Remember, this is not about partisan politics. It's about fighting back against the threat posed to public education, our healthcare, and our students and their families. Together, we will send a message to Washington that we will stand strong with our students, our schools, and our communities.

Ideas for Your Day of Action

Many AFT locals have been eager to take part in past AROS days of action. In fact, the number of local unions taking part in AROS has increased with every action. The first stumbling block most local leaders encounter is figuring what to ask our members to do, especially now that most have escalated beyond morning "walk ins."

The national AFT debriefed local leaders and organizers after the January 19th day of action in order to develop a list of ideas to share with other locals around the country. We hope there is something on this list you can use to advance the national agenda of AROS as well as your local union's agenda for your community. The Basics - Standard Tactics

Morning School Walk-Ins – For local unions taking part in their first day of action, the morning "walk-in" is a great tactic to get their feet wet. Members, students, parents, and community members rally at a predetermined site on or near their neighborhood school grounds 15-30 minutes BEFORE school starts. Speakers are scheduled, rally signs are distributed, and chants/songs ring out until school starts. Then, as the name suggests, our members and students walk in together demonstrating their unity and solidarity. *Pro Tip: Take lots of pictures and make sure several members are taking on the responsibility of getting them up on social media using our hashtags.*

Afternoon Rallies – Some local unions have moved past, or combined, morning "walk-ins" with afternoon rallies. We suggest selecting one site, or more depending on the size of your local union and community, to hold a rally. This site can be a school or another centrally located public space. Local unions have had success with turnout, as long as it is deliberate and well planned. Work with local AFL-CIO Central Labor Councils, community coalition partners, parents, and students to recruit speakers that support the AROS national agenda and your local union's local community agenda. Concentrating your member turnout to one, or a handful of locations, provides local media outlets a prime opportunity to cover your union's activism. *Pro Tip: Assign a chant leader to keep the energy up before, between, and after speakers. Distribute chant sheets at the event.*

Marches – Some AFT local unions have partnered with community coalition groups and other local unions to stage marches that have one or more starting points and converge at a common rally spot. This is an escalated tactic that requires advanced planning, including recruiting and training marshals to keep things as orderly as possible. Again, this tactic will provide local media outlets a prime opportunity to cover your union's activism. It's also disruptive to "business as usual" and alerts the community to the need for change. *Pro Tip: Work with a music teacher to prepare a student marching band to lead your march.*

Arms Around The School/Hospital/Worksite – Our members are on the front lines when it comes to protecting those we serve. The immigration reform crisis has reached a fever pitch, as indicated by increased immigration and customs enforcement (ICE) raids and the president's executive orders. Members, students, parents, patients, and community members have linked arms around their respective site to symbolize that we will protect our institutions and those we serve. *Pro Tip: Utilize cloth, rope, or banners to lengthen the human chain when there are not enough members to encircle a building while holding hands.*

Social Media Pic and Quotes – Sometimes our members can't make it to a central location for a rally, march, or even a walk-in. You should still have something for them to do to advance our national mission and local mission. Have them take a selfie or group photo and post to social media with our hashtags on the AROS Day of Action. *Pro Tip: Assign a social media point person for your local union. Have them identify one person at each site to corral members for pictures. Additionally, distribute sample quotes/tweets for your members to adapt.*

The Let's Get Creative - Advanced (or off the beaten path) Tactics

Bake Sale – Stage a bake sale in a highly visible place. What you raise money for is entirely up to your local. Invite students, parents, patients, and community groups to take part.

Street Theater – Work with a theater teacher or a likeminded community theater company to write and act out a scene in a public space that demonstrates a fight we are waging.

Protest by Land, Sea, and Air – Airplane banner flyovers, boats, etc. Getting your message out in creative ways, especially if combined with a march or rally, has a big impact.

Government Event Takeover – Plant members and/or community activists to ask tough questions and take over the event.

Flash Mob – You've seen them. Consider using props, outfits, and signs to help amplify your message and increase visibility.

Light Saber Star Wars Event – Similar to a flash mob, but with a Star Wars twist.

Sit Ins/Passive Resistance – Determine a site that fits in with your national, state, or local agenda. For example, a sit-in at an Immigration and Customs Enforcement branch office will send a message that we will fight to protect our students. Strategic arrests, consider recruiting retirees, will get covered by local media and amplify our message.

AROS/Member Engagement Rap

Introduction: Hi, I'm [name]. I want to speak with you about joining me in taking a stand against the pro-privatization agenda, making our schools safe spaces, and fighting for more accessible healthcare. Our union, joining with millions of likeminded Americans, is taking a stand on May 1st to let Washington know that these are our public schools. These are our students. These are our neighbors.

Anger: How did you feel after an overwhelming number of calls demanding the rejection of Betsy DeVos (Secretary of Education), and her pro-voucher agenda, flooded Senate offices, but were largely ignored? Have you seen the president's aggressive anti-immigrant executive orders affect your students or community directly or indirectly through fear? What about the efforts to strip healthcare access from millions of Americans? I get angry when I think about our leaders pursuing an agenda that is so drastically different from the ideals for which we stand.

Hope: I think you'll agree that we're at a crossroads in public education and our community. Do we want to create and maintain safe spaces in which ALL students are welcome? Do we want to stop a predatory voucher system that would undercut all we've worked for? Do we want to roll back progress on healthcare, making it less accessible to our community? I know I get upset when thinking about it, but I know we can still make positive changes. We can work with our school district and other elected officials to make our schools sanctuary schools. We have a plan to fight back and reclaim our schools and protect our neighbors.

