

### CULTURAL EVENTS REQUIREMENT - MUST BE COMPLETED -

<u>Cultural Events</u> are a degree requirement for all undergraduate students and are also part of the University's accreditation.

The primary goal of Cultural Events is "to help students develop their full potential[s]" as educated, well-rounded individuals.

In order to be cleared for May 2020 graduation, students must complete their Cultural Event requirement by <u>Thursday, May 7, 2020</u>. Students who fail to do so will be made ineligible to participate in the Commencement ceremony on <u>Saturday, May 9, 2020</u>.

### **PETITIONS FOR CULTURAL EVENT CREDIT**

Students can petition for Cultural Event credit for other culturally significant experiences after high-school and/or during their college careers. These include:

#### 1. Off-campus events/site visits

- Art galleries, historical tours, music festivals, etc.
- 2. <u>Travel experiences (trips in U.S. and abroad)</u>
  - Study abroad programs, mission work, vacations, etc.

#### 3. Military service

- Deployment and/or stationing in foreign countries



All Cultural Event petitions are to be reviewed by the <u>Cultural Events Committee</u> for consideration. ### **TO BE CLEARED FOR GRADUATION**

- THERE MUST BE NO PENDING ISSUES -

All coursework and other degree requirements <u>MUST</u> be completed:

- All coursework must be completed and passed
- Cumulative GPA, Major GPA, Minor GPA
- Total hours toward degree
- ✓ Hours above 299
- ✓ All Cultural Events attended

### **MISSING DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

#### All missing degree requirements must be completed by <u>**Thursday, May 7**th</u>.

Students must ensure that any needed academic petitions, course substitutions, and/or transcripts from other institutions are received by the Office of Records & Registration by this date. Failing to do so may result in a student not being cleared for graduation.

Students who are not cleared for graduation will not be able to participate in the Commencement ceremony on Saturday, May 9, 2020.

### **CLEARING FOR GRADUATION**

#### - HOW WILL I KNOW WHEN I HAVE GRADUATED? -

Graduation clearing will begin on <u>Thursday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020</u>. Once all final grades have been reported and students are successfully cleared for graduation, their graduation status will be checked off on Degree Works.

We will notify students immediately if there are any issues clearing them for graduation (e.g., incomplete coursework or unmet degree requirements).

### **LATIN HONORS**

#### **CUM LAUDE**, MAGNA CUM LAUDE, SUMMA CUM LAUDE

Latin Honors will be awarded to students who complete all of their degree requirements with a **<u>final GPA</u>** of:



### LATIN HONORS

- ALL UNDERGRADUATE COURSEWORK COUNTS TOWARDS LATIN HONORS -

In order to be eligible for Latin Honors, students who have completed coursework at another institution <u>MUST</u> have both of the following:

- 1. Required 3.5 GPA for all coursework completed at Winthrop University.
- 2. Required GPA for all coursework completed at Winthrop University PLUS that of all other coursework completed at another institution (whether those courses were transferred or not).

[Please Note: Courses taken at other institutions cannot raise a graduate to a higher level of academic honors.]

### **HONORS RECOGNITION**

Students who have completed coursework at other institutions but do not qualify for Latin Honors may still qualify for <u>Honors Recognition</u>.

Undergraduate transfer students who are ineligible for Latin Honors but complete all of their degree requirements with a final <u>Winthrop GPA of 3.75</u>

and who earn a minimum of <u>48 quality</u> <u>hours (hours earned on a regular letter</u> grade basis) at Winthrop University

> will receive Honors Recognition

### **HONORS PROGRAM DEGREE**

Students who successfully complete the <u>honors program</u>, although they will receive a special recognition of their own, will not necessarily qualify for either Latin Honors or Honors Recognition unless they meet the GPA requirements.

### **DISTINGUISHED AS HONORS RECIPIENT**

#### - COMMENCEMENT PROGRAM -

On the Commencement program, an **asterisk** (\*) will be printed next to your name if you are **ELIGIBLE** to receive Latin Honors. This information is based on your GPA/LIFE GPA from your most recent semester.

The Commencement programs are printed the month prior to graduation (before final grades are reported) and therefore are only based on the **EXPECTATION** that you will receive Latin Honors.

The day before the Commencement ceremony (on Friday), graduates who received either Latin Honors or Honors Recognition will receive an e-mail from the Office of Records & Registration.

