


MN Fishing Opener - May 15 Take Mom Fishing Weekend is the weekend before fishing opener

Fishing seasons open for walleye, bass, trout in lakes, and northern pike on Saturday, May 15, with this year's date taking the prize for the latest possible opener under Minnesota statute.

The correct dates for this year's Take a Mom Fishing Weekend—when Minnesota-resident moms can fish without purchasing a license—are Saturday, May 8, to Sunday, May 9. That special weekend is defined in Minnesota statutes as the weekend that coincides with Mother's Day. Most years, under Minnesota law, the fishing opener and Take a Mom Fishing Weekend fall on the same weekend, but not this year.

Power Loading Causes Damage To Launch Ramps

"Power loading", can cause damage to launch ramps that may not be visible from the surface of the water. "Power loading" is a term used to describe using the motor to load and unload the boat onto and off the trailer. Many of the state's 3,000 public launch ramps were not designed to sustain the forces generated by today's larger and more powerful boats or the practice of power loading. Propeller wash creates a significant force that can erode the lakebed and create a large hole at the end of the ramp.

St. Louis County Added To Burning Restrictions List Otter Tail County Remains On the Burning Restrictions List

The risk of wildfire has moved into the northeast part of the state, so the

Minnesota Department of Natural Resources has added St. Louis County to the burn restriction list effective immediately.

The state will not issue burning permits for brush or yard waste in St. Louis County until the restrictions are lifted. Restrictions remain in place for:

Dock And Lift Registration Required In Otter Tail County

Otter Tail County's Dock and Riparian Use Ordinance requires docks and lifts to be registered with the county when being moved from one body of water to

another. Minnesota law requires dock and lifts to be dried for 21 days before moving from one body of water to another.

Action Alert Support The Stop Starry Program

Starry stonewort was first discovered in Minnesota near a boat access on Lake Koronis in Stearns County. the size of the outbreak was almost 300 acres.

The next summer starry stonewort covered thousands of acres of Lake Koronis. From Koronis it spread. Today sixteen lakes (29 public accesses) are now infested. Each is a vector of spread. Starry stonewort is difficult and expensive to manage, prefers high quality waters, and significantly impacts fishing, boating, and swimming.

MLR submitted a grant to the Environmental and Natural Resources Trust Fund, ENRTF (lottery proceeds) to contain starry stonewort (Nitellopsis obtusa) in those 16 lakes (29 accesses) using waterless boat cleaning stations, civic organizing, and social messaging enhancements. The commission included this project as part of their overall package recommendations to the legislature.

The funding for this program is being carried in the 2021 ENRTF appropriations bills, HF 151 and SF 690. Contact your legislators today to encourage them to support this funding package so that we can get protection for all of MN's lakes this summer.

What's the problem with Lead?

Did you know that the vast majority of fishing tackle currently available on the market is made out of lead? Lead is a toxic metal that is lethal in small amounts to common loons and other wildlife, including trumpeter swans and bald eagles. Across the United States, lead poisoning is a leading cause of death for loons. An estimated 25% of loons die from lead poisoning, primarily from swallowing lead jigs and sinkers. Loons consume fishing tackle in several ways:
