INTRODUCTION

The Chilean government requires all travelers entering Chile to verify their identity and certify their vaccination status. Travelers must complete this process not more than 45 days prior to entering Chile and not less than 30 days prior to entering Chile as the approval process can take up to 30 days for the Chilean government to complete and issue an approval.

To complete the required "Mobility Pass" for entry into Chile, you will need to have both your passport and COVID-19 vaccination information readily at hand. You will also need a photo (jpeg) or PDF of your passport and vaccination card ready to upload.


NOTE: Oceania Cruises strongly suggests that you complete the "Mobility Pass" application on a desktop or laptop computer and use either Microsoft Edge or Google Chrome. By doing so, the majority of the application website should automatically translate to English. The user experience on mobile devices and/or Apple devices may not provide as smooth or easy an experience for the applicant.

REGISTERING FOR THE COVID PASS FORM

- Go to https://mevacuno.gob.cl
- Click on "Email."




- Click on "CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT."
- Enter your email address and create a password.
- Once you enter your email address and your chosen password, click "CREATE ACCOUNT."
- You will receive a verification email from the site.
- Click on the link provided in the verification email. It will verify your email and then prompt you to log in.




• You will proceed to the profile page.

• If you reside outside of Chile, click on "FOREIGN."




• Click on "FOREIGN TOURISTS NOT RESIDING IN CHILE VACCINATED ABROAD."




IDENTITY DATA

• On the next screen, click on "IDENTITY STATEMENT."




• That will result in a pop-up screen where you will need to fill out a form with your Nationality, Full Legal Name and Date of Birth, among other information.




ADDITIONAL APPLICANT INFORMATION


• Once that is completed, you will click on the top bar: "VALIDATE COVID-19 VACCINES.



• Click on "OK."




• You will need to verify you are not a robot and complete the CAPTCHA challenge.



APPLICANT'S VACCINATION HISTORY


In this form, you will need to enter information that you entered earlier. While it is indeed repetitive, it is required.

- Passport
- Passport Number
- Country of Residence
- First and Second (Middle) Name
- Surname
- Date of Birth (Day Month Year)
- Gender




APPLICANT'S VACCINATION HISTORY CONT.

• When you get to the country of residence field, we suggest you SCROLL carefully for the country name and not TYPE it into the field as the names are in Spanish.




APPLICANT'S VACCINATION HISTORY CONT.

- On the next screen, you will need to enter all of the information requested.
- Then you will need to upload a photo or PDF of both your passport and your vaccination card.



Once you upload those documents, your application will be complete.

APPLICATION SUBMITTED EMAIL



Once you have successfully completed the process, this message will be displayed. You will also receive an email confirmation stating that your application has been successfully received and that you should watch your email inbox for an official approval.

Once you have received your approval documents, please retain a copy on a mobile device for easy retrieval while traveling.

If you are entering Chile via air, you may be required to present it prior to boarding your international flight(s) to Chile and again upon arrival in-country.

If you are entering Chile for the first time aboard Marina, you will need to present it at embarkation and upon demand by shipboard and/or Chilean authorities upon arrival in the first Chilean port of call.