# A ceremony in which degrees or diplomas are conferred upon graduating students.



- TIME & DATE -


The May 2020 Commencement ceremonies will take place on **Saturday, May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020.** 

There will be TWO undergraduate ceremonies:

At 10:00 a.m. on May 9<sup>th</sup>, degrees will be awarded to candidates from the: College of Visual and Performing Arts College of Arts and Sciences

At **3:00 p.m.** on May 9<sup>th</sup>, degrees will be awarded to candidates from the: *College of Business Administration Richard W. Riley College of Education* 

#### - LOCATION & PARKING -



Commencement will take place at the <u>Winthrop Coliseum</u> at 1162 Eden Terrace, Rock Hill, SC 29730.

Graduates should park in the **north parking lot**. Campus Police will help direct you to the nearest available parking space.

Degree candidates must enter the coliseum through the <u>north tunnel</u> for check-in.

#### - INVITED GUESTS -

Each degree candidate is asked to invite no more than <u>ten (10) guests</u> to Commencement.

There are no tickets. Seating is on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Doors open at 8:30 AM for the morning ceremony and 1:30 PM for the afternoon ceremony. We ask that all guests be seated no later than 20 minutes before the ceremony.

Please ask your guests not to prolong their applause or cheering during the ceremony – we want every graduate's name to be heard.

Family and friends who are unable to attend Commencement may also watch a livestream of the ceremony on the Winthrop website.

#### - SPECIAL ASSISTANCE -

If **graduates** need special assistance in order to participate in the Commencement ceremony, they will need to notify the Office of Accessibility.

If **invited guests**, including elderly, need special assistance please notify the Office of Accessibility.

#### OLD CAPS AND GOWNS MAY BE WORN:

 Students are welcome to borrow and wear old caps and gowns to the Commencement ceremony.

### **ACADEMIC REGALIA**

- WHAT TO WEAR -



Please wear **<u>comfortable business attire</u>**. Do not wear flip-flops, as this may be potentially dangerous.

All graduates must wear appropriate academic regalia during the Commencement ceremony. Please arrive dressed in your <u>cap and gown</u>, and don't forget your cap tassel – it is small and easy to lose! Caps may not be decorated. Any caps that are decorated will be taken away.

Graduates may wear only **cords and stoles** from Winthrop honor societies and student organizations.

Graduates who earn Latin Honors (e.g., Magna Cum Laude) and those who are awarded Honors Program degrees will receive cords from the Office of Records and Registration during check-in. All other cords (and stoles) are to be received from chapters advisor or department chair.

### **COMMENCEMENT DAY**

- WHAT NOT TO BRING -

Do not bring anything 'extra' with you to check-in, as no storage will be provided for your items.

Do not bring anything that you cannot put in your pocket. If you bring a purse, make sure that it has a strap so that you can wear it under your gown if necessary.

### - SOME THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND -

Commencement is a formal event of great significant to you, your family and friends, and your graduating class.

- Please do not decorate or throw your graduation caps.
- Men will be asked to remove their caps during the singing of the National Anthem.
- Both graduates and guests should refrain from unruly, threatening, or disruptive behaviors during the ceremony.

- CHECK-IN AREA & TIME -

Graduates will need to check in before the ceremony.

Check-in is located inside the **north tunnel** of the Winthrop Coliseum.

\*\*\*Graduates <u>MUST</u> come dressed in their caps and gowns.\*\*\*

### **COMMENCEMENT DAY** - CHECK-IN -

Graduates will check in at the tables for their respective colleges.



There, they will receive their reader cards, which also lists their line-up numbers. Graduates <u>MUST NOT</u> lose or alter their reader cards.

For graduates with Latin Honors and/or an Honors Program degree, a note will be made on their reader cards and they will receive a cord to wear.

### **COMMENCEMENT DAY**

#### - CARD READERS -

At check-in, you will receive a <u>reader</u> <u>card</u> that lists your name and seat number.

The name on your card will be read aloud during the ceremony.

If your name is difficult to pronounce, you can meet with the card reader prior to the ceremony at check-in.



### **COMMENCEMENT DAY**

#### - LINING UP FOR THE PROCESSION -

After check-in, graduates will line up in the east hallway based on the seat numbers listed on their <u>reader cards</u>. Joseph C. Smith

SEAT: 1 OR

There will be <u>signs in the hallway</u> to help direct you to your place in line. For example, if the seat number listed on your reader card is '10R,' look for the signs that read '9R' and '11R,' and place yourself inbetween them in '10R.'

