Tdap Booster Shot AND 2 Doses of Varicella (Chickenpox)

Attention 6th Graders: Are you ready for the 7th grade? California has immunization requirements for students entering 7th grade. Students are required to have proof of having had the Tdap booster shot AND 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox).

Tdap, Dtap or DTP given **ON or after the 7th birthday** will satisfy this requirement. Td does not meet the requirement. **Proof of the shots must be on file.** If you have not had your Tdap and/or 2nd chickenpox shot, then please check with your parent/guardian and health care provider. Please turn in the record to the Counseling Office in the "Tdap" box OR directly to Nurse Judy (Room 221). Proof of vaccines may also be emailed to

Junior Ranger Day at SF Maritime NHP – Saturday April 20

San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park welcomes children 5-12 and their families for a free Junior Ranger Day event on **Saturday, April 20**, from 9:30am to 4pm. Young sailors who try all the day's activities can earn a Junior Ranger badge in a group ceremony near the front gate of Hyde Street Pier at 12 noon or 3pm. Throughout the day, admission fees to board the Park's historic ships will also be waived for all visitors. At Hyde Street Pier, Junior Ranger Day activities will include: watching demonstrations of traditional "sailor work" such as caulking a ship's deck and rope making; and a variety of children's activities including a sea chantey singalong, building wooden toy boats, working together to raise and lower a small dory out of the water, maritime-themed crafts, and temporary sailor tattoos. Young children who enjoy dressing up should be sure to visit the Ark Houseboat to try on period costumes! Specific activities are subject to change, so be sure to check the schedule of activities posted at the front gate for times and locations. San Francisco Maritime National Historical Park includes a fleet of historic ships, Visitor Center, Maritime Museum (new exhibits: "A Palace for the People" about 1939 building's art and architecture; and "Flotsam and Jetsam," a sculptural installation by artist/commercial fisherman Martin Machado), Maritime Research Center, and the Aquatic Park Historic District. The 2019 GIRLFLY Summer Arts & Activism Project will bring 20 young women from the Bay Area for four weeks, July 1-27, to get hands-on experience in site specific dance, making dances in Quesada Gardens in San Francisco's Bayview District. Earn \$500. Create original dances for performance. Learn from with working with professional dance artists. Learn about issues of girls' empowerment and social justice. Research and carry out a Writing as Activism project, led by an ethnic studies professor from SF State.
