Wednesday Afternoon Group

April Project

I **Spy** Quilt (Disappearing Nine-Patch version) with Shirley Challice

Quilt Size: 47 ½ " x 60 ½ "

Fabric requirements:

- 64 5" I-Spy squares (63 will be used) *
- 1 2 yd sashing (white in photo)
- ½ yd for setting squares (blue in photo)
- ½ yd binding

Cutting instructions:

Sashing: 64 - 5" white squares $17 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" white rectangles

Setting squares: 16 - 5" squares
17 - 2 ½ " squares

Binding: 5 - 2 1/4 " or 2 1/2" strips

^{*}A smaller quilt (41"x54") may be made with 48 I-spy squares.



If you have extra I-SPY fabric, why not bring it for an exchange (or giveaway) in order to get more variety!

If you are not interested in making an I-spy quilt, but would like to learn the disappearing nine-patch method, bring along 64 (or more) 5" squares in a variety of complimentary colours or one main fabric with complimentary fabric for "sashing & "setting squares".



The disappearing nine patch is a method with lots of possibilites for colour and layout!



You should also bring your sewing machine, rotary cutter and ususal equipment.



All members are welcome to join us following the regular guild meeting . We have lunch and then work on a new project ...**or** you can bring along your current project and join us.
