
Rimfire & Centerfire Benchrest Match



The National Rifle Association course titled "*BASIC PISTOL*", a 12-hour course demonstrating fundamental handling of handguns and the legal ownership, storage, and use of firearms and information pertaining to the citizen's right of self-defense will be presented by the Chatuge Gun Club, Inc., of Hiawassee,

GA. The course will be conducted on Saturday and Sunday, 5 and 6 May 2012.

The course is a basic handgun course enhanced by emphasis on self-defense and the law, so it is suitable for experienced, as well as, novice shooters. Ignorance and carelessness are the two leading causes of firearm accidents. Our aim is to eliminate both of them! Safe gun handling and storage techniques are




paramount and are presented as a priority throughout the course.





- Membership renewals for the coming year may now be done by mail. Send a check, payable to The Chatuge Gun Club, Inc., for \$35 along with any information such as phone number, address, email or any other changes, to the club mailbox (P.O. Box 86; Hiawassee, Georgia 30546). There is a form for these changes at the top of this page. Cut it out and send in with your check. A 2012 key will be mailed to you before 1 June 2012 when the range locks will be changed. Don't get in a tizzy if they are not mailed immediately. To save postage, pre-paid keys may also be picked up at the Annual Meeting.
- The Annual Meeting will be held this year at the Senior Center in Hiawassee, same location as our regular monthly meetings and at the same time (7 PM).
- There will not be a dinner this year at the Annual Meeting but in its place we will have a Picnic later in the year when the weather is more favorable. The whole family will be invited as usual.

NRA Gun Safety Rules

Three Fundamental Rules For Safe Gun Handling

1. Always keep the gun pointed in a safe direction.

This is the primary rule of gun safety. A *safe direction* means that the gun is pointed so that even if it were to go off it would not cause injury or damage. The key to this rule is to control where the muzzle or front end of the barrel is pointed at all times. Common sense dictates the safest direction, depending on different circumstances.

2. Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.

When holding a gun, rest your finger on the trigger guard or along the side of the gun. Until you are actually ready to fire, do not touch the trigger.

3. Always keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.

Whenever you pick up a gun, immediately engage the safety device if possible, and, if the gun has a magazine, remove it before opening the action and looking into the chamber(s) which should be clear of ammunition. If you do not know how to open the action or inspect the chamber(s), leave the gun alone and get help from someone who does.

COWBOY RIFLE SILHOUETTE

Looks like Gene Blackburn has gone for a sabbatical and passed the flag to Randy Thomas and Bill Christine to present the future Cowboy Rifle Silhouette games. Here is a short refresher since there are two of them in this newsletter's schedule.

Cowboy Rifle Silhouette is focused toward shooters who enjoy shooting hunting arms and do not want to make the investment required of other specialized types of shooting competitions.

The matches are designed so that a competitor can shoot either or both small-bore or pistol cartridges.

Listed below are rules that apply to both small-bore and center-fire rifles.

1. Rear sights may be open sights, receiver or tang sight. Front sights must be a post or bead, may be hooded or if interchangeable may use post inserts only.

2. Any cartridge causing target damage or deemed unsafe may be banned.

3. Binoculars may be used for spotting. Spotting scopes or stands may not be used. No shooting jacket, shooting vests or gloves will be allowed. 4. The small-bore rifle can be any lever action, pump or semi-auto rim-fire rifle (No bolt actions rifles), .22 long rifle ammunition only, hyper velocity ammunition prohibited.

5. The center-fire rifle can be any lever action rifle with a tubular magazine. A rimmed pistol cartridge must be used, i.e. 25-20, 32-30, 38's, 357 magnum, 38-40, 44's, 44-40, 45 Colt, 45 long Colt, 22 magnum, 22 long rifle.

The targets are metallic animals set at different distances, so you get to use some of that old *"Kentucky Windage"*.

A match consists of 40 shots, so you'll need a minimum of 40 rounds.

There will be a sight-in and practice period prior to the match so take into account your practice rounds when deciding how much ammo to bring.

If you want to sight-in prior to match day, the distances are as follows: Chickens at 40 meters; pigs at 50 meters; turkeys at 75 meters; rams at 100 yards (all the way back to the berm).

Anyone who likes to plink with a 22 rifle will enjoy Cowboy Rifle Silhouette. The matches are informal and lots of fun.

Short Description : Non-shooting course and teaches students the basic knowledge, skills, and to explain the attitude necessary for the safe handling and storage of firearms and ammunition in the home.

More Details: This is a four-hour course for safe gun handling that is conducted in the classroom only. Students are taught NRA's three rules for safe gun handling; primary causes of firearms accidents; firearm parts; how to unload certain action types; ammunition components; cleaning; care; safe storage of firearms in the home; and the benefits of becoming an active participant in the shooting sports. Students will receive the NRA Home Firearm Safety handbook, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, Basic Firearm Training Program brochure, course completion certificate.