Urgency: The time to act is now. Violence in schools towards marginalized students is becoming more common by the day. The Trump administration is pushing an anti-immigrant agenda aggressively. The last attempt to dismantle the Affordable Care Act failed, but another threat will emerge any day now. We are feeling the impacts everyday.

You make the difference: On May 1st, we're committing to a day of action that will unite happening all across the country. Will you sign this commitment card saying that you'll be there on the 1st? We're [insert action here].

Best Practices for Social Media Leads

May 1st is shaping up to be a huge day and one of the key elements of making the day a success will be our social media presence.

On the day of the events, our goal is to have each action share photos and videos via Twitter and Facebook. The Twitter actions will help make the hashtag trend, which will give us exposure to national audiences.

We will be sending sample tweets and FB posts after AROS finalizes the toolkit. So stay tuned.

There are several things that you need and that we need to make this a success. Please read this below and get us each of these items.

For Twitter:

- Identify at least one person who will be tweeting from the event. If you can identify more, this is great.
- Please give us the email address of the social media lead so that we can contact them with a toolkit and anything else that comes out. If you are not the social lead and would like to receive the toolkit and other social media communications, we can be sure to include you.
- Please identify the handles/twitter accounts that will be used to live tweet the event.
 This doesn't have to be every account that's tweeting, just send us the names of the
 accounts you know will be participating. We will need this to help retweet and lift up
 your work.
- On tweets leading up to and on the day of action, please include the hashtag #ReclaimOurSchools. In order for this to trend, we need to use is consistently in large numbers.

For Facebook:

Facebook has many new tools that you'll be able to use.

- Facebook live will allow you to live stream your rally or event. While you are live streaming from your smartphone, you will not be able to tweet. This means if you want to live streams, you need a second person that is willing to live stream it. Or you can live stream a portion of it and tweet as well.
 - o The live stream will generate many views on Facebook and will give us a link to be able to share it on other social platforms and emails.
 - o It's best if you live stream from a Facebook Fan page for your union or community group. To do this, the person who is live streaming will have to be an admin on the Facebook page. If your union does not have a FB fan page, then you can also do this from your own account or the social media leads account.
 - o If you have any questions about best practices for FB Live, feel free to reach out.
- FB Events are a great way to invite people on Facebook. If you have an event you can share it with people and it gives you a link you can email or tweet.
 - o If you create a FB event, please be sure to email us the link so that we can track and share it with others.

o FB Events will be best if they're sponsored by or connected to the FB Fan Page of your union or community group. The creator should be an admin of the page.

For Instagram:

If you use Instagram, please be sure to use #ReclaimOurSchools so that we can see the social media actions on the platform.

Instagram is owned by FB, and will allow you to share directly to your FB page from the app.

Other Social Tools:

There are various other social media tools including Snapchat, Tumblr, Pintrest and more. No one is discouraged from using any of these tools. We do not have the capacity to track the use. If you do something creative with anything else, feel free to share it with us and we'll try to lift it up.

Setting up an event on Facebook and Action Network

Setting up an event on Facebook or Action Network is necessary if you, or AFT, is going to run social media ads for your event. This is because we need one of these two pages to be able to drive people to them. If you are unable to create one of these pages, you will not be able to email eactivists or run ads around your event.

Here are instructions on creating each page:

Creating a Facebook Event (instructions for on the desktop):

You will need to be the admin is the local union page to be able to do this.

- 1. Go to www.facebook.com.
- 2. On the left hand navigation, click on events
- 3. In the top center right, there will be a blue button/drop down that says create event. Click on it.
- 4. Select "Public Event"
- 5. Select the local union or community group as the event host. You must already be an administrator of the page in order to make them a host.
- 6. You should have prepared the following
 - a. Event photo (Can by a flier, local logo or photo of members)
 - b. Event name
 - c. Location
 - d. Start time
 - e. End time (if you don't have an end time, list it for an hour)
 - f. Category: Make the category whatever best fits your event or select Other category
 - g. Description of the event
- 7. They will offer keywords. Feel free to choose any or leave the filed blank.
- 8. Select Free Admission and Family Friendly
- 9. Leave the tickets field blank
- 10. Select create

Once you have created the event, please email the link to Asher Huey at ahuey@aft.org

You can also crate events on mobile, which will look slightly different based on device. All of the information you will need to provide will be the same.

Creating an Action Network Event Page:

You can create an action network event page, but you should be sure to create it from the account that manages the tool for the local union.

Follow these steps

- 1. Log into Action Network
- 2. Select manage next to the group you want to create the event in. This should be the local union or community group.
- 3. Once you are on the page that says "Currently Managing: Name of Group (IE AFT or Cincinnati Federation of Teachers)" scroll down to the red button on the right hand side that says Event. Select Event.
- 4. You should have prepared the following info:
 - a. Title of event
 - b. Start date and time (also end time if applicable)
 - c. Location Name (ie. University High School)
 - d. Address
 - e. City
 - f. State
 - g. Zip code
 - h. Host contact info (optional)
 - i. Banner image (rally photos or smiling kids or something)
 - j. Event description
- 5. Don't touch the Sponsored By at the bottom, unless it says something other than the group you want sponsoring the event.
