#### Instruments and materials

Crochet hook size 2.00 mm (US: B, UK: 14)

Yarn Schachenmayr Catania Originals, 100% cotton, 50g/125m (5 ply):
 First color variation: 404 (sand), 105 (milky white), 8414 (light pink), 408 (pink), 403 (yellow), 180 (blue), 226 (purple)

Second color variation: 404 (sand), 105 (milky white), 401 (peach), 403 (yellow),



**Mini Wendy** – smaller version of doll Wendy from the "AradiyaToys Friendies" collection in a lamb costume. Mini Wendy is a very easy and simple toy to crochet, she can become a real friend to children of any age. If you use the above-mentioned yarns and a 2.00 mm (US: B, UK: 14) hook, you get a 11-cm-tall (4,33-inches-tall) doll as a result. The stuffing material used in this doll is polyester wadding.

### 2. Abbreviations

**ch** chain

**sc** single crochet

**dc** double crochet

**hdc** half double crochet

**slst** slip stitch

**inc** increase

**inc-hdc** 2hdc in one stitch

(...) total number of stitches made in current round / row



# 3. Useful tips

- All amigurumi toys are crocheted with tight stitches. Avoid small holes when stretching the crochet fabric. If there are any holes through which stuffing material can be seen, use a smaller size hook.
- To avoid seams, all details are crocheted in a spiral without slip stitch and lifting loops.
- There is a chance that you will lose the beginning of the round; to avoid this, use a marker. It can be a colored pin or thread of contrasting color. Pin the marker to the last loop of the round. Every new round must be finished with a loop with the marker in it.
- Stuff details of your amigurumi as you go. It is very hard to stuff the detail evenly when it is almost finished.
- Always change the color of yarn at the last step of the last stitch of the previous color.



### 4. Head

#### With sand yarn

1 rnd 6sc in magic circle (6)

2 rnd 6inc (12)

*3 rnd* (1sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18)

**4 rnd** 1sc, inc, (2sc, inc) repeat 5 times, 1sc (24)

**5 rnd blo-[**(3sc, inc) repeat 6 times**]** (30)

6 rnd 2sc, inc, (4sc, inc) repeat 5 times, 2sc (36)

7 rnd (5sc, inc) repeat 6 times (42)

**8 rnd** 3sc, inc, (6sc, inc) repeat 5 times, 3sc (48)

Place the eyes between the 10th and 11th rounds. The distance between the eyes should be 12 stitches (Image 1). When you place the eyes, make sure that the stitch with a marker is situated on the back center. You can leave Wendy's head without eyes, and embroider them later with a thread.

9 - 11 rnds sc in each sc around (48)

### **4.1** Head

**12 rnd** (15sc, inc) repeat 3 times (51)

**13** — **15** *rnds* sc in each sc around (51)

**16 rnd** 8sc, inc, (16sc, inc) repeat 2 times, 8sc (54)

**17 — 18 rnds** sc in each sc around (54)

**19 rnd** (7sc, dec) repeat 6 times (48)

**20 rnd** 3sc, dec, (6sc, dec) repeat 5 times, 3sc (42)

21 rnd (5sc, dec) repeat 6 times (36)
Stuff detail with stuffing material, continue crocheting.

22 rnd 2sc, dec, (4sc, dec) repeat 5 times, 2sc (30)

23 rnd (3sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24)

**24 rnd** 1sc, dec, (2sc, dec) repeat 5 times, 1sc (18)

**25 rnd** (1sc, dec) repeat 6 times (12)

26 rnd 6dec (6)

Cut the yarn and guide it into each front loop of the last round using a needle inserted from the outer part of the detail (*Image 3*). Fasten off the hole and hide the end of yarn inside the head (*Image 4*).

# 5. Body

Connect sand yarn to the remaining front loop of the last stitch of the 4th round and crochet the first sc of the first round in this loop.

**To do so,** insert the hook as shown on image 5, take **sand yarn** (Image 6), pull up a loop (Image 7), make 1ch (Image 8) and crochet 1sc into the same front loop in which we inserted the hook (Image 9). **The first sc of the first round is ready.** 

1 rnd 24sc into the remaining front loops of the 4th round (24)

# **5.1** Body

Connect light pink yarn and cut

sand one (Images 11 and 12).

2 rnd blo-[(5sc, inc) repeat 4 times] (28)

**3 — 6 rnds** blo-28sc (28)

Connect sand and do not cut light

pink one.

7 rnd blo-28sc (28)

8 rnd sc in each sc around (28)

Always change the color of yarn at the last step of the last stitch of the previous color (Images 11 and 12).

# **5.2** Body

Continue crocheting with light pink yarn, and cut sand one.

