### **General Information**

This spring virtual conference event replaces the cancelled 2020 Conference by the Sea annual symposium. An impressive line-up of speakers are taking part in this 1st virtual conference sponsored by the Maryland/DC Society for Respiratory Care. A special "Covid-19" educational track has been constructed that provides a variety of coverage on this topic from multiple medical expert perspectives. Three other tracks are also part of this event: Critical Care, Ethics, and General Education.

Ethics topics are denoted by (\*\*E) and LGBT education designated as (\*\*EL). All CRCE credits will be generated using the Conference Tracker app. Participants will register, pay and complete their CRCE credits all through the Conference Tracker app or web interface. No paper CRCE certificates will be compiled. Special group discounts are available for hospitals or organizations that want to register 10 or more respiratory therapists.

This virtual conference event will run for a period of 30 days so that participants can register, attend and watch any of the topics at a time and date of their choosing during the 30 day window. This option provides a level of convenience that is not typically found in 1-3 day conference events.

All virtual talks will be "streamed" from pre-recorded captures. There will be open zoom sessions for Participants to interact with some of the speakers during the 30 day conference period.
