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on them.

## **REPORT OF THE WINTERPORT CEMETERY DISTRICT**

Don Nelson has continued to serve as Sexton in place of longtime Sexton, Sam Butler. We thank Don for his work. The District Board meets on the third Wednesday of each month throughout the year. Time has been spent adopting a unified policy of regulations for operation of the cemeteries, developing an updated inventory of the cemetery lots and repairing damage caused by time and vandalism. For the first time in many years an unused portion of the cemetery was selectively cut.

For those who may not know, there are seven public cemeteries in Winterport:

1. Oak Hill Cemetery on Lebanon Road
2. Bald Hill Cove Cemetery on the Rt. 1A and Old County Road
3. Grant/Littlefield Cemetery on Goshen Road
4. Perkins/Vinal Cemetery on the Monroe Road
5. Ellingwoods Corner Cemetery at Rt. 69/Ellingwoods Corner
6. Twining Cemetery on Twining Road
7. Cole Cemetery on Meadow Road

In addition to providing a final resting place, these cemeteries are also one of the best sources of the history of the people of Winterport, commemorating citizens and soldiers from as far back as the Revolutionary War. Unfortunately, time and neglect have put us in danger of losing permanently some of this history, especially in the smaller cemeteries. The Cemetery District is committed to preserving this part of our heritage.

Grave lots in the Cemeteries are available for \$300.00 per grave (\$150.00 per grave, \$150.00 for perpetual care). Although the traditional sales of graves in lots of six are still available, they are also available individually or in groups of less than six. # WINTERPORT FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Winterport

Thankfully 2013 found our emergency responses to structure fires was well below the level experienced in 2011. The cost of home heating oil and the resulting risks associated with alternate heating methods continues to be of great concern. Chimney fires were up slightly this year. We also had a couple of malfunctioning pellet stoves. Appropriate care needs to be exercised, including: Being sure that you have properly operating smoke detectors in your home; heating equipment is serviced annually and your house number clearly displayed.

We had about sixty calls in 2013. about 1/3 was for traffic control and to assist the ambulance. We had six structure fires and went to the aid of our mutual aid partners eight times. The remainder are varied in nature from chimney fires to CO detector and smoke alarms and fire alarms at the schools.

It is EXTREMELY important that you have your street number posted to make your address easy to locate. Since about half the time it is dark, these numbers should be *reflective*. It is particularly important that these numbers are displayed so as to be easily viewed as responders approach from either direction. "First red house on the right" does not work well as a description at night.

Late this year we purchased a 1989 Mack fire engine. We are presently preparing a request for quotations to have a new larger water tank install in addition to other improvements to bring this up to present standards. Our hope is to have it back this summer and then to convert the Mack we bought a few years ago to a tank truck. This will allow the retirement of the rather light duty GMC tank truck that has a gasoline engine and hydraulic brakes. The tank body on this truck was built locally and we have made rust repairs a couple of times. We feel it best to move to the more heavy duty truck and avoid a complete refit of this twenty-eight (28) year old truck.

Although our fleet is aging, the upgrades detailed above will allow some breathing room. When the above detailed work is complete, our fleet will be 11, 25, and 31 years old. The Capital Reserve Account will also be significantly reduced to get the work done. Funding of the capital reserve account should continue at the level of last couple of years to keep our options open to be in good financial shape to by either good used equipment when the opportunity arises or to be able to buy new if needed. I am concerned solutions to budget issues in Augusta will continue to flow down hill to the municipalities putting pressure on already strained resources.

Fire permits are required for ALL open burning, year round. Permits are available from Fire Warden, Thomas Doe, or at the town office (9 to 5, Monday thru Friday). These permits are issued at no cost. For a fee of \$7.00 permits may be obtained any hour of the day or night on line at <http://www.maineburnpermit.com/> subject to the conditions imposed due to the environmental conditions.

In the spring of 2014 we will be adding some dry hydrants which will allow us to haul water short distances. Our hope is to have a good year round source that is no more than two miles from any fire scene in the town.

