A NOTE FROM THE PASTORS:

I arrived at Edenton Street Church in the summer of 2008. As you may recall that was a fateful summer. The financial crisis and subsequent recession was upon us. We soon had members of our church out of work, under-employed, and/or facing financial hardship. The following months, which led to years, were extremely challenging for our church.

Edenton Street weathered the storm well, never having to reduce programs, ministries or staff. We were able to do so because reserve funds had been wisely held. While over the past several years we have not tapped additional reserves, we have not been able to replenish the considerable reserves spent in 2008 and 2009.

In a recent letter to our members we announced that at the end of February 2016, we were \$207,000 behind in the contributions budgeted for this time period. At the end of March, the comparable number was

\$199,000. This is a hopeful sign that indicates that we are headed in the right direction. It also reminds us that we have much to do.

Why is this important? As a young person who grew up in our church returns to serve as our Associate Youth Director, a family who stepped away from the faith for many years brings their children for baptism, and another life is turned around in no small part because of our church, we see that God is doing great things through this congregation. As those who have been called to be disciples, let us follow Jesus not only through our witness and service, but let us follow him as generous and faithful disciples.

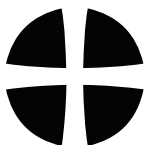
