This is reflected in the incredible amount of participation in the student-run organizations such as Momentum, Expressions, and Envy, to name a few. Since my hire in 2017, I have been actively working to build bridges with the student organizations and other dance on campus, and have begun populating our dance technique courses and productions with many non-majors in addition to our majors. In my time working with the students and faculty on campus so far, I have found that the current title of the dance minor has deterred student participation because they do not necessarily have an interest in singing and acting. The dance electives are housed within the musical theatre program as a part of the musical theatre degree, however they also serve the dance minor and are open to the entire campus to participate in. Although a few non-dance courses are included in the minor, as they are in most university dance programs, the primary focus is dance technique and composition, not musical theater dance. This is a minor in dance; Changing the name to properly reflect the degree will help alleviate confusion surrounding it, and increase student interest.

By eliminating those choices all of the courses taken in the electives are dance technique or performance-based classes and support a bridge being built between departments.

Name change of Musical Theatre Dance Minor to Dance Minor Curriculum changes and rationale Submitted by Megan Glynn Zollinger

5 courses required (11 units):

THEA 112 Acting and Social Wellness (3)

This is a beginning acting class for non-majors. As performance is a significant part of dance, this course is necessary for the students within the dance minor. In addition to enhancing their acting ability on stage, this course assists in the student's comfortability and preparedness to talk about dance and their work. This will be a key component of the Seminar in Choreography class, amongst many other areas.

THEA 135 Musical Theatre Dance (2)

This is a dance technique course that teaches original reparatory from musicals both current and historic. In addition to learning the original choreography, this is a unique course where all styles are submerged into one. All major genres of dance are represented in musical theatre, and this course is a wide range survey of those styles, connecting them to one another.

THEA 203 Dance Theatre Rehearsal I (1)

Dance Theatre Rehearsal gives the student credit for performing in a dance concert. As previously stated, performance is a significant part of dance and the dance minor. This training allows them to work with faculty and guest artists, creating pieces that will be a part of the faculty show.

THEA 382 Seminar in Choreography (2)

Unless improvised, all dance is choreographed. Understanding the fundamentals of choreography assists the dancer's performance, technical skill, and potential to become choreographers and teachers. Learning how to find their own choreographic and artistic voice is imperative, and this course teaches the introductory skills needed. The students gain a better understanding of structure, approach, vocabulary, and criticism. They create multiple original works, learn how to talk and write about their work, and how to critique others.

KINE 152 Introduction to Dance (3)

This course offers a broad overview of dance history and the many genres and styles of dance worldwide. Understanding the history of dance is necessary to support a minor in dance. With one third of the class traditionally designated to movement, the students then get to experience the many genres and styles first-hand.

Dance Technique and Theatre Production 11 units selected from:

THEA 202 Musical Theatre Rehearsal I (1)

Musical Theatre Rehearsal gives the student credit for performing in a main stage musical. As previously stated, performance is a significant part of dance and the dance minor. This training allows them to work with faculty and guest artists while producing a full production. The addition of

narrative and storytelling in musicals offers a different experience for the performer than concert dance.

THEA 231 Beginning Ballet (2)

Ballet is one of the main dance genres, rich in history. It is the root of most dance technique and vocabulary. Ballet is essential to a dancer wanting to learn any style of dance, as its training supports many other styles and physical preparedness. This is an elective only because within a dance minor, the student should be able to choose which genres they wish to study further. This course offers a beginner level of ballet technique.

THEA 232 Beginning Tap (2)

Tap is one of the main dance genres, rich in history. Very different from ballet, jazz, and modem, tap offers a style in which the dancer wears shoes with metal taps on them to produce sounds with the feet. There is much detail to musicality and rhythm in this technique that is unique to the genre. Tap is also present in the musical theatre styles. This is an elective only because within a dance minor, the student should be able to choose which genres they wish to study further. This course offers a beginner level of tap technique.

THEA 233 Beginning Jazz (2)

Jazz is one of the main dance genres, rich in history. Utilizing much of the same technique and vocabulary as ballet, jazz offers a more grounded, stylized approach to the movement. The approach to musicality and rhythm is very different than ballet, and it has become a very large umbrella for many dance styles. Jazz is also present in the musical theatre styles, as well as This is an elective only because within a dance minor, the student should be able to choose which genres they wish to study further. This course offers a beginner level of jazz technique.

THEA 234 Beginning Modern (2)

Modem is one of the main dance genres, rich in history. Created in an attempt to defy the rules of ballet, this technique offers a unique approach to technique. Utilizing the vocabulary of ballet, almost everything became parallel as opposed to turned out. In addition, modern began moving things like the torso, going in and out of the floor, improvising and weight sharing. Modem is also present in the musical theatre styles. This is an elective only because within a dance minor, the student should be able to choose which genres they wish to study further. This course offers a beginner level of modem technique.

THEA 302 Musical Theatre Rehearsal II (1)

Musical Theatre Rehearsal gives the student credit for performing in a main stage musical. As previously stated, performance is a significant part of dance and the dance minor. This training allows them to work with faculty and guest artists while producing a full production. The addition of narrative and storytelling in musicals offers a different experience for the performer than concert dance. This section allows them to participate in a second musical.

THEA 303 Dance Theatre Rehearsal II (1)

Dance Theatre Rehearsal gives the student credit for performing in a dance concert. As previously stated, performance is a significant part of dance and the dance minor. This training allows them to work with faculty and guest artists, creating pieces that will be a part of the faculty show. This section allows them to participate in a second dance concert.

THEA 309 Musical Theatre Ensemble (2)

To further training for musical theatre and dance performance, this course combines dancing, singing, and acting. The course teaches students how to work with and be a part of an actual ensemble. Learning numbers that require the student to apply all three areas, much focus is put on the element of performance, preparing them for bigger productions.

THEA 331 Intermediate Ballet (2)

Ballet is one of the main dance genres, rich in history. It is the root of most dance technique and vocabulary. Ballet is essential to a dancer wanting to learn any style of dance, as its training supports many other styles and physical preparedness. This is an elective only because within a dance minor, the student should be able to choose which genres they wish to study further. This course offers an intermediate level of ballet technique.

THEA 332 Intermediate Tap (2)

Tap is one of the main dance genres, rich in history. Very different from ballet, jazz, and modern, tap offers a style in which the dancer wears shoes with metal taps on them to produce sounds with the feet. There is much detail to musicality and rhythm in this technique that is unique to the genre. Tap is also present in the musical theatre styles. This is an elective only because within a dance minor, the student should be able to choose which genres they wish to study further. This course offers an intermediate level of tap technique.

THEA 333 Intermediate Jazz (2)

Jazz is one of the main dance genres, rich in history. Utilizing much of the same technique and vocabulary as ballet, jazz offers a more grounded, stylized approach to the movement. The approach to musicality and rhythm is very different than ballet, and it has become a very large umbrella for many dance styles. Jazz is also present in the musical theatre styles, as well as This is an elective only because within a dance minor, the student should be able to choose which genres they wish to study further. This course offers an intermediate level of jazz technique.

KINE 113 Beginning Ballroom (1)

Ballroom is a technique very different than others. As a social dance, ballroom is almost always danced with a partner. With many television shows showcasing this technique, it has become even more popular amongst younger people. There are tremendous amounts of styles within ballroom, all beneficial for any dancer to learn. Not only does the student learn how to dance with a partner, they learn intricate footwork, muscle control, and alignment, to name a few. Ballroom is present in both the dance and musical theatre world.