If you get confused, don't worry – several personnel will be there to assist you with finding your place in line.

Most importantly... DO NOT LOSE OR ALTER YOUR READER CARD!

#### - THE PROCESSION -


The Commencement ceremony will begin promptly <u>on the hour</u>, so be sure to arrive early! It will start with the procession.

The procession will form two lines. Members of the procession will be in the following order:

- Platform party
- Faculty
- Degree Candidates



The procession will enter down the center aisle of the arena in two side-by-side lines, which will diverge at the stage. The graduates will be directed to their seats by the Student Marshals. Graduates should leave no empty seats between each other. Members of the procession and all guests will remain standing until after the singing of the National Anthem.



#### - CONFERRING OF UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES -

<u>Academic Deans</u> will present the degree candidates from their respective colleges to the <u>Provost</u>.

The **<u>Student Marshals</u>** will usher the graduates to the stage.





#### - THE ANNOUNCING OF GRADUATES -

As graduates approach the stage, they should <u>hold their reader cards in their</u> <u>left hands</u>. When they reach the top of the ramp leading to the stage, graduates will give their reader cards to the reader.



After their names are announced, graduates will cross the stage, receive their <u>diploma</u> <u>covers</u> from the deans of their respective colleges, and shake hands with the Chair of the Board of Trustees and the President of the University.

Once all degrees are conferred, the **<u>President</u>** will instruct the graduates to move their tassels from the right side of their caps to the left side.

#### - PHOTOGRAPHY BY LIFETOUCH -

Professional photographers from Lifetouch will be taking photos during the Commencement ceremony.

Three photos will be taken of each graduate – one on the ramp entering the stage, one shaking hands with the President of the University and the other in front of the Winthrop logo at bottom of the ramp exiting the stage.

Photos will be available for purchase online. Lifetouch will contact graduates after the ceremony with more information.





### - THE FINAL PROCESSION -

After the singing of the Alma Mater, the platform party will exit the ceremony, followed by the faculty. The faculty will line-up down the middle aisle, making a 'tunnel' for the graduates to pass through. This is a good time to say goodbye to your professors!

The graduates, as directed by the Student Marshals, will exit the ceremony to pick up their diplomas in the diploma room behind the stage.





### - DIPLOMAS -

Diplomas will be distributed based on last name. Find the sign with your first letter of your last name and go to that table to pick up your diploma.

When you receive your diploma, please ensure that your name is spelled correctly!

If you owe a balance to Winthrop University or if we have not yet received your final transcripts from another institution, you will not be able to pick up your diploma at the end of the ceremony.



# IF YOU HAVE AN ACCOUNT BALANCE - NO DIPLOMA -

If you have a balance, you will begin to receive e-mails (labeled 'YOU HAVE A BALANCE') in APRIL alerting you of the balance owed on your account.

Be sure to keep an eye on your account! Last-minute charges can be added to your account for things such as traffic tickets, printing charges, etc., so be sure to check your account frequently in April and beginning of May.

# IF YOU HAVE AN ACCOUNT BALANCE - NO DIPLOMA -

**IF YOU HAVE A REMAINING BALANCE AFTER MAY 4th...** a diploma hold will be placed on your account. Your diploma and transcripts will be held until all balances are paid in full and your payment clears the bank.

**IF YOU PAY YOUR BALANCE AFTER MAY 4th...** pay only in cleared funds (debit/credit card, cashier's check from your bank, money order, or cash).

**DO NOT PAY BY CHECK AFTER MAY 4th...** as Student Financial Services is required to hold your diploma and transcripts until the check clears our bank. This might not be until AFTER Commencement!

They are located across from the Cashier's Office in 21 Tillman Hall and are open Monday through Friday, 8:30 – 5:00 PM.

# DIPLOMAS... IF YOU DO NOT ATTEND COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

If you do not attend Commencement, your diploma can be <u>picked up</u> from the Office of Records and Registration at 126 Tillman Hall after 12:00 PM on the following Monday, May 11<sup>th</sup>.

Any diplomas that are not picked up by 5:00 PM on Friday, May 15<sup>th</sup> will be <u>mailed</u> to the graduate's permanent address.

Please be sure that your permanent address on Wingspan is up to date!
