- Confirm veterans are maximizing the housing assistance available to them!

Don't Forget Active Military Duty

HUD Handbook 4350.3 Guidance:

- Temporarily absent family members are still considered family members.
- Consider a family member on active military duty to be temporarily absent.





Income Eligibility Details

From HUD Handbook 4350.3 Chapter 5 Exhibit 5-1

- INCOME INCLUSION: (4) The full amount of periodic amounts received... including a lump-sum amount or prospective monthly amounts for the delayed start of a periodic amount (e.g., Veterans Disability,... payments to the widow of a serviceman killed in action).
- INCOME EXCLUSION: The special pay to a family member serving in the Armed Forces who is exposed to hostile fire (e.g., in the past, special pay included Operation Desert Storm).



What documentation proves Veteran's Status?

The DD 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty




Accessibility Modification

 Rehabilitation assistance may include accessibility modification for wounded veterans



 Some might be Special Needs applicants for compliance with 20% set-aside

- 22 veterans assisted in 18 months
- Leveraged funds: \$234,000
- > SHIP: \$83,000 in additional repairs






Veterans Homeownership & Preservation Program: Pilot SHIP Strategy

- Purchase Assistance for Home buyers
- Home Preservation for home owners.
- Partners provide leveraging
 - Federal Home Loan Bank lenders
 - VA provides ramps



City of Tampa Operation Reveille



- 11 Homes rehabilitated with SHIP
- 53 formerly homeless veterans received rental housing
- Another 26 homeless vets were quickly housed when new vacancies opened up



Operation Reveille Leveraging

- Subsidized rental housing
- Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF)
- Willing landlords and private donors
 - Ashley Furniture decorated many homes
- Public and nonprofit agencies

Ending Homelessness among Veterans: A HUD Policy Priority

- Number of homeless veterans has dropped
- On any given day in 2015, there were about 4,000 homeless
 Veterans in Florida
- Of those, about 40% were living outdoors





Helping Homeless and At-Risk Veterans with SHIP

- Tenant-Based
 - Rent and utility deposits for rapidly rehousing homeless Veterans into rentals
 - Short-term rent assistance for rapid rehousing
 - Past due rent for eviction prevention
- Project-Based
 - Permanent supportive housing apartments
 - Transitional housing developments

- SSVF (Supportive Services for Veteran Families) programs
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Collaboration with SSVF and VASH

- SSVF provides eviction/homelessness prevention, time-limited rent assistance, deposits, other financial assistance, and support services
- VA provides long-term Housing Choice Vouchers and services for some Veterans in the VASH (VA Supportive Housing) program
- SHIP can be used to complement SSVF/VA by serving Veterans who are not eligible for SSVF and VASH, or add leveraging resources



Utility and Rental Security Deposit

- Start Up Funds
 - First and Last Months Rent
 - Security Deposits
 - Utility Deposits
 - But first check to see if the applicant can be served by SSVF

Eviction/Homelessness Prevention

- SHIP may pay for up to 6 months of rent in arrears
 - But first check to see if the applicant can be served by SSVF

Newest Type of SHIP Assistance: Rental Subsidies

FY 15-16 SHIP funds may provide:

Rent subsidies for very-low-income households with at least one adult who is a person with special needs as defined in s.420.0004 or a person who is homeless as defined in s. 420.621 when the person initially qualified for a rent subsidy.

The period of rental subsidy may not exceed 12 months for any eligible household or person.

This subsection expires July 1, 2016.

Barrier Removal for Rental Units

- Single unit or property-wide improvements
- Subject to 15 year affordability period and annual monitoring



Permanent Supportive Housing for Veterans

- Best permanent housing option for those who are "chronically homeless" and "high acuity"
- Typically has long-term financial supports for rent and/or limits rent payments to 30% of income
- Support services are available
- Very effective and efficient
 - 90% permanent housing stability
 - Reduces community costs by about \$30,000 per person annually