The firefighters continue with mandatory training to be fully prepared to address whatever emergency we may be confronted with. This training is both internal and working with our mutual aid departments.

We have added additional an additional firefighter this year. Anyone interested in joining our ranks should contact the Fire Chief, Thomas Doe at 223-4412, or come to our monthly meeting which is generally the first Sunday of each month at 7:00 pm, at the fire station.

I offer what will likely be my final annual report as your Sheriff. As most know, I am not running for the office this year and plan on retiring a few months after my term ends at the end of this year. I will assist a new elected Sheriff next January with a transition to the Office and putting together a report to you next year. I have been honored to hold this office, in service to the citizens of Waldo County and have been privileged to have had your support. I have told many people that I am not running away from the job, which has been a wonderful career; I am simply excited to start a new adventure.

In these tough fiscal times, I am proud to report that the Sheriff's Office Patrol Division, once again, finished 2013 substantially under budget. We were fortunate on fuel prices, implemented cost savings in several areas, and were frugal in our capital purchases, to return approximately \$54,000 from our budget back to the county. We submitted a budget for this year that is nearly flat funded with last years numbers. We know times are tough and our goal is always to do the most we can with the least amount of increase in funding. The corrections budget has also maintained flat funding for this past year and will continue to do so in the upcoming year.


2013 brought a change in our cruiser fleet with the purchase of three Dodge pickups. Special service fleet pricing and outfitting finished the trucks for essentially the same money as the cars. Our need for a few four wheel drive vehicles for inclement weather and other details has become great over the last few years and it seemed the time to give them a try. So far, they have been a great addition to the fleet. While the fuel mileage is slightly off from the cars, the residual value of the vehicles at the end of their service cycle should make up the difference.

The reentry center continues to be a success and sets the bar for other centers across the country. Our prescriptive programming for individuals coming out of the system, back into society is reducing their risk factors substantially. An upcoming assessment by an outside consultant working with the National Institute of Corrections will give us a more definitive report in the upcoming year, however our own observations and statistical gathering indicate we are reducing risk of recidivism at substantial rates.

As we do every year, I am including statistical data for the patrol activities. We continue to aggressively enforce traffic and criminal code while also working hard with prevention. Officers of this agency are visiting our schools on a regular basis to work with staff on safety and crime prevention. These visits are conducted in a non enforcement, proactive, approach to help build partnerships with our education institutions. A Domestic Violence Team has been developed to address those high risk cases, provide support and safety plans for victims. We continue to be proactive in much of our work and reactive when needed.

In closing, I want to thank you, the citizens of Waldo County for allowing me to be your Sheriff for the last 14 years, it is a privilege to be chosen by the people to serve as THEIR Sheriff.

# **Annual Report of the Superintendent Winterport Water District 2013**

As Superintendent of the Winterport Water District, I am pleased to present my annual report to the Town of Winterport.

The year 2013 was a demanding year as our new staff worked to gain familiarity with the water & sewer systems here, in Winterport. Our main focuses for 2013 were to better streamline our accounting systems with the Public Utilities Commission standards, maintain & repair our water system and to continue tighten up our sewer system to prevent storm-water infiltration.

The District's sewer division completed an ongoing project which took advantage of very favorable funding that it received from various agencies, including the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 and from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Development Utilities Program. Sewer rehabilitation work was done with the repair/replacement of several manholes, as well as valve replacement in our pump station, to further our efforts to reduce combined sewer overflows. We are pleased to report that the district was able to handle and treat all high flow storm water surges with zero overflows in 2013. The financing for the sewer system rehabilitation was funded with the grant and loan funds remaining for the project from 2011.

Additional changes will be coming for the sewer division as the EPA has revoked all permits that they previously issued to primary treatment facilities that discharge into an estuary. The District has now been issued a secondary treatment permit and is currently operating under a consent agreement from the Maine Department of Environmental Protection to add secondary treatment to our system. The District is currently working with Olver & Associates Engineering to create a facilities plan to determine the most effective and efficient means to add secondary treatment. The initial facilities plan will be submitted to MDEP, for approval, in July of this year.

