## RETIREE'S CORNER

As the Fall Retiree's Corner article indicated, decisions to grant Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA's) for Local Government retirees are the responsibility of the Retirement System's Board of Trustees. They have been charged by the General Assembly to consider three issues in considering whether to grant a COLA, and if so, how much.

Inflation, based on increases of the Consumer Price Index is one while investment gains or losses during the preceding three years is another. The third is the annual actuarial valuation report. The report is a "snapshot" of the actuarial position of the pension plan at a given point in time. In our case, the report is always as of the end of the preceding year, December 31, 2011 for the report presented October 8, 2012 at the Retirement System's Board of Trustees meeting.

This year's actuarial report indicates an investment return on market value of 2.14% while the assumed investment rate of return was 7.25%. While our pension fund is rated in the top 25 for those pension funds valued in excess of \$1 billion, last year's rate of return needed to exceed the assumed value, the amount needed to keep

the retirement system solid, in order for the actuary to recommend a COLA. In addition, the payroll for active employees remained flat compared to the assumed 3%. I mention this to remind us that agency contributions are based on a percentage of their payroll. With payroll remaining flat, contributions do not increase. Taking all information into consideration, the actuary has provided a preliminary Annual Required Contribution (ARC) from the contributing agencies back up from the current 6.74% to 7.07% of payroll. Unfortunately, the recommendation does not include funding for a COLA.

Putting the lack of a COLA aside, we must keep the issue of protecting the current Defined Benefit plan in the forefront. While there have been volumes of information made available, even some from the legislative research staff, indicating Defined Benefit plans, like we have now, are better for both the retirees and the employers, some discussion continues at the General Assembly on converting to a hybrid or Defined Contribution plan. With the General Assembly meeting on January 9th to elect officers, adopt rules, and organize the session, and then reconvene on January 30th to

officially start business (according to their Web site), it will be in our best interest to stay informed on any discussion regarding possible retirement system modifications. Changes to our current plan could be as damaging as moving to a different plan. We may need to remind our elected officials there are two sides to every issue. The wise seek both and, for a retirement system, carefully weighs both long term as well as short term impacts.

Lastly, I wanted to remind everyone that there are three classes of retirees. The national office maintains the membership records of the first two classes, Life Members and Retired Members who pay National and Chapter dues. For those who pay dues, you are invoiced from the National Office. The third class of membership is called the Retired Former Member, and the Chapter is maintaining your membership records. Mr. Will Wigal, retiree from the town of Garner, is taking over the awesome job of keeping up with Retired Former Members. ## ***New 24/7 Online Library Available***

Beginning July 1, all APWA members will see a significant increase in the value of their membership. On that date, APWA members will be able to participate in live Click, Listen & Learn presentations without a registration fee, access previously recorded Click, Listen & Learn programs at no charge, access content from past International Public Works Congress and Exposition sessions at no extra charge, read downloadable versions of select books from the APWA Store at no charge, view select podcasts and track Continuing Education Units and Professional Development Hour credits without an administrative recording fee.



Members will be able to access this content at any time, making scheduling and the approval process no longer necessary.

The APWA board approved a dues increase of \$15 per member (excluding retired and student members) to fund this new benefit. For example, an individual membership will be \$164 (up from \$149 a year) ago, beginning with the July 1, 2012 membership renewal cycle. However, the cost for just ONE Click, Listen & Learn program is \$175 for members and \$300 for non-members. Taking advantage of just one of the resources in the 24/7 online library more than pays for the increase in your individual membership.

The renewal cycle will remain the same. As an example, a member whose membership does not expire until January, will be able to take advantage of the new 24/7 online resource library for six months without incurring any additional cost.