9 rnd sc in each sc around (28)

**10 rnd blo-[**(5sc, dec) repeat 4 times**]** (24)

Stuff detail with stuffing material, continue crocheting.

**11 rnd** 1sc, dec, (2sc, dec) repeat 5 times, 1sc (18)

12 rnd (1sc, dec) repeat 6 times (12)

**13 rnd** 6dec (6)

Cut the yarn and fasten off the hole, as we did before on *page 7*. Try not to stuff the bottom part of the body too hard, keeping it flat (*Image 19*).

# **5.3** Body

Hold the body upside down and connect milky white yarn to the remaining front loop of the first stitch of the 9th round, as we did before on *page 8*.

Crochet:

14 rnd sc in each sc around (28)

Cut the yarn and finish the round in an *invisible* way. To make this: pull the end of yarn through the last stitch completely (Image 22), thread the end of yarn into the needle, skip one stitch and guide the yarn into the next stitch as shown on image 23. Insert the needle back in the same hole where the yarn comes from (Image 24). Fasten the obtained stitch (Images 25). This stitch is called a "closing stitch" (Image 26). Weave in the end of yarn (Image 27).




# 6. Curls on the body

To crochet the curls on the body, we will use a non standard crochet method – across the rounds (*Image 28*). The order you need to follow to crochet the stitches is shown on the scheme. The last front loop of the 6th round is marked with number 1.

Hold the body with head facing upward, find the last remaining front loop of the 6th round, and insert the hook as shown on Image 30.

# 6.1 Curls on the body

**Connect light pink yarn**, yarn over and pull up a loop.

#### Crochet:


[2ch (Image 31), 1slst in the next front loop (number 2 on the scheme (Image 32)),

3ch (*Image 33*), 1slst in the next front loop (number 3 on the scheme (*Image 34*)),

2ch, 1slst in the next front loop (number 4 on the scheme),

3ch (*Image 35*), 1slst in the next front loop (number 5 on the scheme (*Image 36*)),

# **6.2** Curls on the body

2ch, turn crocheting by 180 degrees (Image 37),

1slst in the next front loop (number 6 on the scheme (Image 38)),

3ch, 1slst in the next front loop (number 7 on the scheme),

2ch, 1slst in the next front loop (number 8 on the scheme (Image 39)),

3ch, 1slst in the next front loop (number 9 on the scheme),

2ch, 1slst in the next front loop (number 10 on the scheme (Image 40)),

3ch, turn crocheting by 180 degrees,

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1slst in the next front loop (number 11 on the scheme (Image 41))] then repeat all over again into all front loops on the body.

Weave in the end of yarn from the beginning and the end of crocheting the curls inside the body (Image 42).

### 7. Hood and hem

#### With light pink yarn

1 rnd 6sc in magic circle (6)

2 rnd **blo-[**6inc] (12)

3 rnd **blo-[**(1sc, inc) repeat 6 times] (18)

4 rnd blo-[1sc, inc, (2sc, inc) repeat 5 times, 1sc] (24)

**5 rnd blo-[**(3sc, inc) repeat 6 times**]** (30)

6 rnd blo-[2sc, inc, (4sc, inc) repeat 5 times, 2sc] (36)

7 rnd **blo-[**(5sc, inc) repeat 6 times**]** (42)

8 rnd blo-[3sc, inc, (6sc, inc) repeat 5 times, 3sc] (48)

**9 rnd blo-[**(7sc, inc) repeat 6 times**]** (54)

**10 rnd blo-[**(17sc, inc) repeat 3 times**]** (57)

**11 — 17 rnds** blo-57sc (57)

Cut the yarn and finish the round in the same invisible way as described on **page 11**.

Now we need to crochet the costume hem on the hood. This will be a round of slip stitches (slst) along the edge of the hood crocheted with milky white yarn.

**To do so**, turn the hood so that the last round is facing downward and insert the hook into the front loop of the closing stitch as shown on image 44. Connect milky white yarn, yarn over (*Image 45*) and pull up a loop (*Image 46*).

### 7.1 Hood and hem

Insert the hook into the front loop of the second stitch (*Image 47*), yarn over, pull the yarn through this front loop (*Image 48*) and through the one loop in your hook in one go (*Image 49*). **The first slst is ready**.

Crochet slip stitches (slst) until you reach the end of the round (Image 50). Crochet one more slst into the first front loop of the round in which we connected the yarn (Image 51) and finish the round in the same invisible way as described on page 11. Weave in all ends (Image 52).



### 8. Curls on the hood

To crochet the curls on the hood, turn it so that the round with a hem is facing downward. Find the first remaining front loop of the 16th round, (we used the stitches of the 17th round to crochet the hem) and insert the hook as shown on Image 54. **Connect light pink yarn**, yarn over (Image 55) and pull up a loop (Image 56).

