#### Minutes of the Phantom Flyers RC Club meeting on 21 March 2022

The March club meeting was held via Zoom and opened at 7:02 PM. Club President Dan Dierking chaired the meeting and Secretary Ed White actually remembered there was a meeting. Six club members were present.

Tech Session: No tech session

Secretary's Report - A motion was made and passed to accept the minutes of the February 2021 meeting as published in the March Carrier Wave. There is a club roster now out on the club website. It has the same password as before. Contact the secretary if you need the password.

Treasurer's Report - We have a comfortable amount in the treasury, enough for 2022 operating expenses.

Safety Officer's Report - Safety officer was present. Rule 42 that requires us to restrict our flying if the weather at Lambert Airport is below VFR minimum visibility and altitude was passed and is now active. See chart under Old Business.

Field Manager's Report - Don was out yesterday in some fine weather. Green mower still lashed up outside. Somebody was making ruts around SE end of field. We should have a runway patching party before the weather gets hot. Don will schedule.

Activities Chair Report - We continue to get little response to our proposal for a round robin FF series. But Wright Flyers would like to know if we want to reprise our previous arrangement.

MVSA will not be holding their 2m Fun Fly glider contests this year. Do we want to do it? How many? Saturday or Sunday? April 30 swap meet fly in. April 24 Columbia, April 17, Spirits. We discussed the proposal for an indoor Swap Meet as shown in the second chart below. What is new here is Mitch Galatioto identified a suitable venue that we can rent at a price which should allow us to make money. See the second chart under Old Business.

### We now have a signed Letter of Agreement (LOA) with the St. Louis Airport ATC authority

What does this allow us to do? We can now fly to a maximum altitude of 2000 feet Above Ground Level (AGL).

How does this affect how we fly? There are a few restrictions to be aware of that are defined below. Generally it will have no effect on our flying other than allowing us to go to higher altitude. We do NOT have to, and should not notify the FAA or airport when we fly. Just go fly whenever you please. However, please be aware of the need to obey all safety rules of the AMA and our field safety rules.

What are the restrictions? The three most important issues of concern to the FAA in authorizing this LOA are: Safety, Safety and Safety. The primary approach to our safely sharing the airspace with full scale aircraft is See and Avoid. That means both we see and avoid them, and they see us and can avoid. However, since we are much smaller and more maneuverable than they are, the bulk of the See and Avoid responsibility has to fall on us.

There are two important AMA safety documents. The AMA Safety Handbook (Document 100, <a href="https://www.modelaircraft.org/sites/default/files/documents/100.pdf">https://www.modelaircraft.org/sites/default/files/documents/100.pdf</a>) and the AMA See and Avoid Guidance (Document 540-D, <a href="https://www.modelaircraft.org/system/files/documents/540-D.pdf">https://www.modelaircraft.org/system/files/documents/540-D.pdf</a>) Please make sure you are operating within the letter of both documents at all times. Our club field safety rules make up the third important document (<a href="https://www.phantomflyersrc.com/current-news/">https://www.phantomflyersrc.com/current-news/</a>). What follows is what is new with the LOA.

- 1. Weather. This was already addressed by the recent addition of rule 42 that was passed by the club at the March 2022 meeting.
- 42. Prior to flying, pilots must verify visibility to be a minimum of 3 miles and the lowest reported cloud level to be at least 500 feet above the highest altitude to be flown. These minimums are based on the official reported conditions at Lambert St. Louis International Airport. An accepted source for these conditions is the KSTL Meteorological Encoded Terminal Area Report (METAR) available from multiple sources including on the home page of the club website (<a href="mailto:phantomflyersrc.com">phantomflyersrc.com</a>). An alternate source is the Automated Surface Observing System (ASOS) recorded data which can be obtained at 314-890-4790.
- 2. No night time flying. Flying is permitted from civil sunrise to civil sunset. Again the issue is supporting See and Avoid.
- 3. "Spill out" refers to a requirement on us to immediately report to the FAA if we lose control of an aircraft resulting in a flyaway. Our interpretation of flyaway means the aircraft was last seen flying stably leaving our field airspace in a manner where it is not seen to come down. If we lose control and we see the aircraft impact the ground (or disappear into the corn), that is not a flyaway and is not reportable. Here is the requirement for reporting.