The focus of District's water division is maintaining the water system, including recent upgrades, through hydrant flushing, valve exercise and leak detection. We also replaced the transducer on the standpipe and took new measures to avoid freeze-ups in order to prevent standpipe overflows and pressure losses during the winter months. Additionally, we have been heavily involved in the political process as the Public Utilities Commission continues to look at the possibility of deregulation for some water utilities.

The District continues to participate in a monthly area water utilities meeting, comprised of nine nearby water utility systems, that share information and resources. The group meets at the Bangor Water District and collaborates on current issues, ways to reduce costs to our customers and maintaining quality customer services.

In closing, I would like to thank the Board of Trustees, the Town of Winterport, our customers and employees for their dedication and support through this past year.

## *A Message from Representative Joe Brooks*

June 10, 2014

Hi Folks:

During the Second Session of the 126<sup>th</sup> Legislature, despite a sometimes overwhelming environment of partisanship and an inability to meet regularly with Gov. LePage, we still were able to pass good legislation, particularly the return of Revenue Sharing.

It was feared by many that elimination of Revenue Sharing would have caused a significant increase in property tax rates throughout the state.

The governor had threatened to veto the Revenue Sharing bill this year, but ultimately chose to let it become law without his signature following bipartisan votes that passed the measure in both the House and Senate, making it veto-proof.

The legislative Appropriations Committee recommended that a large amount of money be taken from the so-called “rainy day fund” to help fill the \$40 million gap, but ultimately added it back into next year's budget, restoring rainy day monies back to its original level.

A bill that I proposed to construct a suicide prevention fence on the Penobscot Narrows Bridge failed in the Transportation Committee with all members - except one member who was absent - voting to kill the proposal. The Committee instead, substituted the bill with a “letter” of concern to the Dept. of Transportation, asking for a study – a terrible resolution to the bill - which was written after the sixth suicide occurred in March of this year.

It has been an honor to represent the residents of House District 42 – Winterport, Brooks, Jackson, Waldo, Swanville and Monroe. I am still a member of Tax Committee, one of the two most important committees in the Legislature, the other being Appropriations.

Taxation Committee holds public hearings and work sessions on the Governor's proposed budget, ultimately reporting back to Appropriations a series of recommendations on how to fund the fiscal document for the following years – often totaling more than \$6 billion. Under consideration are bills that range from sales and income taxes to exemptions to both of these.

Many of you corresponded with me during this Session. Some also received a copy of my Newsletter, which I email to more than 100 constituents. If you would like to join the mailing list, please let me know at any of my contact places listed below.

Thanks for letting me serve in the 126<sup>th</sup> Session of the Legislature – representing Winterport, Monroe, Brooks, Jackson, Waldo, and Swanville. Following redistricting the Legislature, which took effect Jan. 1 of this year, the new District 98 will include the towns of Winterport, Frankfort, Swanville and Searsport. Hope to see you all this summer

## **Annual Report to the Town of Winterport**

### A Message from Senator Michael Thibodeau

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

I would like to thank you for the opportunity to represent the Town of Winterport in the Maine Senate. It has been an honor serving on your behalf to make Maine an even better place to live, work and conduct business.

The 126th Legislature adjourned its First Regular Session on July 10, 2013. The year began with a daunting task: covering an \$880 million shortfall in the state's two-year budget that was caused mainly by cost overruns in Maine's Medicaid program. We were able to bridge this gap without reversing the largest income tax cut passed in state history by the previous Legislature. These tax reductions benefitted low and moderate-income residents most, and taking them away would have represented a big step back for a state that has historically had one of the highest tax burdens in the country.

One of the Legislature's most significant achievements this session was finally paying off Maine's massive debt to its hospitals, which totaled \$484 million at the beginning of 2013. The Legislature approved a plan that allows the state to use a revenue bond to pay off the debt and use the proceeds from a renegotiated state liquor contract to pay off the bond. The debt was the result of Medicaid services provided by 39 Maine hospitals for which they were never reimbursed, dating back to 2009.

