

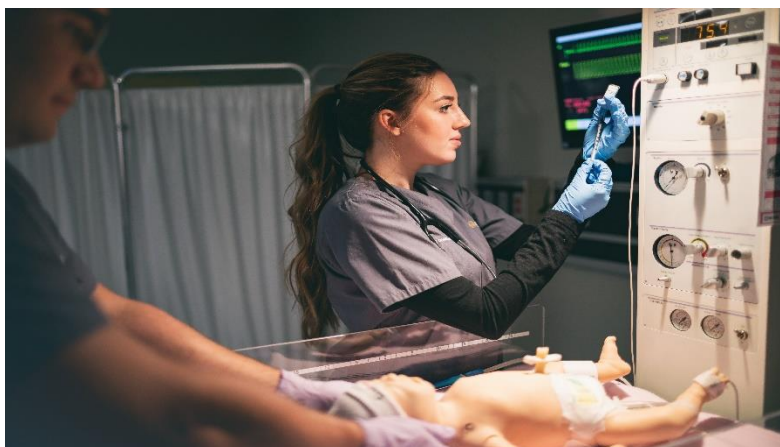

I. Program Overview

The ADN curriculum provides knowledge, skills, and strategies to integrate safety and quality into nursing care, to practice in a dynamic environment, and to meet individual needs which impact health, quality of life, and achievement of potential. The curriculum is conceptually based and founded on Knowles' principles of adult and collaborative learning. Basic assumptions include self-direction, utilizing adult experience, problem-solving and activity-centered learning.

Course work includes and builds upon the domains of healthcare, nursing practice, and the holistic individual. Content emphasizes the nurse as a member of the interdisciplinary team providing safe, individualized care while employing evidence-based practice, quality improvement, and informatics.

Graduates of this program are eligible to apply to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN). Employment opportunities are vast within the global health care system and may include positions within acute, chronic, extended, industrial, and community health care facilities.

The Associate Degree Nursing Program has a competitive admissions process. Only students meeting the cut scores for the ATI TEAS Reading, Math, and Total Academic Composite, including "Advanced," will be considered for admission. Within each admission period, applicants are ranked according to: 1. ATI TEAS scores; 2. Related course grades; and 3. Earned degrees. Each semester, the top applicants are selected based on the highest scores for that admission period.

Accepted students who decline their seat and wish to re-apply must complete a new Nursing application.

II. Steps to Complete Before Applying for the ADN Program

Information Session

Attend an Associate Degree Nursing Information Session at CPCC. The nursing program hosts information sessions for students interested in a detailed description of the program and the admission process. CPCC College Admission

1. Complete the CPCC College Admission Application. Please note applying to the general college and completing all enrollment steps **must** be completed before applying to the Associate Degree Nursing program. These steps consist of establishing NC residency and requesting official transcripts from high school (unless you have earned an Associate degree or higher), all colleges attended for credit, and Advanced Placement (AP) exam scores if requesting college credit at CPCC through AP exam testing.

Important Note: If your high school or college transcripts are not from the United States, you will need an International Transcript Evaluation reviewed by an agent outside of Central Piedmont Community College.

A list of International Evaluators is available through the [National Association of Credential Evaluating Services \(NACES\)](#) website. There is a fee for this service.

Required Testing

1. Take [required Math and English Placement testing](#) at a CPCC Testing Center. Students with college credit for English and Algebra may be exempt from the English and Math Placement tests as determined by the CPCC Transcript Evaluator. All students must meet with an academic advisor to review placement test scores.
2. All applicants must take the [ATI TEAS \(Test of Essential Academic Skills\)](#) available at the CPCC Testing Center or any approved ATI testing site.

A study guide is available at www.atitesting.com.

The [TEAS permission slip](#) must be completed and brought to the Cashier's office on the day scheduled to take the test.

An ATI Academic Preparedness Level of "Advanced" or a minimum TEAS score as follows is required to be eligible for admission:

Get a Headstart!

Any required general education (non-NUR) courses for the Associate Degree Nursing Program can be taken prior to submitting the Nursing Program Application. See the Program of Study on the [Associate Degree Nursing program website](#) for the list of all required courses. Completion of designated courses will also increase your application score as well as benefit you upon entering the program. As the Associate Degree Nursing program is a rigorous academic program, completing required general education (non-NUR) courses before program admission provides students with more time for Nursing course study.

III. Associate Degree Nursing Program Admission Requirements

Required documentation (one option is required):

- Nurse Aide: **(must be completed and listed on the NC Nurse Aide I Registry by application deadline)**
 - Completion of a North Carolina [state approved nurse aide I training program](#). **Submit a copy of Certificate of Completion or transcript.**
 - Current listing without findings as a Nurse Aide I with the NC Division of Health Service Regulation (available at www.ncnar.org). Submit a copy of the NA I Active Listing.
- LPN:
 - Proof of an active unrestricted LPN license without findings. Submit a copy of NC LPN active license.

Points are earned from the following areas:

1. ATI TEAS Test Scores
2. Completed college general education (non-NUR) course grades
3. High school AP and IB courses and unweighted GPAs, and college GPAs and degrees earned

Record points on the application form on page 4. The application must be fully completed (typed, not hand-written) and submitted along with the other supporting documents.

IV. Acceptance into the Program

Applications are processed and evaluated by the Nursing Admission committee. Please allow up to five weeks after the application deadline to receive notice of admission. Admission status notices are sent to your CPCC student email account.

Students accepted into the Associate Degree Nursing Program are required to:

- *Submit results of a North Carolina and national criminal background check at their own expense.*
- Complete a medical exam, drug screen, provide record of immunizations, purchase CPCC Nursing uniforms, and carry CPCC's accident insurance.
- Students must be 18 years old to complete clinical education requirements.

The necessary forms are available at the [Associate Degree Nursing Program Admitted Students website](#) and will be discussed at the mandatory Nursing Program Orientation session for students who are accepted into the program.

- After acceptance and enrollment in the program, students are required to take [all courses as scheduled and sequenced in the Associate Degree Nursing program of study](#). This is a lockstep sequence program.
- In addition to textbook costs, students will incur the costs of a required online assessment, review, and remediation program (approx. \$175 dollars per semester.)

Check Your Application for Completion

1. Type all information on the Program Application Form (page 4) and print.
2. Read, and, if you are able to perform these essential functions with or without accommodations, click the box on the Program Application Form (page 4) for the CPCC Associate Degree Nursing Essential Functions Document.
3. **Submit** the following documents with the application:
 - a. Copy of official TEAS score (Individual Performance Profile, page 1)
 - b. Nurse Aide or LPN documentation
 - Transcript or Certificate of Completion of a state approved nurse aide I training course and
 - Copy of verification of current listing without findings as nurse aide with the NC Division of Health Service Regulation, www.ncnar.org.
 - or
 - Proof of an active unrestricted LPN license