Phantom Flyers R/C Club must immediately notify St. Louis Air Traffic Control Tower

- (STL) at (314) 890-4727 and St. Louis TRACON (T75) at (314) 890-1018 in the event of a lost link, fly-away or operational area spill-out that may affect manned aircraft operations.
- (1) Information in case of a fly-away or spill-out
- (a) Location of aircraft
- (b) Size of aircraft (weight, length, width)
- (c) Direction of Flight
- (d) Altitude

Items 2 and 3 will likely require additions to the field safety rules. We will review the LOA in detail and determine what requirements of the LOA require field safety rule changes and/or posting of information at the field. Changes will be brought before the club at the May meeting to allow the required rule change notification to be completed a week ahead of a vote.

Please note. The above changes and restrictions are in effect now. Please abide by them. The field rule changes that we will propose are the paperwork catching up to reality.

One question that has come up is, how does this affect the aircraft identification/altitude reporting requirement that the FAA is pursuing. The answer is they are completely separate issues with no effect on each other.

I wanted to get this out in time for the April Carrier Wave. I realize that it does not answer all questions. That will take time. And need to have those questions raised by all of you.

#### **◆Club Safety Rule Addition**

- ◆Required for compliance to FAALOA
  - ◆42. Prior to flying, pilots must verify visibility to be a minimum of 3 miles and the lowest reported cloud level to be at least 500 feet above the highest altitude to be flown. These minimums are based on the official reported conditions at Lambert St. Louis International Airport. An accepted source for these conditions is the KSTL Meteorological Encoded Terminal Area Report (METAR) available from multiple sources including on the home page of the club website ( <a href="phantomflyersrc.com">phantomflyersrc.com</a>). An alternate source is the Automated Surface Observing System (ASOS) recorded data which can be obtained at 314 -890-4790.
  - ◆Need vote to add to Safety Rules

#### **→Field Lease**

#### Understanding FAA Weather Data

As previously mentioned in the Carrier Wave, the FAA requested the Phantom Flyers RC Club to add a rule to our safety code requiring fliers to access the weather as recorded at Lambert St. Louis Airport before flying at our field. Rule 42 has been written to codify this requirement in our safety rules.

42. Prior to flying, pilots must verify visibility to be a minimum of 3 miles and the lowest reported cloud level to be at least 500 feet above the highest altitude to be flown. These minimums are based on the official reported conditions at Lambert St. Louis International Airport. An accepted source for these conditions is the KSTL Meteorological Encoded Terminal Area Report (METAR) available from multiple sources including on the home page of of the club website (phantomflyersrc.com). An alternate source is the Automated Surface Observing System (ASOS) recorded data which can be obtained at 314-890-4790.

The METAR data posted on our website is conveniently decoded for us. Visibility is reported in statute miles, and Sky condition (cloud layers) are reported in feet above ground level. The first cloud layer will be the lowest level concerning our requirement.

The ASOS data we can obtain by phone is a recording updated every minute. The report, in a computer generated voice, will follow a specific format. An example;

"Lambert St. Louis International Airport, Automated Weather Observation, 1612 Zulu, Wind Two Four Zero at Zero Eight Peak Gust Two One, Visibility Zero Six Light Rain, Sky Condition Scatterred One Thousand Two Hundred Broken Three Thousand Five Hundred Overcast Ten Thousand, Temperature one niner celcius Dew Point One One Celcius Altimiter Two Niner Five One Remaerks Density Altitude One Thousand Seven Hundred"

- "Lambert St. Louis International Airport", location.
- 2. "Automated Weather Observation", type of observation
- 3. "1612 Zulu", time. CST = GMT-6 hours, CDT = GMT-5 hours
- "Wind Two Four Zero at Zero Eight Peak Gust Two One," direction rounded to nearest 10° and velocity in knots.
- "Visibility Zero Six Light Rain" distance in statute miles and obscuring phenominon if visibility is less than 7 miles.
- "Sky Condition Scattered One Thousand Two Hundred, Broken Three Thousand Five Hundred Overcast Ten Thousand" in feet above ground level.
- "Temperature One Niner Celsius, Dew Point One One Celsius.
- "Altimiter Two Niner Five One", barometric pressure in inches mercury.
- "Remaerks Density Altitude One Thousand Seven Hundred", calculated equivalent field elevation on a "standard day".

The data in segments 5 and 6 above satisfies the FAA requirement. Under the conditions of the example we could legally fly, but only to 700 feet altitude.
