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INTRODUCTION

The 1984 Association of Research Libraries' <u>Annual Salary Survey</u> resembles earlier editions with regard to general format and organization. Salaries of staff in the Canadian member libraries have been expressed in U.S. dollars, with conversion at the rate of \$1.2548 Canadian per U.S. dollar*. However, some statistics were reported which permit the inclusion of Chicago in tables 4 through 9.

A major change was implemented in the compilation of this year's <u>Survey</u>. Except for Tables 1 and 10, salaries of staff in medical and law libraries included in the <u>Survey</u> have been excluded from the general University library tables and two new series of tables have been developed for these types of libraries. The new tables are modeled after the general non-University tables, with minor modifications. The new tables vary from the general tables only when imitation would have created categories for which no data could have been published. (The <u>Survey</u> does not publish any salary data for groups which include fewer than four individuals in order to maintain confidentiality of salary information.)

The reasons for changing the scope of published tables is threefold. First, not all ARL member libraries' parent institutions include law and medical programs, and therefore could not report any medical or law librarian salaries. Second, not all ARL member libraries with law or medical programs were able to report the salaries of law and medical libraries affiliated with the parent institution. In some cases these libraries were not situated on the main campus; more frequently the administrative reporting channels for either or both specialized libraries were not through the chief administrative officer of the general library system. Last, some ARL members were able to report either law or medical librarian salaries even though one or both libraries are not part of the Director's administrative responsibility. As a result of the confusion surrounding the status of both reporting and non-reporting libraries in these two professional programs, comparison of one member library with another was more difficult than necessary because the published data were difficult to interpret. The general University tables now deal with main library systems, and it is hoped the new reporting scope will both simplify and enhance the utility of the published information. Analysis or comparison of salary data for law and medical librarians can be more effectively carried out by referring to the data in Tables 22 through 27.

Two additional tables have also been added to the general section which deal with main library systems. These are Table 15 and Table 16 which show the average years of experience for incumbents whose average salaries are shown in Table 13 and Table 14, respectively. The purpose of the new tables is to provide a contextual framework for the comparison of salaries for women versus men, or all librarians versus minority librarians.

This <u>Survey</u> includes data from ARL's newest University member, the University of Waterloo. This brings to twelve the number of Canadian University members in the Association. The combined staff in these twelve libraries (including law and medical)

This <u>Survey</u> includes data from ARL's newest University member, the University of Waterloo. This brings to twelve the number of Canadian university members in the Association. The combined staff in these twelve libraries (including law and medical) represent 9.8% of the total professionals reported in this year's <u>Survey</u>. The total university membership reported an increase of 71 filled positions compared to last year's level, in addition to the positions reported at Waterloo and McMaster Medical (not previously reported).

Fewer minority professional positions were reported this year: 641 this year versus 645 last year. Of this year's total, 35 were reported in medical libraries and 34 in law libraries. The identification of minority professionals is limited to U.S. university members because Canadian institutions are not permitted to collect that information. Thus the 641 professionals (including those in law and medical libraries) identified as being members of federally defined minority groups represent 9.9% of all positions reported from the U.S. university segment of the membership of the Association. Within the minority categories, men represent 34% of the total, slightly more than the fraction of men in the U.S. university membership (32.4%). Minority librarians in ARL libraries are not proportionately distributed in geographical terms; the South Atlantic and Pacific regions both have disproportionate shares of the total number. The distribution of minority professionals reported by the membership is as follows:

Once again the salary ranges in Tables 1, 11, and 12 have been adjusted upward to accommodate the higher salaries reported in the <u>Survey</u>. The previous intervals have been maintained and a new upper category established for salaries of \$100,000 or more. This year there are two salaries in that category.

Salaries paid to librarians in private ARL U.S. libraries average 2.6% higher than those paid their counterparts in publicly supported institutions. In 17 of the 27 job categories listed in Table 19, the average for staff in private U.S. institutions is greater than the average for librarians in the public sector. In the three top administrative categories (Director, Associate Director, and Assistant Director) the differential between type of library is 4.5%. Higher average salaries are also paid in larger libraries. The differential between the three groups of smaller libraries is rather modest, but between the largest and the second largest, the differential is 16%. Table 20 provides a detailed breakdown. The geographical influence on salaries continues to be apparent. In the U.S., the highest average salaries are paid in the Pacific and Middle Atlantic regions, and the lowest average salaries paid in the East and West South Central regions.

The median salary for all professional staff in university library members of ARL (including law and medical) increased 4.65% during the past year. The median Beginning Professional Salary also increased by 4.5%. Both of these measures grew faster than the increase in the Consumer Price Index, so for the third year in a row, ARL librarians regained another small portion of purchasing power lost in the preceding decade.

A final cautionary note repeated from past years: Users of the <u>Survey</u> are advised against making staffing or salary inferences from the data presented here without a careful analysis of the libraries being compared and the information that is available. A highly standardized method of data collection has been employed which may imply organizational patterns that are not valid in specific instances. Please refer to the survey instrument at the back for further information about definitions, assumptions, etc. Finally, this <u>Survey</u> only concerns itself with salaries, and other tangible and intangible forms of compensation may have a significant impact on specific salaries.

General Instructions for Completing the Questionnaire

- 1. This survey is concerned with professional positions only. Since the criteria for determining professional status vary among libraries, there is no attempt to define the term "professional." Each library should report the salaries of those staff members it considers professionals, irrespective of faculty status or membership in a collective bargaining unit, including, when appropriate, staff who are not librarians in the strict sense of the term, such as computer experts, systems analysts, budget officers, etc.

- 9. Total years of professional experience. Define "professional experience" as indicated in the general instructions; for most professional staff members this will mean counting the years since the MLS degree was awarded. When counting, do not subtract interim periods when an individual was not engaged in professional library employment if these periods are short in relation to the overall professional career. Count an academic year contract period as a full year. Be sure to include professional experience in previous positions and in other institutions.
- 10. Rank. Responses concerning rank should be limited to professional librarians and other professionals reported in the survey who occupy the same ranks as librarians. Leave the rank column blank for professionals who do not occupy these ranks or if the column is not applicable.
