

The Crisis in Black Education

Conference

The ASALH Annual Conference is an occasion to explore the history and culture of people of African descent. Our conference brings together more than one thousand people, including educators, students, community builders, business professionals, and others who share an abiding interest in learning about the contribution of African Americans to this nation and the world.

For over a century, our conference has featured a rich program, which now includes scholarly sessions, professional workshops, plenaries, Teachers' Workshop, a Film Festival and other presentations that analyze and illuminate a critical theme in the Black experience. Our 2017 conference will offer attendees from across America and beyond more than 200 sessions, featuring ASALH members who are prominent figures in Black cultural studies, as well as students from many disciplines.

ABOUT THE THEME

The Crisis in Black Education

The theme for 2017 focuses on the crucial role of education in the history of African Americans. ASALH's founder Carter G. Woodson once wrote that "if you teach the Negro that he has accomplished as much good as any other race he will aspire to equality and justice without regard to race." Woodson understood well the implications associated with the denial of access to knowledge, and he called attention to the crisis that resulted from persistently imposed racial barriers to equal education.

The crisis in black education first began in the days of slavery when it was unlawful for slaves to learn to read and write. In pre-Civil War northern cities, free blacks were forced as children to walk long distances past white schools to the one school relegated solely to them.

Whether by laws, policies, or practices, racially separate schools remained the norm in America from the late nineteenth century well into our own time.

Throughout the last quarter of the twentieth century and continuing today, the crisis in black education has grown significantly in urban neighborhoods where public schools lack resources, endure overcrowding, exhibit a racial achievement gap, and confront policies that fail to deliver substantive opportunities. The touted benefits of education remain elusive to many blacks of all ages. Addressing the crisis in black education should be considered one of the most important goals in America's present and future.

ASALH is the world's oldest learned society devoted to the research, education, culture and history of people of African descent. Dr. Woodson is the recognized "Father" of Black history. From its inception, ASALH has remained the paramount organization dedicated to promoting scholarship involving the life and history of African Americans.

Ripley, Ohio	 Tour John Parker's Home John Parker was self-educated and purchased his way out of slavery. He got in a row boat 3-4 times a month, bringing people to freedom. He was 6th wealthiest man in Ripley and still has three patents associated with his name. Tour the John Rankin House
Augusta, Kentucky	• Visit the Old Augusta Jail Learn about John Gregg Fee who gave up his inheritance and worked to get people out of slavery. He also started Berea College Learn about Juliet Miles who escaped slavery but went back for her children. She was captured and sent to the penitentiary where she died.