#### Crochet:

[3ch (Image 57), slst in the next front loop (Image 58), 4ch (Image 59), slst in the next front loop] repeat into all front loops to the end of the 16th round.





### 8.1 Curls on the hood

Continue to crochet curls in spiral into all remaining front loops of the hood, until you crochet the last front loop on the top. **Crochet 4ch more** (*Image 61*) and pull the end of yarn through the last stitch completely. Weave in the end of yarn of these 4ch on the inner side of the hood, using a needle (*Images 62 and 63*). Don't forget to weave in the end of yarn sticking out from where you started crocheting the curls.





### **9.** Arm

#### With milky white yarn

1 rnd 7sc in magic circle (7)

2 rnd sc in each sc around (7)

Connect light pink yarn and cut milky

white one.

3 - 6 rnds sc in each sc around (7)

Squeeze the hole of the arm so that the stitches of the last round line each other. Crochet the opposite stitches (*Image 66*) with **3sc**.

Cut the yarn, leave a long end for sewing.

Make 2 details.

### 10. Ears

For each ear you have to crochet one milky white and one light pink detail and connect them together.

#### With milky white yarn

1 rnd 5sc in magic circle (5)

**2 rnd** 5inc (10)

3 rnd 1sc, inc, 1hdc, inc-hdc, (hdc, 1dc, 1hdc) in one stitch (top), inc-hdc, 1hdc, inc, 1sc, inc (17)

Cut the yarn and finish the round in the same invisible way as described on **page** 11.

Crochet the light pink detail of the ear following the same pattern that you followed for crocheting the milky white detail, but don't cut the yarn after the last stitch.

Put the details of the ears' against each other, wrong side against wrong side (Image 69), and insert the hook into the next stitch of the light pink detail first and then into the 4th stitch to the right from the "closing stitch" on the milky white detail (count "closing stitch" as the first (Images 70 and 71)).

### 10.1 Ears

Connect the details by crocheting the 4th round, taking the stitches on both details at the same time.

4 rnd 3sc, inc, 1hdc, inc-hdc, 1hdc, (1hdc, 1dc, 1hdc) in one stitch (top), 1hdc, inc-hdc, 1hdc, inc, 5sc (23)

Fold the ear as shown on image 74 and crochet the opposite stitches with **4 slst's** to give the ear the shape of a water drop (*Image 75*).

Cut the yarn, leaving a long end for sewing.

Make the second ear.



### 11. Flowers

#### With blue yarn

Magic circle

1 rnd (1ch, 2dc in magic circle, 1ch, 1slst in magic circle) repeat 5 times

Cut the yarn, leave a long end for sewing. Fasten off the magic circle by knotting the end of yarn from the beginning of crocheting together with the long end that you have just left for sewing (*Images 82 and 83*).

Make 3 more flowers with yellow, pink and purple yarn (*Image 84*).

# 12. Assembly

Put the hood on the head so that the closing stitch of the last round is placed on the back center of the head. The back side of the hood should be placed a little lower than the front side (*Image 85*).

Place the ears onto the sides of the hood, pointing them to the bottom so that their extreme bottom points are on the same line as the hem of the hood. Fasten them with pins (*Image 86*).

Sew them to the hood with the ends of light pink yarn (*Image 88*). Fasten, cut and weave in all ends.

## 12.1 Assembly

Place the flowers near the ear in random order close to each other as shown on the photo. Fasten them with pins (*Image 89*).

Sew the flowers with the ends of yarn that we left on the flowers before, placing the seams under the flowers to make them invisible (*Image 90*).

Fasten, cut and weave in all ends (*Image 91*). You can sew the hood to the head or leave it unsewed (*Image 92*).

# 12.2 Assembly

Place the arms symmetrically on the sides of the body and fasten them with pins (Image 93). Sew the arms to the top edge of the wool coat right to the curls with the end of light pink yarn, using the loops on the outer sides of the arms (Image 94). Wendy's arms can possibly be pointed to the sides after sewing (Image 95). To avoid this, guide light pink yarn through both arms and body back and forth as shown on images 96 - 98, pull the yarn, tie a knot and weave in the ends.

# 12.3 Assembly

To make Mini Wendy look more cute, you can embroider eyelashes near her eyes and cheek blushes under her eyes (*Image 99*).

Embroider Wendy's closed eyes with dark brown yarn. Wendy's closed eyes should be situated between the 11th and 12th round of the head (Image 100).

The distance between the eyes should be 6 stitches (*Image 101*). Each eye is 4 stitches long (*Image 102*). If you want to make sleepy eyes, lower the middle of the yarn a little bit and embroider eyelashes pointing downward. And if you want to make smiling eyes, raise the middle of the yarn a little bit and embroider eyelashes pointing upward.
