COURSE DESCRIPTION: American Sign Language is a unique, visual language with its own grammar, structure and rules. This course expands on the foundations of American Sign Language 2 Students will continue to increase their understanding of the important functions of ASL grammar and the distinct aspects of Deaf culture. Students expand their ASL vocabulary, idioms, fingerspelling, phrases, sentences, storytelling and non-manual signals.

OBJECTIVES: As a result of this course, you will be able to:

- Identify the important features of the Deaf community: Past and Present
- Engage in basic conversations on a variety of topics using ASL grammar and structure
- Explain the importance of incorporating facial expressions and non-manual signals
- Collaborate effectively with peers to develop expressive and receptive ASL skills
- Produce basic ASL sentence structures using fingerspelling, simple phrases, expressions and non-manual signals to communicate
- Develop cultural awareness of Deaf Culture, Deaf History and Deaf Education
- Targeted vocabulary instruction and practice covering various topics including:
 - MASTER ASL Unit 10: Making Plans
 - SIGNING NATURALLY:
 - Unit 14: Complaining, Making suggestions and requests
 - Unit 15: Exchanging Personal Information: Life Events
 - Unit 16: Describing and Identifying Things
 - Unit 17: Talking About the Weekend




Inside the folders are directions for the week. Each week, students will have a link to a hyperdoc, along with other assignments they need to complete. They will submit all work through Schoology.