The Legislature also approved the bipartisan Omnibus Energy Bill, which addresses reducing the cost of energy in Maine and making money available to insulate Maine homes. This legislation when fully implemented will increase natural gas capacity and improve connection to underserved areas of Maine.

Again, thank you for entrusting me to represent you in Augusta. Please feel free to contact me if you ever need my assistance in navigating the state bureaucracy. Dear Friends:

It is a privilege to represent Maine in the U.S. Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share some of my work from the past year.

Encouraging the creation of more jobs remains my top priority. I have developed a Seven Point Plan for Jobs in Maine, which includes proposals to spur small business investment, ensure robust workforce education and training, reduce regulatory red tape that stifles job creation, support Maine agriculture and manufacturing, and invest in the infrastructure needed to expand our economy. Traditional industries and small businesses remain the backbone of Maine's economy, and innovation will be important for future jobs as well. I have supported Maine's effort to lead the world in deepwater wind technology and was proud when the University of Maine and its private sector partners launched the first prototype this year. This emerging industry has the potential to create thousands of good jobs here in Maine.

BIW remains a major Maine employer and is critical to our national security. I have worked hard to support the Navy's request for a 10<sup>th</sup> DDG-51 and to continue construction on the DDG-1000s at the shipyard. This year's annual defense policy bill also contains more than 30 provisions to eliminate sexual assault from our military, including several provisions that I authored.

Partisan divisiveness in Washington continues to prevent us from addressing some of our nation's most serious challenges. Gridlock reached a peak in October with the federal government shutdown that pushed our country to the brink of defaulting on its financial obligations and damaged our economy. As the shutdown continued with no end in sight, I presented a proposal I believed both sides could support. Within days, I was leading a bipartisan coalition of 14 Senators that worked night and day to craft a plan to reopen government, avert default, and restart negotiations on a long-term plan to deal with our nation's unsustainable debt of more than \$17 trillion. Known as the "Common Sense Caucus," we will continue to work to develop solutions and bridge the partisan divide.


Earlier this year, across-the-board federal spending cuts known as "sequestration" took effect. These indiscriminate cuts jeopardized priorities from national security to medical research and stand in stark contrast to the thoughtful and thoroughly debated spending priorities set at town meetings throughout Maine. To bring some Maine common sense to this process, I authored bipartisan legislation to allow federal agencies to set priorities in administering the required cuts and wrote a new law to ensure that sequestration would not disrupt air travel, which plays such an important role in fueling Maine's tourism economy.

I have also enjoyed my work as the ranking member of the Senate Special Committee on Aging where, with Senator Bill Nelson of Florida, we work on issues of critical importance to Maine seniors. The committee has created a toll free hotline (1-855-303-9470) to make it easier for senior citizens to report fraud and scams and to receive assistance. I also serve as the Senate Co-Chair of the task force on Alzheimer's, a devastating disease that takes a tremendous personal and economic toll on more than five million Americans. Better treatment for Alzheimer's and ultimately finding a cure should be an urgent national priority.

Finally, I am proud to reflect our famous Maine work ethic by completing another year of service without missing a single roll call vote. I have not missed a vote since I was elected – a streak that stands at more than 5,300 in a row.

May 2014 be a good year for you, your community, and our great State of Maine.

These important legal documents should include advance directives such as a Medical Power of Attorney (for health care) and a Financial Power of Attorney (for finances). You also want to organize and review your Last Will and Testament.

Once you have organized these 3 legal documents, you can rest assured that whatever happens to you, you will have organized your legal documents so that those who love you can know and honor your wishes.

Finally, next fall, I will re-offer more free "Probate Basics" workshops in area towns. Though I provide legal information, I do this not as an attorney but rather as one hoping to help well-intended citizens who need a bit of help. To add helpful energy at these workshops, I also try to bring goodies.
