Installation of New RFID System Underway!

The installation of the Library's new RFID system is now underway, and exterior book drops are temporarily out of service. New book drops are being mounted and patron kiosks, staff stations, exit gates and sorting equipment are being installed and configured throughout the system. Staff is working hard to learn the new procedures but since there will inevitably be a learning curve, checkins and checkout may move a bit slower at first. The new system includes SelfCheck kiosks for those who wish to bypass the Circulation Desk as well as "instant" returns through the book drop slot. Once the system is fully operational, we expect to speed up service in Circulation and reduce errors while improving stack maintenance and inventory control. Thank you for your patience during this process.
