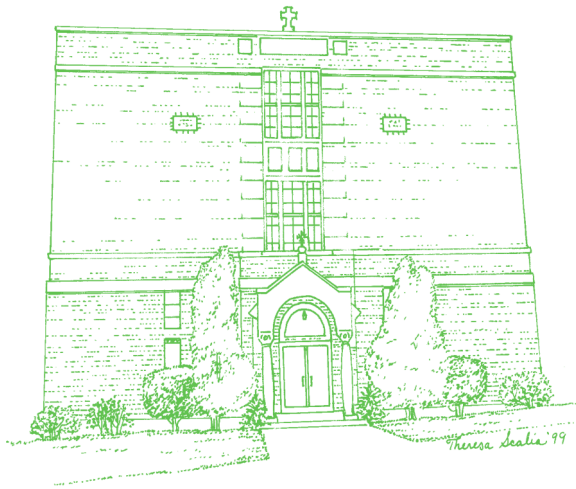

Pastor's Notes

My sisters and brothers in Christ,

Last weekend, in my homily, I shared a particularly funny lesson in humility I learned while driving in Ireland; I pray it did help people appreciate the call we have all received to cultivate the virtue of humility in our lives. I have been giving this call to humility some deeper thought over the last few days, and I realize that the Lord is still trying to humble my pride so that I can be a more effective servant of His gospel. In particular, as the Diocese has been working to implement the goals of the recently completed synod, I have come to realize that, far too often, I try to just do everything myself and not allow others to be part of the solution to problems and challenges we may be facing. Often this “lone ranger” mentality has worked out well, but as I have been asked to assume more responsibility at the Diocese, I can see that I have not served the parish as well as it deserves.

I’m not sure if parishioners have noticed, but over the last several months, both Mass attendance and ordinary offertory income have been down quite a bit. Now, there may be many factors that have led to these declines, but I can’t help but attach some of the decline to my leadership and a failure to meet the pastoral needs of parishioners. It is humbling to recognize that things are not as they should be in the parish and that there is work to be done.

Now obviously, my first reaction is to want to try to fix it all myself, but I know I can’t do it. Even with Fr. Zuccaro’s experience and abilities, the needs of the parish and the challenges we face can’t be met by two people alone. I need to be more proactive in asking for help and inviting people to become more involved in the pastoral care of the parish. This will begin with reforming and re-energizing the parish pastoral council. This consultative body is meant to be the animating corps for parish life—everything from religious education to parish picnics, anything that can strengthen our parish to be a place where Christ is proclaimed and encountered.

Anyone interested in serving should know that I anticipate 6 to 8 meetings a year to determine how we become the parish we are called to be. I will also be looking to tap a few people on the shoulders to serve the parish in this way.

If you have specific concerns, please let me know. If there’s something you think we should be doing, I’m all ears to consider your suggestions. Let’s strive together to build up the Body of Christ at Christ the King-St. Anthony Parish.

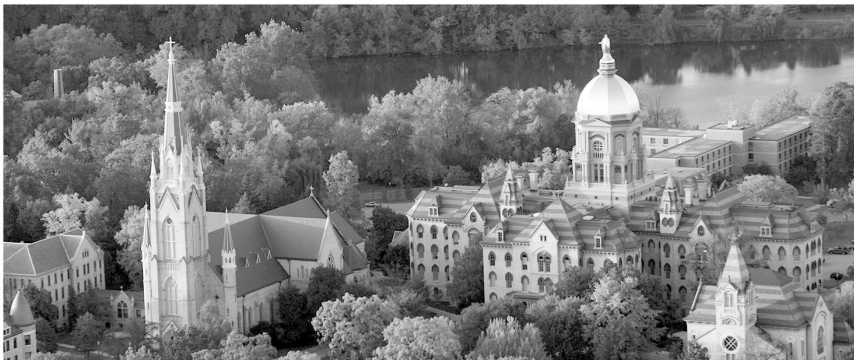
