Happy spring! This is a time of rebirth and renewal; a time of longer days, sunshine, and hope.

This month brings us National Library Week (April 4-10) — a time to celebrate all that libraries offer. The Baldwin Public Library extends far beyond the building's walls. During the pandemic, BPL adapted to a rapidly changing world by expanding resources and continuing to meet community needs. For example, we have:

- Eliminated overdue fines
- Installed smart lockers for contactless and after-hours pickup
- Implemented digital-only cards to enable those who did not have a library card to receive one immediately, even during NY PAUSE
- Greatly increased our collection of eBooks and downloadable audiobooks
- Offered hundreds of free, virtual programs for all ages, from author visits to yoga
- Increased available checkouts on our streaming services (Hoopla and Kanopy) to 20 per cardholder, per month
- Contacted hundreds of community members with friendly check-in phone calls
- Distributed thousands of take and make crafts.



At the center of all her novels is an uncanny understanding of human nature and a brilliantly subtle and wry sense of humor as she cleverly attacks, with tongue in cheek, the British class system that Austen herself suffered from during her too short lifetime.


